million dollar hotel in Coral Gables in record-breaking time of 10 months. How?

He used psychology. He pitted man against man.

"I decided to send up to Minneapolis and bring down a gang of Swedish carpenters and then I sent to New York to get some Italian laborers. I put them on one side," he said, telling how he built the Miami Biltmore Hotel in 1925.

"On the other wing, I had Southern men from Georgia and points South.

"They were put in competi-tion. So that's why the building was completed in record

"If the Southerners were lagging, I went over and said 'Hey! Are you going to let those damn Yankees beat you? I didn't have to say anything to the Yankees, they were pretty well keyed up on the

The Italians and Swedes numbered about 150 men. So did the Southerners. They finished their wings under fierce competition and then worked

perintendent for Thompson-Starratt builders. Today he's at his Coral Gables Federal Savings and Loan Association. He's been a senior vice president there since retiring from the building business in 1955.

"The Ku Klux Klan came to me," he recalled "and said, 'You'd better get rid of those

Italians. We don't want them here.

"I told them I didn't th they (the Italians) were doing any harm. So I advised them (the Klan) to leave them alone. And they did."

And so a hotel, now the Veteran's Hospital, was built in record time.

Goodbody was low bidder on the issue with an interest rate average of 3.87283 percent.


"It is the best and most vantagous to the city," Finance Director Kenneth Allyn said of the firm's bid.

Easy Solution Amid A Bigger Problem

Those are justified howls from area travel agents over the setting up of competition for them in the heart of the University of Miami campus. An airline ticket office is being established, threatening much of their student business.

But the evildoers here, it seems to The Times, are not the University but the airlines themselves. It is to them that the agents should look. For it is the airlines, not the University, who are committing the act against their own customers, i.e., the agents.

The problem is one in the larger context of how much, if any, business should be operated for students on the University campus. Until now the UM has wisely stayed out of this field. We believe intelligent talk from City officials here to the right parties on campus will maintain that tradition.

Meanwhile, the travel agents should direct their umbrage to the culprits, not the handmaidens.

What This Town Needs: Good 25-Cent Hot Dog

Hot dog lovers everywhere-and we want our names prominent on the list-will agree with former Mayor Jack Montgomery's opinion that 35 cents is too much to pay for a hot dog (see story on page 1).

Most of us duffers labor under enough handicap on the golf course without being penalized on the 19th hole. Twenty-five cents is sufficient.

With Eye of Disdain On Teacher, We Shall Reap What We Have Sown

The nation continues to be troubled about teachers and teaching, about schools and schooling, about educators and education.

Yet the root of one difficulty is seldom mentioned, and that is the low status assigned in many communities to teach-

In brief, teachers are not re-

spected enough, valued enough and paid enough. One result is that men ha ...

well nigh disappeared from the teaching profession except in the higher and more executive positions.

Teachers are nearly all women, and no matter how efficient, how hard-working, they are, they cannot take the place of men, or exert the same authority over young males.

The low social status given to teachers did not always prevail. In older days and less urban communities, the teacher, though nearly always illpaid, was a respected and even honored figure. Parents valued his presence in the community and expected their children to obey him.

In Russia, if we may believe travelers, the status of teaer rises even higher than than, The teacher occupies a key, indeed a central, position. His work is regarded as of the highest social importance and his pay and social position correspond.

His influence on the upcoming generation is noted and rewarded.

The system of mass schooling and factory-like educat' n that we have adopted isl encouraging to the individual teacher. He gets lost in the crowd, and if parochial politics and petty intrigue are felt in his school, he goes through the motions of teaching but is careful not to attract too much attention.

This way of doing can be, and often is, crushing in its results. If we persist in it, what eventual effect can expect?







Mailman's Christmas: He Barks At Wife But Brings Joy to Door

By RAYMOND LANG

What does Christmas mean to your Coral Gables mailman? It means hard work.

He's one of about 65 carriers. He'll work 84 hours a week, without a day off, for about two weeks. Our carriers will deliver some 80,000 pieces of mail each day.

"It means that you get up at 3:30 in the morning, eat, dress and shave and get here by 4:30 a.m. And then you work 12 hours a day, seven days a week.

"And when you get home, you're worn out and frazzled," said Kenneth Knable, superintendent of the Coral Gables Branch of the Post Office.

"You eat your supper and go to bed. Then your alarm clock rings and it's another day. And it's no real pleasure at all.'

Knable said it's the mail-man's job to work about 84 hours during Christmas season. He usually works' five days a week, but he'll now have to work seven to deliver all the cards and packages Gableites will mail.

By working seven days a week, less substitute 'carriers' (12) will be hired This means the more experienced regular carrier can do the job better and faster.

A Gables mailman is paid anywhere from \$4,345 to \$5,-305 a year. He gets time-anda-half for overtime.

"It's rough on the family," said Knable, a postal employee for more than 36 years and a husband for 30 years.

"You don't get to see them (your family) and if you do you bark at them. You lose all contact.

"Now the wife, she's got to be a very understanding woman. And she has to assume all the responsibility for the children at Christmas.'

But Knable said that a mailman has a very special reward. It helps to ease hours of long work and time away from the family.
