## S. Miami Renews Water Rate Fight

### Long Seeks 'Unfreezing' Of Consumers' Schedule



OPENING TODAY in the Cutler Ridge Regional Shopping Center is Richards Department Store. Richards, new store utilizes the latest architectural and construction techniques and will

### New Richards Opens Today

Six months ago Richards Cutler Ridge store was just a sketch on blueprint. Today, majestically modern and spaciouly sprawled over 70,000 square feet of space, it is open for business.

This beautiful suburban branch, which increases the growing Richards family to four, boasts the distinction of being the largest department store south of Coral Gables and the fir major department store between Miami and Key West.

Located in the south end of the mushrooming Cutler Ridge Regional Shopping Center, Richards southern-most branch is molded along ultra-modern lines.

The rambling two-story structure is unusual in that it is made of pre-cast columns and beams. Designed by nationally known architect Meyer Katzman, whose fame extends from Florida to Southern California, Richards is an interesting study in architecture and color, from the outside as well as the inside.

Directly in front of the main entrance, set in an island of concrete and flanked by a profusion of tropical foliage, lies a

picturesque pool that is a bubbling kaleidoscope of color.

The exterior, with its imposing facade, is typical of South Florida's modern architecture.

The handsome main entrance of the building is a subtle contrast of color. A subdued beige shadowbox effect of block, outlined in white, is supported by square terra-cotta pillars.

Entrances and exits to Richards can be gained through multiple glass doors at the front of the shopping area, the south side and in the rear facing the parking area. An additional doorway on the north side, toward the center of the building opens directly onto the mall, adjacent to the side entrance of W. T. Grant.

Once inside, customers and onlookers alike will be warmed by a bevy of friendly colors ranging from greens and yellows to blues and lilacs.

At the same time, they will be cooled by an elaborate system of air-conditioning which pumps, via two machines, a total capacity of 230 tons of cool air.

Brilliant lighting will flood the store from the 2343 lamps in

the ceiling and cove. The intricate fixtures alone contain 829 lamps.

Hanging from the dropped ceiling in scattered locations are some half dozen colorful murals—striking attention-getters all—depicting various aspects of suburbia.

Like its downtown and 163rd Street counterparts, the Cutler Ridge branch will be completely stocked in merchandise that is the finest in quality, value, assortment and fashion.

The new Richards will house a complete line of ready-to-wear for men, women, children and infants. It has a Scout department for boys and girls; accessory divisions including handbags, jewelry, hosiery, neckwear and gloves; a candy department; stationery and notion counters; records; a gift department containing china, silverware and lamps; major and minor appli-

### Canal Killed By Metro, Coral Gables

Coral Gables last week, in effect, gave Dade County Metro Commission a free hand in its handling of the salt water intrusion line problem.

The Coral Gables city fathers passed a resolution rescinding a previously passed resolution accepting the route of a proposed canal to be dug by developer Sol Rovin through Matheson Hammock.

Metro on the same day, also voted to rescind the canal digging permit issued to Rovin.

In rescinding the previous resolution, Coral Gables is complying with the Metro salt water intrusion line which is farther east (nearer the bay) than the Coral Gables intrusion line.

Meanwhile, at the courthouse, a seven-man committee, including Coral Gables Mayor John Montgomery and Commissioner Frank Kerdyk, made a list of recommendations to be presented to the Metro Commission that may spell the end of Rovin's canal.

City of South Miami, which two years ago fought Consumers Water Company in court over the price of water, is now arguing with a Metro Water Committee over the same water price.

Former South Miami City Attorney Hughlan Long reported to South Miami Council last week that he had the freezing of Consumers Water Company rates deferred for two weeks so as to explain to the Metro Commission why South Miami's water company rates should be reduced rather than frozen.

As of now, South Miami's water rates are \$1.50 per cubic feet of water. If South Miami wins a suit pending in Circuit Court, the rates will be lowered to \$1.40 per cubic feet of water.

#### To Explain

Long intends to explain to Metro's Water Committee and the Metro Commission that if the rates are frozen now, there will be no lowering of water rates for two years. Specifically, Long is asking that all of Consumers Water Company rates be lowered to \$1.40 across the line.

Coral Gables now pays \$1.50 per cubic feet and the county area served by Consumers now pays \$1.80 per cubic feet.

Long explained that the profit made by Consumers would be offset by the lowering of rates to water users served by Consumers.

Consumers is a subsidiary of General Water Works which is in the process of being purchased by Metro for more than \$7 million.

South Miami was taken to court in 1958 after the city set its own water rates. A spot audit made by the city showed that Consumers was making what the city termed more than a fair rate of return on its investment in the City.

...tive, active member of Latin National Honor Society, and student council representative.



(Continued From Page One) ments that a salt water intrusion line be established from the northern boundary of Broward County to southern end of Dade County.

The committee said canals crossing the salt water intrusion line may be approved if dams could be constructed to prevent salt intrusion.

At a meeting Oct. 3, the committee heard conflicting engineering reports on the probable effect of the Rovin canal on the area.

But one report, that of Howard Klein, of the U. S. Geological Survey, convinced the committee that the salt water intrusion line was significant.

Klein brought out that if the Rovin canal was dug, there would be difficulty in keeping salt water out of Snapper Creek Canal.

The County Commission had voted August 2 to permit Rovin, a Coral Gables developer, to cut a canal through Matheson Hammock, a county park, to permit Rovin's Hammock Oaks subdivision to have access to the bay.

The excavation allegedly would push the county's salt water line back 1800 feet and threaten present fresh water wells used by property owners and City of Miami to service homes, swimming pools and air conditioning near the proposed canal.

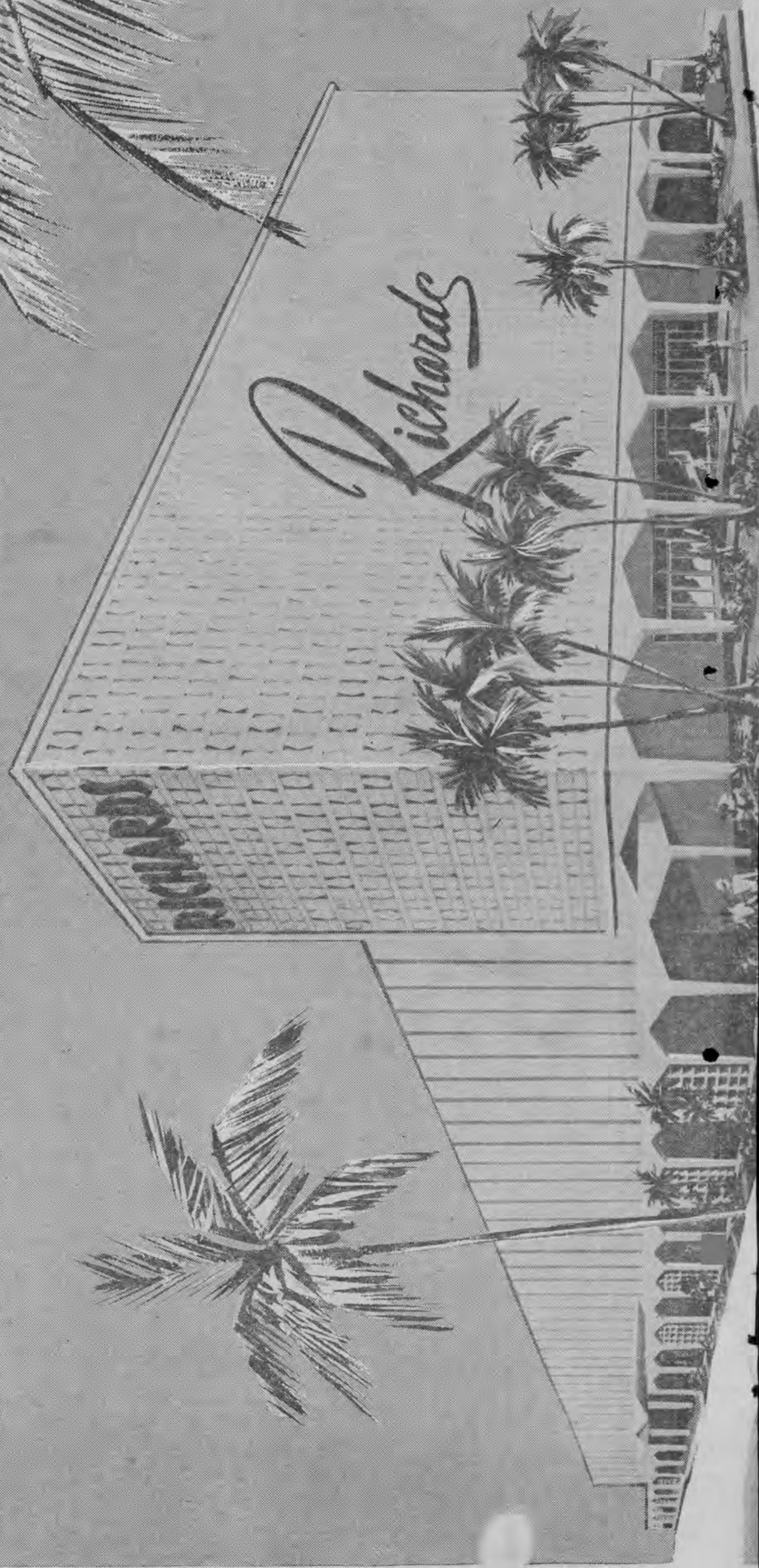

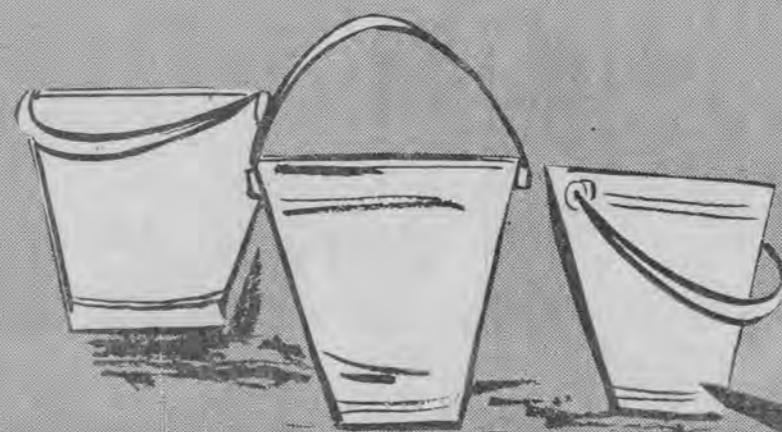
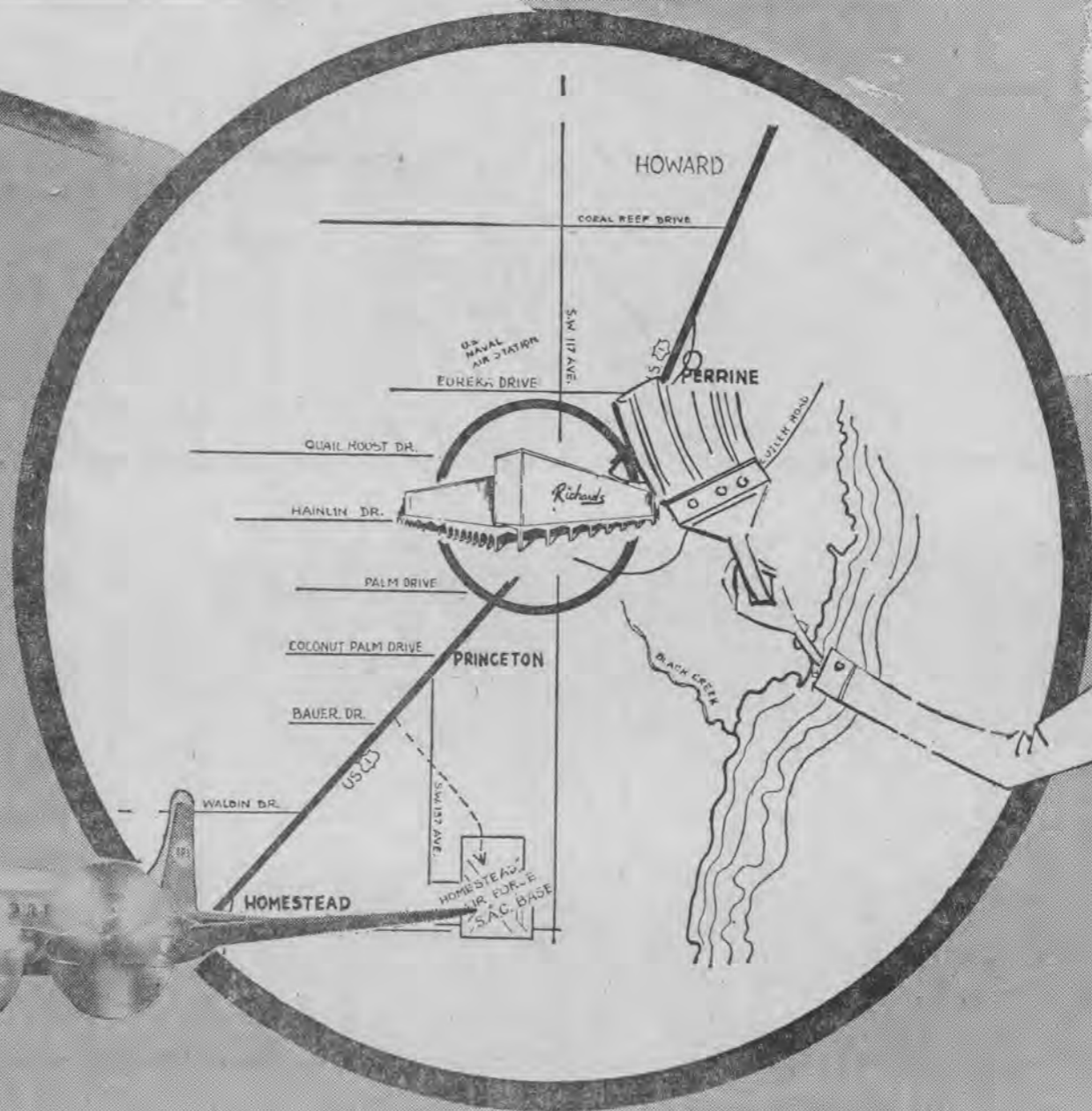

# Is Doctors' Hospital Entitled To Exemption?

Following a recent spot audit of Doctors' Hospital's books, Coral Gables Tax Assessor T. C. Blount is of the opinion that the hospital does not meet the requirements that exempt the medical institution from paying city ad valorem taxes.

Doctors' Hospital has been exempted from paying real and personal property taxes for the years 1958, 1959 and 1960.

Why?

This was the subject of an informal inquiry conducted by the Coral Gables City Commission in the Red Room of Coral Gables Country Club last week.

## 13-Page Report

Attending the meeting were Blount, City Finance Director Kenneth Allyn and City Auditor Paul Gleman. It was Gleman who conducted the recent audit which covered 13 pages and takes in the financial standing of Doctors' Hospital.

At the conclusion of the hour-long inquiry, the Commission decided to take no action until it meets again next July when it sits as a Board of Equalization.

The meeting centered around questions fired at Blount by members of the Commission. Blount told of the background of the hospital's tax exemption, which put the exemption squarely upon the shoulders of the 1958 city commission.

## Previews Ruling

Blount brought out that he, in 1958, brought to the Commission's attention the fact that he didn't believe the hospital met the qualifications exempting it from paying city taxes.

Blount added that he was overridden by the commission at that time on advice of City Attorney Ted Semple, who ruled again at the Tuesday session that the city may be beaten if it took the case to court.

Blount said precedent dictates that once an institution is exempt from paying taxes, the exemption usually carries over from year to year.

Blount said he assumed the commission wanted the exemption carried over for the years 1959 and 1960.

## No Harsh Words

There were no loud or harsh words at the meeting. There was no placing of the blame on anyone.

But it was determined that between now and the time that the City Commission meets next July as a Board of Equalization, the city tax assessor (Blount) will delve further into the audit to determine whether the city has a case against Doctors' Hospital.

As it stands now, Blount is of the opinion that the hospital should have been taxed for three years. But Blount's opinion differs from that of City Attorney Semple.

So the uppermost question still remains — Is the Dr. John T. MacDonald Foundation, which operates Doctors' Hospital, properly organized and operated to receive exemption from assessment of ad valorem taxes as a non profit and/or charitable institution?

## Goes Into History

The audit report goes into the foundation's history, the scope of the investigation, the results of the investigation and comments and recommendations.

The audit brought out that:

- The Foundation's Charter and its objectives bear a similarity.
- Payments are demanded of those able to pay.
- Surplus income over expenses must be used for one of

• Patients who apply for services at the hospital are accepted even though financial responsibility is not established or, in effect, all who seek are furnished service.

• No label is attached to charity patients, not even the nurses know such a condition exists and treatment of paying and non-paying patients is identical.

## \$40,000 Exemption

City Finance Director said that had the hospital not received the exemption, the city would have received about \$40,000 over the three-year period.

The spot audit of the hospital's books was ordered recently by the City to determine its tax exemption eligibility.

Blount said only an audit would determine this.

The condition was brought to the city's attention by Attorney Bernard Weksler who claimed that the hospital was not four things: to improve hospital, charity, education or research, eligible for the exemption.

## Banking Empire Breaking Up

Coral Gables First National Bank, 100 Miracle Mile, has been sold by James Sottile Jr., for a reported \$3,685,000 to Houston, Texas, financier Jacques Mossler.

The owner of several banks in Texas and the Central Bank and Trust Co., of Miami, Mossler bought 89 percent of the Coral Gables bank stock in a cash transaction.

Sottile, in the process of selling all his seven Florida banks, has sold three of the banks so far and is dickering now for the sale of the Pan American Bank of Miami.

Sale of the Coral Gables bank brings to \$16,385,000 the amount of properties Sottile, Inc., has sold in the past few months.

Mossler owns the Mutual National Bank, Houston, Service Trust Co., of San Antonio, American Trust Co., of South Bend, Ind., two insurance companies and a finance company.

"We're going to build a stronger bank in Coral Gables," Mossler said this week.

Coral Gables First National has total resources of nearly \$46 million and deposits of some \$42 million.

HOW MANY OF YOU have wondered, as have I, why some things are done and why still other things are left undone?

It's a part of our thinking process, I believe, to be analytical about happenings in our daily lives.

Why is one part of a city zoned one way and another part of a city zoned another way? Why do masses of people take one way to and from work in preference to another way? Why are so many stores built in one location and few stores built in another location?

MANY OF THE ANSWERS to these and other questions are determined by the habits and thoughts of most people who live and work in a community.

But, more important, some questions can be answered only by our city officials and the men who run the businesses we daily deal with.

In just the last several days I have written down a few questions. Some I have answered. Some I cannot—at least in a satisfactory way.

Here they are —

**WHY DO CORAL GABLES AND SOUTH MIAMI KEEP ALL TRAFFIC SIGNALS OPERATING 24 HOURS A DAY, SEVEN DAYS A WEEK?**

There probably is an answer to this but I can't figure it out. Most cities in which I have ever lived turn most of its street lights on amber at 11 p.m. or midnight so cars won't have to be continuously stopping at traffic signals way into the night without other cars being anywhere in sight. I know there are many traffic signals in Coral Gables that could be turned on amber following the late movie rush. Many are on LeJeune Rd. Some are on Coral Way and Ponce de Leon Blvd.

**WHY IS GREATER MIAMI'S TELEPHONE BOOK ONE OF THE FEW TELEPHONE BOOKS IN THE COUNTRY WHERE THE YELLOW PAGES OUTNUMBER THE WHITE PAGES?**

I'll take a stab at answering this. But the telephone company may not like the answer. The answer, I feel lies in the telephone company pushing the yellow pages more than the white pages. The yellow pages are a cross reference of businesses which use the city's telephone directory, as big and clumsy as it is, as another means of advertising.

Remember, there are thousands of Greater Miamians who have unlisted numbers. The names and numbers of these residents do not even appear in the white pages. So the businesses have their numbers in twice while a great many residents do not even have their number in the telephone book once.

**WHY DO REAR-END COLLISIONS OUTNUMBER ALL OTHER ACCIDENTS ON SOUTH DIXIE HWY. THROUGH SOUTH MIAMI, CORAL GABLES AND MIAMI?**

The answer here is simple. Yet the rear-end collision accident rate will continue. Traveling too fast while following too closely is the answer. Like many of you, I have seen it happen and nearly had it happen to me. The solution is hanging farther behind the car in front, especially when the two cars pick up speed.

**WHY ARE DADE'S CITIZENS AND EVEN SOME MEDIA CONTINUOUSLY REFERRING TO 67th AVENUE AS LUDLUM ROAD RATHER THAN LUDLAM ROAD?**

The U and the A are changed in the two street names. And how the spelling came to be known as Ludlum is anyone's guess, least of all the man for whom the street was named Walter H. Ludlam.

A pioneer Miamian, Ludlam was the one who passed a petition to get the road built in 1914. He was also the one who went amongst his pioneer neighbors gathering contributions — which the county commission matched — for the right-of-way construction.

Ludlam, 78 years of age now, resides at 6462 SW 6th St. and is still tolerant about the name of his street having been misspelled to these many years.

Habit has predominated in most people spelling the street Ludlum rather than Ludlam. But little by little the street name is being changed to LUDLAM. Remember now, it's Ludlam.
