### Mow Lots Or We Will, Says Metro

Something they said couldn't be done last spring — a law requiring overgrown lots to be cleared — was put on first reading by the Metro Commission last week.

The legislation was introduced by Metro Commissioner Robert Brake.

A campaign by The Guide last spring to have the condition cleaned up met with the answer that it could not be done legally on a Countywide basis.

A public hearing on the proposed ordinance is scheduled for Nov. 6 before the Metro Commission.

The ordinance basically provides that overgrown lots must be cleared by the owner or they will be cleared by the County and the owner assessed the costs.

Several municipalities in Dade County have had similar ordinances designed to keep their communities looking clean, but Metro officials until recently doubted that the County which has vast undeveloped areas could accomplish the same thing.

### 17-'City' Plan Unveiled by Metro

Metro has taken the wraps off a 170-page report calling for creation of 17 service areas — three of them in our Southwest Dade — around the nucleus of South Miami, Westwood Lake and Kendall.

West Miami would be submerged in the South Miami area and Sweetwater is left untouched under the plan to straighten out Dade's nagged municipal boundaries.

Mayor Paul U. Tevis of South Miami was only lukewarm to the idea.

Said Tevis:

"Offhand, it didn't appeal to me."

Tevis said he had not seen the full report, but has an open mind on the subject. He said expanding the South Miami limits from Bird Road all the way to Tamiami Trail and engulfing West Miami for services did not appeal.

"We have no interest way up there," said Tevis.

West Miami Mayor Edmund Cooper's reaction was warmer than that of Tevis.

"I think it's the only way that services can be furnished to the unincorporated areas," said Cooper. "It's a better plan than Mr. McNayr's plan."

But Cooper was somewhat disappointed in the role set aside for West Miami.

He felt that West Miami could serve as the nucleus for a service area of its own, rather than being under the wing of South Miami.

Cooper said he was opposed to piecemeal annexation such as being proposed by Coral Gables and South Miami. He favored the people of the areas concerned having a voice in their future.

The east-west boundaries were more appealing to Tevis — they practically coincided with a plan of his own broached earlier this year which would have squared off South Miami between Red

### Canal Suit In Court This Week

Metro Attorney Darrey Davis filed suit this week to allow the county to unblock and clean up the Coral Gables Canal.

Davis said he would seek an injunction to permit the county to go in and clean the controversial canal immediately.

A long stretch of the canal, lying between Red Road and Tamiami Trail, is owned by J. J. Lamb, a developer.

Lamb several months ago put up an earth dam at the railroad tracks and the canal after the County refused to buy it for approximately \$60,000.

This blocked off the natural easterly flow of water into the Coral Gables Waterway which empties into Biscayne Bay.

As a result, water hyacinths have choked the canal and recently hundreds of fish died from lack of oxygen in the portion from the railroad tracks to Red Road.

Residents in the area of the canal have also complained about pollution and the danger of falling in and not being able to swim because of the hyacinths.

Metro Commissioner Robert Brake has been working on the thorny problem since he took office.

He and Lamb once crossed horns and Lamb threatened to arrest anyone trespassing on his canal.

### 5-Way Squabble On Over Hospital Sewer

A heated debate over who controls a sewage line running through South Miami to Coral Gables treatment plant is holding up construction — and eventual opening — of a self-service laundry in South Miami.

The argument took place at a regular South Miami Council

meeting Tuesday night of last week when representatives of South Miami Hospital and the president of the corporation which owns the building housing the hospital locked horns.

The City Council Monday night voted 3-2 to amend a previous franchise agreement to allow a public rather than a private franchise to Wash Bowl Inc. to allow it to hook into the South Miami Hospital line. After they discovered an oversight that prohibited the proposed hookup.

The amended ordinance will be presented at the Nov. 6 meeting and placed on first and second reading for final reading scheduled the following week.

Gist of the controversy was

### 25 Races, Amendments

## Long Ballot Looms Nov. 6

It may be an off-year for elections, but from the long list of races — national, state and local — you'd never know it.

In our area alone there are 25 races, 10 of which are being contested. Democrats have clear sailing in the other 15.

Topping the list is the race between incumbent Democrat Sen. George Smathers and Emerson Rupert, Republican for Smather's senate seat.

Dante B. Fascell, incumbent Democrat representative from the Fourth Congressional District, is opposed by Republican J. C. (Jay) McGlon Jr.

The Railroad and Public Utilities Commission race pits incumbent Democrat Jerry W.

Carter against H. B. (Bob) Foster, Republican.

Dade Countians will vote for three members of the State House of Representatives.

In Group 1, George L. Holahan Jr., Democrat incumbent, faces opposition from Charles P. English, Republican.

Group 2 pits Democrat Earl Faircloth and Republican Elwood T. Lippincott.

The third House seat is a battle between the Democrat incumbent Carey Matthews and Coral Gables attorney Al Schrader, Republican.

Another county-wide race will be for three seats on the Board of Public Instruction.

Jim Hendrie, Democrat, will

face Ralph T. Craigo II, Republican in District 1.

Helene J. Vosloh, Democrat, is opposed by Charles P. English, Republican.

And Democrat G. Holmes Braddock is pitted against Arthur A. Atkinson, Republican.

Another state contest — for commissioner of Florida Inland Navigation District — is between Harvey H. Baker, Democrat, and Dick Merrell, Republican.

Elwyn Thomas, Democrat, is opposed in the District 1 race for Justice of the Supreme Court.

Former Florida Governor Millard F. Caldwell is also un-

Road and the Palmetto Expressway.

On the South, the boundary suggested by the Metro Planning Department is Snapper Creek. Tevis would have gone further to North Kendall Drive.

Snapper Creek would furnish the northern boundary for the Kendall Service Area, and area that would also be bordered by Red Road, SW 136th St. and an irregular boundary extending to westward to SW 136th Avenue,

receding back along SW 112th Avenue and then north along SW 117th Avenue.

The last area — Westwood Lake — would be surrounded by Tamiami Trail, Palmetto Expressway, Snapper Creek and SW 117th Avenue.

Roscoe Jones, director of the Metro Planning Department which did the research and survey work for the service area plan with the aid of the Metro Planning Board, was quick to point out that the recommendations are merely that.

"I think it wise to say that

it does not represent the thinking of the Board of County Commissioners," said Jones. They had not seen the report.

It obviously doesn't represent the thinking of County Manager Irving G. McNayr, who only recently proposed a plan for a one-government for all of Dade County.

Jones said the department never considered the single-city approach to solving the problem of Dade's service needs.

Under the plan, Service Areas could:

— Be comprised entirely

within a municipality.

— A combination of two or more municipalities.

— One or more municipalities and some unincorporated area.

— Composed entirely of unincorporated area.

The South Miami Service Area would comprise two municipalities and the unincorporated area in between.

Kendall and Westwood Lake Service areas are entirely unincorporated.

No municipality could be abolished without the consent of the people of that municipality and annexation of areas with more than 250 persons would still take a referendum.

endum.

The number and type of services to be rendered would be up to the people living in those areas. They would pay their share.

Jones denied Monday that the report had been suppressed.

Final printing of the report was completed last Friday, he said.

Back on Feb. 15, of this year, The Guide published a story which told the exact boundaries of one area that Metro was considering for service or incorporation.

This area is now called the Westwood Lake Service Area.

Later stories in The Guide

told of Metro's hush-hush plans to incorporate all of Dade County.

The Metro Planning Board report envisions 17 municipalities to replace the present 27.

Assistant County Manager Hoke Welch, who released the report Saturday after news media and Metro Commissioners, clamored for it, also denied that it had been suppressed.

## Our Roads to Get New Faces in a Month

Construction of Coral Way between the Palmetto Expressway and SW 87th Avenue is expected to get under way within a month following the award of a \$332,000 contract to low bidder, Harris Paving & Construction Co.

The project entails four-laning and dividing the present two-lane road which forms the southern boundary for Westchester Subdivision.

A drainage canal paralleling Coral Way will be covered, with either a trench or pipe replacing the hazardous open ditch there now.

Fourteen miles of Old Cutler Road — from Sunset Drive south to South Dixie, is also slated to begin within a month.

Asphalt Paving Co. got that contract for \$81,867.

Miller Road, from Red Road to SW 87th Avenue, is another project scheduled to get going in another four weeks.

whether South Miami Professional Building, Inc., has the right to lease part of a sewage line running from South Miami Hospital to the treatment plant.

Dr. James Lyons, president of the South Miami Professional Building, Inc., says it has the right.

## SH HOSPITAL SAYS

Hospital authorities say no. **Ralph H. Beardon Jr.**, Chairman of the Hospital Board, maintains the SMPB corporation is trespassing against a lease between the hospital and the corporation. He maintained, through attorney **George**

**Thompson**, that the lease includes control of the sewer line.

But Dr. Lyons, who constructed the building housing the hospital, maintained that the corp. retained control of the sewage line.

Dr. Lyons is attempting to lease a portion of the sewage line to Wash Bowl, Inc., a chain of self-service laundries which wants to build on a triangle at Red Road and South Dixie Highway.

Dr. Lyons says the hospital is operating the sewage line at only one-sixth of its capacity and use by the laundry would only increase the flow by a fraction.

## SH HOPE TO BUY

But Beardon brought out that the hospital eventually hopes to buy the building from the corporation, add on to the building and have nurses quarters. By opening the door for tap-ins to the sewage line, a trend may begin, although the sewage line total capacity may be needed in the future by the hospital.

Council tabled granting of right-of-way access to the laundry until the debate could be settled. Laundry owners

fear a long wait. The argument may go to court.

The laundry would be one of the most modern such services in the country. Costing some \$110,000, the business would include the first self-service dry cleaning plant in the South Miami area.

Wash Bowl, Inc., owns three other laundries and has leased franchises for 36 others.

City of Coral Gables has granted permission for the tap-in.

# Gables Band Drive Hunts Dollars

The Coral Gables High School band's drive to raise \$15,000 for a trip to Chicago during Christmas is in full swing this week with the appointment of a paid solicitor.

He is C. E. Rodgers, chairman of the Parents Committee of the Band Patrons Association. He lives at 4315 SW 13th St. He has taken leave from his real estate and insurance business to run the financial campaign, he said.

He has a child in the band. Rodgers said it is an honor for the Gables band to be invited to the 16th annual Mid-West National Bank Clinic, to be held Dec. 19-22 in Chicago. He said only about a half dozen high school bands are invited each year and that it's been some years since a Florida

group participated.

Rodgers said the Presidents' Council and the Coral Gables Chamber of Commerce have endorsed the trip which will include 106 student band members under Director William Ledue plus a dozen adult chaperons. The band would play a concert Thursday evening, Dec. 20, before several thousand professional band directors and musicians.

There are 220 students taking band work at Gables High, Rodgers said, and their parents help them financially through the Band Patrons Association which annually disburses between \$7,000 and \$8,000.

This money is made on a variety of projects. The \$15,000 sought for Chicago would have to come from other sources.

Already, the students are busy selling candy to earn profits and other projects are in the offing, he said.

Rodgers said that while this comes to \$14,146 the desired goal is \$15,000.

He said his contract with the Band Patrons Association provides that he may be paid up to 10% of collections for his expenses.

Are parents of band members being asked for any money?

"We hope we won't have to ask them. However, we are pledged as an association to make up any deficit. The band's definitely going."

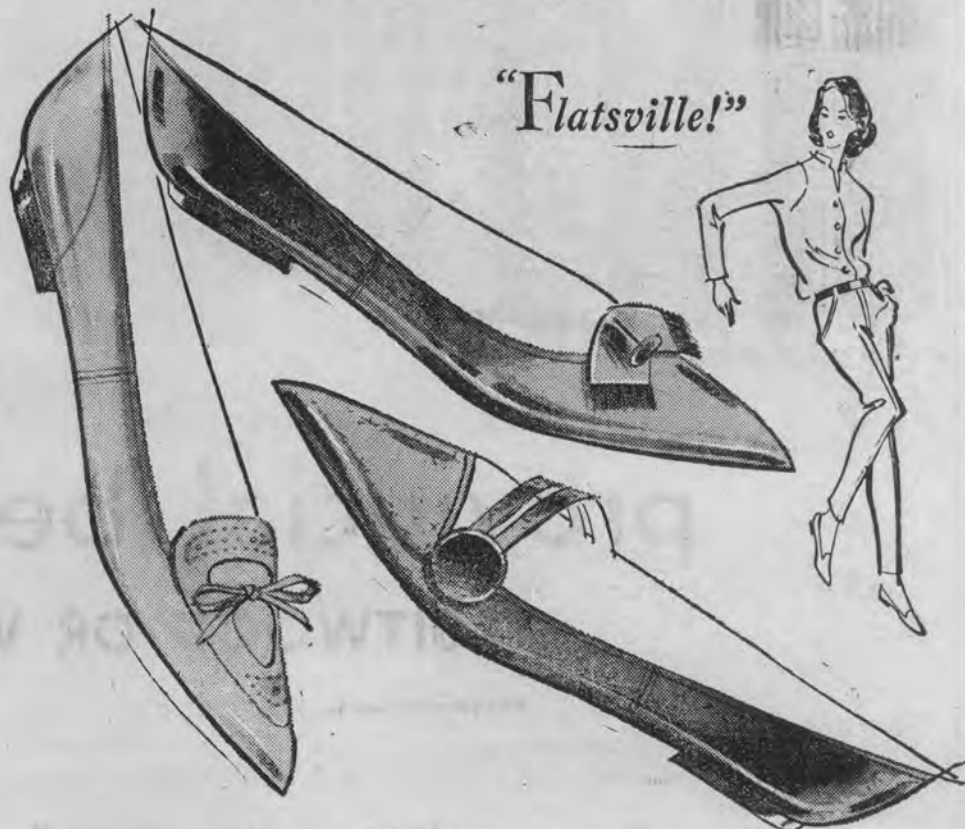

## Granada Work Lags Due to Rain etc.

Property owners and travelers along Granada Boulevard will have to curb their tempers a bit longer — construction is behind schedule at least two weeks.

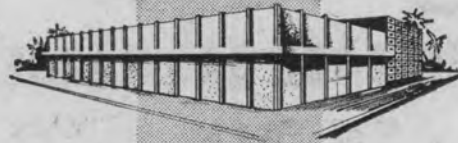

# COUNTY LINE

**BEAUTIFICATION** — It's often seen in the municipalities but seldom in the unincorporated areas. Both South Miami and Coral Gables recently have undergone extensive beautification programs, but the unincorporated areas must depend on garden clubs, Jaycees and sometimes Metro for its beautification.

**LATEST VENTURE** by Metro into the beautification realm is a try at having owners of overgrown lots do some trimming.

Most municipalities have laws requiring property owners to keep their lots clear of high grass and weeds or face the consequences. The consequences are that the municipality does the trimming and sends the property owner a bill.

**AN EFFORT** to get such a law on the Metro books was presented recently by District 1's Commissioner **Bob Brake** and **Joe Boyd**. In ordinance form, the bill passed unanimously on first reading.

Now it must weather a second reading and a public hearing.

**SURE, THE** property owners are going to fight it, particularly the lot owners who bought their property purely on a speculative basis. They care little for the looks of the property, only its worth and zoning status.

**ANOTHER METRO** crack at beautification is its belated efforts to limit the number of gas stations in the county.

An ordinance outlining such limits is being pushed by the Allied Gasoline Retailers Assn. which points out that Dade County is ripe for the development of commercial slums unless the promiscuous building of service stations is halted. (Meanwhile, another station is under construction on Bird Road.)

**ACCORDING TO** William Maurelis, field representative

of the Gasoline Retailers Assn., Dade County, with a population of over a million people, now has enough service stations to serve a population of 2,775,000 person. And Metro is still issuing permits for construction of more gas stations.

**MAURELIS** and others of the Gasoline Dealers Assn. want a zoning law passed prohibiting the construction of service stations closer than 1,100 feet to an existing service station, churches or schools. Most municipalities have similar existing laws already.

**IT TAKES** 1,500 people to support a gas station. We now have about 1,850 stations in the county.

Many corners which might accommodate some nice office buildings are cluttered with gas stations. These stations, in turn, discourage other business in close proximity. Metro is obliged to pass this ordi-

nance, even over the rants and ravings of oil company representatives.

# They Laughed as Andy Sat Down

Andy Elefante is marking off the days until he gets his high school diploma in two weeks.

Nothing unusual? Only that Elefante:

FINISHED the 8th grade in 1929.

IS the father of two sons.

WILL BE 50-years-old next month.

Elefante, sitting in one of two chairs in his shop, Andy's Barber Shop at 2501 SW 67th Ave., recalled 1929, the year he quit school:

"That's when the depression came in. I left school and tried to get a job to help out the family.

"And I just never went back.

I quit in the 8th grade and it worried me all the time."

So Elefante, son of an Italian glassblower who came to America in 1902, began in 1960 a four-year correspondence course with a school in Chicago.

He finished the course in two years. His average grade was 90. The barber's best grades were in psychology.

He proudly produced a letter from the American School, telling him he graduated and would receive his degree in two weeks.

Elefante and his wife, Lillian, live at 6831 SW 29th St. They have two sons, Tom, 21, a University of Miami student, and Robert, 16, who goes to

Southwest High.

Not finishing high school bothered Elefante. In any conversation, he said, he saw the difference between himself and his sons or any of his fellow civic club members and barbers.

So the man who has been state president of the Florida State Barbers Association for the last eight years enrolled in the school.

It meant getting up at 5 a.m. and doing homework because he couldn't sleep with the thought of a diploma in his mind.

It meant bringing sandwich-

es to his shop and eating them while he did his homework. There was no time to go next door to the drugstore.

It meant teen-agers coming in and laughing at him, a grown man not past high school. But Elefante said it turned out many young people had also quit school.

"Girls and boys, when they saw me studying over there," he said, pointed to his small desk in the corner, "they'd ask me what I was doing.

"And I told them I was studying for high school," he said proudly. "And they laughed at me and scoffed at me.

"And then," Elefante said, his face brightening up, "they said, 'Could I do that, too?'"

Outside, the noon traffic

## Manor Lane Threatens SM With Suit

City of South Miami was threatened with a suit Tuesday night of last week unless more is done to relieve residents on or near Manor Lane from what they indicated were loud, obnoxious and dangerous Metro Transit Authority buses.

Stuart Markus, an attorney, 7420 SW 63rd Ct., told Council if city zoning, building and traffic ordinances were not carried out, he would go to court to get residents on Manor Lane relief from a nuisance.

Markus and Don K. Campbell, 7530 SW 63rd Ave., were spokesmen for a group of residents living near a MTA garage on Manor Lane where buses were stored at night.

Campbell, apparently angry at the Council, told the city fathers that everyone in the entire neighborhood is awakened early every morning by the roar of the buses' motors being warmed up.

### IT'S A RACKET

"It's a hell of a racket," Campbell told the Council. "I wish you would come over some morning about dawn when those motors are being started. You wouldn't stand for it and we don't intend to either."

About 75 residents appeared before Council last month to complain of the buses. At that time the homeowners were told that there is little the city can do except enforce zoning building and traffic ordinances.

The people do not believe the city is doing everything it can for the residents. They maintain that the buses are a public nuisance and should not have been at that location in the first place.

In other action, Council: CHANGED its sign ordinance to allow for larger detached signs on larger pieces of property.

APPROVED the application of Daniel H. Guthery for a beer and wine license at 8530 South Dixie Hwy.

PASSED on third and final reading an ordinance determining who shall sign checks for the city.

# Narrow Houses Near Tropical Are Turned Down by Metro

A town house — the second to be proposed for the Southwest area in recent months — was turned down by the Metro Zoning Board last week after more than 200 persons objected.

Best Building Corp., which proposed the row-type construction near Tropical Race track on the west side of SW 82nd Avenue between SW 45th Street and SW 48th Street, may still appeal the decision to the Metro Commission.

The company had requested a change in zoning from RU-1 residential, and GU to RU-1 with variances to permit the row type housing.

This is a proposal similar to that recently approved for Tamiami Trail in the Town Park Subdivision. That plan went through without opposition and construction is scheduled there shortly.

But the story was different near Tropical Park.

Eighty-five angry persons turned up last week to oppose the plan there.

Among those leading the opposition were Mark Smith, 4500 SW 84th Ave. Robert Tucker, 8231 SW 45th St., Mrs. Mary Lally, 8435 SW 45th St., Mrs. Esther Georgi,

8335 SW 44th St., and Mrs. Aida Rodriguez, 8401 SW 43rd Ter.

Shortly after receiving courtesy notices, they mobilized their opposition, going about the neighborhood getting names for petitions.
