Coral Gables 'Equalizes' **Golf Fees**

Golf fees at the Granada and Biltmore Golf Courses were "equalized" by the Coral Gables City Commission Tuesday.

Henceforth, all residents, whether members of the Coral Gables Country Club or not, will pay the same fees.

A disparity will still exist, however, between non-resident members of the Country Club and other non-residents.

Commissioner Joe Murphy moved the legislation last week after a group of golfers, led by inttorney Bernard Weksler, sued the city, charging that fees at two municipally operated were discriminatory.

The change will result in a minor loss in revenue to the sity between now and the end of the fiscal year.


Meanwhile, City Attorney Ted Sexelle filed a motion in Circuit Court to have the suit dismissed.
