## 'Progress' **Promised** By Dressel

By PAT MURPHY

Bubbling with harmony and pledges of progress, a new Mayor and two new City Commissioners elected in a low-interest election will be seated tomorrow by Coral Gables. They are:

MAYOR JERRY DRES-SEL, who won a four-year term in his unopposed bid. He garnered 2,688 votes.

COMMISSIONER JOE MURPHY who also won four years on the Commission as second high man in a field of five, with 2,548 votes. Murphy is immediate past mayor.

COMMISSIONER BILL CHAPMAN, 46, newcomer who beat out incumbent W. L. Philbrick by 44 votes for a twoyear term with 2,131 votes.

Philbrick and Dr. Franklin J. Evans, former Commissioner seeking a comeback, lost with 2,087 and 1,545 votes respectively.

Out of 12,431 registered voters in the Gables, 35 per cent or 4,359 — cast ballots. This included 36 absentee ballots.

The last city election two years ago drew 42 per cent.

Chapman credited his personal campaigning for votes as the key to his upset victory over Philbrick.

But observers were more inclined to credit anti-liquor campaigning by various Coral Gables churches and Phil-brick's lack of campaigning.

Dressel pledged a "progressive" Commission term, stressing continued development of new construction and attraction of new business to the Ga-

Murphy's post-election statement was much the same as hose before the election - his desire to remain in city government to help complete projects started during his administra-

Philbrick, if he felt badly about losing by a narrow margin to Chapman, showed no signs Tuesday night when he showed up for Murphy's victory celebration.

Lee Lincoln - That unpredictable mystery man of many faces - is going on a holiday with his new love.

#### Around the world!

And his new love is the "Holiday," a 200-foot Norwegian cargo ship that first threaded through the fjords in 1940.

The enigmatic Lincoln, who dresses like a grizzled gold prospector, but talks like a college professor is known for his frequent, head-on battles with the Gables City Commission.

Wealthy from various Gables real estate holdings, he often shuffles along on saudals and garbed in rumpled shirt and baggy pants.

A well-read, well-traveled man, he recently fought to buy the UM's decaying San Sebastian dorm to turn it into a center for the handicapped. Miami Beach millionaire, who did buy it, is now

But that's behind-him. Lincoln now talks about his new love — and his plans for her.

"Didn't you ever want to go around the world in a great, big beautiful boat?" Lincoln quizzed, his 250 pounds burdening a kitchen chair in his relic-cluttered home at 4855 Ponce de Leon Blvd. He throws nothing away.

"I'm chartering her for a year on a global tour. It's going to be like a private yacht and we'll set sail for the out-of-the-way places.

Expansion of the 2.5 million gallon plant, already at 90 per cent capacity, would have caused treatment cost to jump when the City faced spending another \$270,000.

The Gables will initially pay Miami approximately \$200,000 a year for cost of treatment.





## Late Ambulance Is Inexcusable

While one statistic is piled atop another in a senseless campaign defending the efficiency of ambulance service, injured and bleeding persons are lying on the streets waiting too long for help in Dade County.

The "average" time for responding to emergency calls by Randle-Eastern, the Metro ambulance contractor, is in itself impressive — as a statistic.

But statistics mean nothing to an aging, bleeding man sprawled on a sidewalk with his leg severed.

We cite this as an actual case.

This was the case of the man rammed through a Miracle Mile shop window by his wife's runaway car. He later

While police repeatedly checked on the whereabouts of an ambulance and Coral Gables firemen worked to stop life from draining away, minutes ticked by.

The idiocy is that Metro has placed into the hands of a single ambulance operator the major responsibility for tending the emergency needs of an entire county of a million souls - when other help could be close by.

The injured and dying need prompt help.

Under the Metro policy, only the county's contractor ambulance service can remove the injured.

Is it reasonable for a seriously injured person to wait eight minutes, 10 or 15 - whatever the "average" time

We think not.

Metro needs to study emergency ambulance service in Dade. Can help be speeded up with an improved communications system? Or is it a question of more ambulances posted more strategically?

And, please, let's not get into more statistics on "average" response times.



The thunderous thud of nails driven into a cross.

Horses hooves hammer hard against stone pave-

Wind whistles softly in a lonely night.

And it begins, a reverent retelling of the Greatest Story Ever Told.

Sound effects is only one part of what it takes to put on the nation's largest Easter Pageant held each year in the Orange Bowl Stadium, 1500 NW 3rd St.

A cast of 150 men, women, and children of all denominations is in rehearsal, in addition to raising sets, for the Sunday event, directed by Rev. Neil Wyrick Jr., Palmetto Presbyterian Church, 6790

"Lots of faith goes into putting this on," Rev. Wyrick said softly. "The past two weeks, the Lord has really been there."

What goes into taking 30,-000 people back 2,000 years? Voices, crowd scenes, acting, says the youthful preacher.

"We were trying to get the sound of nails going into the cross," Rev. Wyrick said. "Nothing seemed to work. Then we hit a hunk of wood against a fake doorway and that was it."

"For the horses, we couldn't find anything, but records of them galloping," he observed, "so we used it at half speed, just like the wind, it's really a blizzard."

\* \* \*

TAKE THREE different crowd records, put them together in one recording and what have you got? A mob in Jerusalem, watching the Crucifixion.

"We took a record of a crowd leaving a theater, one of some University students, and an ordinary crowd," Rev. Wyrick said. "That way, we got what we wanted."

When it comes to costumes, sometimes you make too many, or too few. We've got to have twenty-two costumes in a hurry," the preacher explained. "People in a lot of different churches are helping out. More children are in it this year than ever before.'

What if a costume doesn't

"Something has to be done quick," he said. "We've got somebody at work now making a costume smaller.'

"Making the actors up is an adventure in itself," Rev. Wyrick observed, "We need more people to put the beards on the disciples. It takes a full hour to make up Matt in the role of Christ."

And there've been things that happened in the past. Seventy-five mile an hour winds whipped through the stadium the night before the 1956 pageant knocking down all the sets. "But there was little damage and we got them all back up in time."

Judas hung himself in the 1960 pageant. And somebody was supposed to take him down after it was over. They forgot, so he hung there for a full five minutes after the performance before he got somebody's attention.

"He was hanging there by straps under his arms, a special kind of pulley that is used for that kind of thing.

## Another Oldtime Gables Policeman Exits

A time-tarnished gold whistle and a pair of sidewalkworn, polished black shoes . they're not at the Gables Police station anymore.

Sergeant Franklin 'Skeet' Brooks retired last week.

On the day he celebrated his 65th birthday, this bald-

ing grandfather of seven, who lives at 4545 Riviera Dr., pushed past the station's swinging doors on Aragon Avenue — as he'd done for 23 years - for the last time.

Sgt. Brooks swirled in his swivel chair and recalled that conversation. "He said to me," Brooks reminisced 'You got some dark pants? White shirt? Black shoes and a dark tie?""

A Gables woman who lives on the 1400 block of Algardi Avenue reported to the police there was a Peeping Tom looking in her bathroom window.


Officer Henry Arnaud arrived first and apprehended a man in stocking feet walking across the front lawn. He had left his shoes under the bathroom window.

## Jacques Wolfe: He Tinkers with the Infinite

Jacques Wolfe has had .23 one-man showings of his phowork, including the one that runs through April 17, at Sindelir Gallery, 90 Almeria, Coral Gables, He is also the composer of songs classics, such as "Shortnin' Bread" and "De Glory Road." His achievements in both fields have brought him quantities of critical praise.

But Jacques Wolfe is not simply a successful artist; he is essentially a man who tinkers with the infinite, a man whose mind leaps to the un-

Shy and modest, he is nevertheless impatient with restricted techniques, what he calls the "cliches" of artistic standards. Both his music and his photography testify to his restless search for new methods.

As a young soldier stationed at Greenville, S.C., during World War I, he'd take long Sunday afternoon walks through the country. "I heard exciting music coming out of those little Negro clapboard churches," he said. "Later, I discivered some song poems which fit in with my idea of using the spirit-

ual idiom in the form of concert song.'

After the war, Wolfe returned to New York, where he taught high school music by day, and worked on his compositions at night. He created "De Glory Road," "Gwine to Hebbin," the operetta "The Trysting Tree,"

and collaborated with Roark Bradford on "John Henry," a folk opera, which was produced on Broadway.

"I was fortunate that some of the greatest voices of the day - Lawrence Tibbett and John Charles Thomas wanted to sing my music,"

Wolfe taught high school for 25 years in Brooklyn; his wife, Rose, taught first

"As I neared my 50th birthday, it started getting to me. The kids were fine, but all they demanded from the music was the right to blow loud. I decided not to spend another ten years waiting for my pension."

So he and his wife quit their jobs, sold their furniture, packed the car and headed south.

One of the Items that made the trip south with the Wolfes was Jacques' \$7.50 Kodak box camera.

After watching other camera addicts fiddling with the details of their equipment, Wolfe decided that the first thing he had to learn was how to take a picture; technical experience could come

Wolfe's searching mind has produced some startling innovations in camera technique. In portrait work, he will sometimes curl the photographic paper to achieve an effect of greater intensity around the subject's dominant feature - the eyes, or

the hands, or even the posture of a standing figure.

His color photography shimmers with ingenuity. His time exposures, double and multiple exposures, many of brightly colored lights against a night background, are as impressive and exciting as their counterparts in abstract art. Wolfe also works with open shutter techniques and has produced a body of nonrepresentational work that he calls "black canvas" studies.

His portraits of Carolina mountain people stand in contrast to his abstract work. These are simple people photographed against backgrounds, yet stark viewed through Wolfe's shutter, they glow with the beauty of reality and the scars of their endurance.

Wolfe and his wife live in South Miami, in a home that reflects their enjoyment of all things beautiful: the walls are dominated by massive, abstract canvasses, the porch is open to the sunlight and the view of their flower garden.

Although Wolfe divides his time between composing (his son. Paul, conductor of the Florida West Coast Symphony, recently introduced his father's latest work, "Psalm 67") and his backyard darkroom, he won't consider a career as a commercial portrait photographer.

"People who are scrupulously honest about everything else expect you to produce a portrait that makes them young and beautiful," he said. "Yet my object in camera work is to reveal, not to conceal."

Similarly, he hasn't considered publishing a book of photographs. "I'm not much of a salesman for myself. I derive sufficient enjoyment from my creative work and" gesturing toward his garden, "from the beauty surrounding me."



## Duke Was a Leopard And So Is 'Madge'

Damon Runyon often used the phrase "more than somewhat." I was pregnant "more than somewhat" when I waddled into the drugstore to see if I could find a book to take my mind off my miseries, both current and impending. I selected "The Leopard," but when I got home I realized it was long, and full of interchangeable names. In a decidedly bovine mood, I filed the book under the short leg of the table and forgot it.

Several months later, the movie started playing on the Beach, and I went to see it. A moody, vague film, it looked as if it had been shot through an earth-colored lens. It was full of a sense of imminent tragedy which never materialized, and all I remember was the Duke's final speech.

Looking for all the world like Burt Lancaster in a pair of false sideburns, he mused that he was a leopard, but after he was gone, the jackals and the goats would replace him.

He was referring, of course, to the passing of the aristocracy and the coming of age of the middle class, but his speech has certain modern applications.

I know some leopards, too, people of incomparable grace; strangely, perhaps, none of them are any younger than the aging Italian Duke.

Margaret Loughlin is such a person. Her face is broad and jowly, her hair is white, and even when she braids it, stubborn. Her eyebrows are one magnificent, shaggy line. The effect is of a woman uncoiffed, unplucked, unpowdered.

She learned how to walk properly when she was in Nurses' Training, going to school for eight hours and working in the Brooklyn tenements for another eight. You can almost hear the drums when she strides up the street, carrying a bag of groceries and a bulging pocketbook.

Even her youngest grandchildren call her "Madge," but they do so with awe as well as familiarity, sensing that she is a mixture of no-nonsense values and delightful irreverance. Widowed when the oldest of her four children was not yet in grade school, she kept the family together through the depression and eventually managed to send all four to college, and two to graduate school.

She confessed once that she learned two tricks of great practical value.

"At the end of the day, I'd take the brood out to the yard for a game of tag. I'd run faster and faster, then disappear into the house to fix supper. Half an hour later, they'd troop in exhausted to eat, bathe, and go to sleep."

Her other secret was a matter of aptitude testing. "Joe was no good at washing windows because he'd sit on the ledge reading old newspapers for hours." Joe, clearly not cut out to be a window-washer, is now director of news at WCBS-TV.
