

Builds Bridges Of Friendship

Seventy years young and still going strong could be one way of describing Joseph W. Hunter, 1042 Sorolla Ave. One might even say that Joe, as he prefers to ' called dabbles in "construction work."

Actually he is a retired mediical service representative, and the only "construction work" he does is in the field if "Building Bridges of Friendship."

Each month he sends congratulatory letters to all the new clubs in the Rotary world, and each week he brings two new overseas students to the meeting of the Coral Gables club.

With the help of Dr. Louis Melina, who is in charge of foreign student registration at the University of Miami, Hunter is able to get in contact with all the newly registered foreign students.

The list of countries that have been represented is vast. Practicelly all of South America has bec. represented, not to mention students from Mexico, Cuba, France, Germany, Hungary, Spain, China and Japan.

Keep In Contact

Many of the students keep in contact with him even after they have gone back to their homeland.

"T+'s pleasing to know that I'. been remembered," said Hunter. "During the years that I've been in this pleasant work the dividends have come in regularly."

His mailbox is continually crammed with letters bearing postmarks from the four corners of the earth.

There are very few students th he doesn't recall by name, and very few that don't thank him for the services he has rendered them.

"Everyone of them has as much personality as fleas on a pup," said Hunter. "It's been wonderful working with them, and I hope that they have learned as much about us as we have about them."



At Last-Some Issues

Coral Gables is about to see something it hasn't seen in a long time - a city election with real issues.

At least that's the way things seem to be shaping up for the April 11 contest.

For those who don't already know, most elections in Coral Gables are about as exciting as a race for the Board of Deacons. Not that there haven't been issues. There have been, but most of them were quietly swept under the rug and everybody pretended that there was no trouble in paradise.

However, there are signs that April 11, 1961, is going to be different.

It's pretty certain by now that there are going to be a few new faces in the local political jousts. These newcomers are not going to be willing to operate on the all's-well-that-seems-well basis that has been the vogue in the past.

The advent of these newcomers and the fact that certain issues have arisen in Coral Gables that just can't be brushed aside add up to a promise for a lively city election.

We can't mention the newcomers until they give official notice of their intentions to be candidates. We can, however, mention a few of the issues that you can bet will be hotly discussed during the cam-

These issues, unlike so many in the past, have heated up the emotions of Gableites, who want to see something done about them.

There are at least six good ones, and there may be others. Here are the six we expect to be hearing a lot about:

- 1. High Rise Buildings. The proposal to erect a 12-story apartment building in Coral Gables stirred up an intense controversy. Voters will be watching all candidates for their views on this issue.
- 2. Zoning. This also is an issue that has been the subject of heated discussions in Coral Gables. The proposal to build a service station on LeJeune Rd. between Palermo and Sevilla is just one instance of the heat this issue can generate. Candidates will have to offer leadership in this area.
- 3. Room Renting. This has been one of the most emotional issues ever to divide Coral Gables. It has never been resolved to the satisfaction of everyone, and it is bound to crop up during the campaign.
- 4. Recreation. More and more dissatisfaction is being expressed over the recreation facilities and programs of Coral Gables. This is a relatively new interest on the part of local residents, but it is gaining in interest all the time.
- 5. The Economic Welfare of Local Business. The city has already appropriated \$65,000 for advertising and administrative purposes for a program to revitalize Coral Gables as a shopping area, tourist attraction and desirable residential city. This expenditure is bound to be examined during the campaign with questions about its effectiveness and disputes about what should be emphasized in the future.
- 6. Conflict of Interest. The present City Commission, after considerable soul searching and no little squirming, finally came up with a conflict of interest ordinance which some believe is weak and others believe is adequate. The vacillations of the Commission before it took any step to strengthen the old conflict of interest provisions of the City Charter is bound to be fodder for candidates who will oppose the incumbents, or else we don't know politicians.

That's the way the upcoming race looks to us, and we confess that we hope the campaign shapes up somewhat along these lines. Coral Gables could use a good, lively local election. There are plenty of issues that need an airing, and we hope they get a good one.

ASSESTE BREEGS

By EDWIN KNIGHT



THERE WAS A BIG shakeup in the management of Metro last week. The county's numerous commissioners got together at a breakfast meeting and quietly decided to give County Manager O, W. (Hump) Campbell the heave-ho. Thus ended the three-year tenure of Metro's first county manager.

WHETHER CAMPBELL will be remembered as a good or merely a fair county manager is a matter for discussion. His was a tough job. He took an unknown and untried charter and put it to work. He answered to a Commission whose interest in Metro seemed of a semi-personal nature.

HE HAD TO reorganize nearly every department in the new government and still keep politics out of Metro. He had to make behind-the-scenes moves before he could get up steam. And yet, he reported to the commissioners, the press and the people. It was indeed a tough job.

THE REASONS BEHIND the firing are vague. It appears that Campbell got the ax for not stepping on the gas soon enough. He apparently spent to much time getting up steam before he pulled out the throttle. But were these really the reasons behind the ouster? Perhaps, perhaps not.

FIRST, CAMPBELL took over as county manager without the vote of confidence expected of a man stepping into such a position. Most of the original five commissioners were holding out for a local man, a politician who could wheel and deal to gain what he wanted.

White, 36, is the youngest man ever to head what is reported to be Dade County's oldest title insurance company. He

CAMPBELL WAS A MAN of few words. He was quiet, reserved and undemonstrative. He also was an ardent student of municipal government. He was an expert on tax procedures and problems, the solution of which could indicate the rise or fall of Metro.

BUT CAMPBELL was not a flamboyant man. He never was an never will be. He was not a grandstander or an extroverted exponent of Metro. He did not spend as much time selling as administering the new government. Lastly, he was not a politician.

HE ABHORED POLITICS and politicians. He dealt with them as best he could. In the end, they got the best of him. And now thse politicians are looking for another manager. Will it be another professionoal manager or a political manager? The difference is a thin line hinging on a man's personality.

OUR GUESS IS that the new manager will be a wheeler and dealer, long on handshakes and short on ability. He will be a local man who has gained fame here in one field or another. He may be William D. Singer, Royal Castle czar who was Dade's representative on the State Road Board.

IT MIGHT BE General E. A. Evans, who was bounced out not so long ago as Miami's city manager. Or then agin, it might be Melvin Reese, present Miami city manager, who could well take over the reigns of Metro. Others have been mentioned for the job, but they appear to be friends of various county commissioners.

ANYONE COULD GET the job. And past performances indicate that Dade Countians couldn't care any less. One of Mr. Campbell's most provocative statements about Dade County was said not while he was in office but after he was fired.

ASKED WHAT HE thought was Metro's chief drawback, Campbell retorted promptly, the people. He added that an acute lack of community spirit was inflicting great harm on Metro. And he is right. The people get what they deserve.

AND WHAT DADE Countians richly deserve is a politician as a county manager. Time and the lack of it has dealt harshly with Dade County. To most of us living here, Metro is a word, with little meaning and the same amount of interest.

IF THE UMPTEEN county commissioners want a politician as county manager, that's fine with most of our citizens. "I'm just here for the winter," they reply as they close their newspapers and extol the virtues of northern municipal gov-

THIS LACK of community spirit has been a deteriment to Dade County down through the years because of the number of transients here and our wide and varied cultural backgrounds. Few of us have a feeling of belonging. We have left our allegiances in our former cities. And we are dearly paying the price for this infidelity.

WE ARE HERE now, not as fuedal vassals to a lord, but as citizens of a government that is crying for leadership. We have chosen to live here. Our roots are short ones, but some of our economic interests are as wide as they were in our former cities

WITH A WELL-RUN government, our homes will increase, rather than falter, in value. This lack of community interest so apparent to Mr. Campbell is hurting us in other ways, too. The area's annual United Fund, which supports many county-wide projects, has failed to reach its goal for the second time in two years.

OUR VOTING PERCENTAGE for the number of eligible voters is one of the lowest in the country. This clearly shows how much we care who is elected to represent us in our local, state or natioonal elections. Our recreation facilities, including our most valuable assets in land and beaches, have been swept away from under our noses because of public
