Picnic Nearly Killed 'Debby'

Little Debby Penney left the hospital yesterday and is happily playing at home today after nearly drowning at Matheson Hammock last Saturday.

The 2½-year-old is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Jack Penney of 8901 SW 117th Ave. She was discharged from South Miami Hospital Wednesday.

The family feels Debby may owe her life to a Metro policeman, Officer J. Ross, who gave her artificial respiration at Matheson Hammock and then accompanied her in the ambulance to the hospital.

Pneumonia developed as a complication but that was cured this week.

Debby and her family had gone to the beach for a picnic with a group of about 10 people. The child wandered away.

Her 12-year-old uncle, Junior Penney, next observed her floating in the water. There was panic as the child was pulled from the beach pool.

It all ended happily, however, and Debby's well and alive.

Every so often something truly noteworthy happens among people — and it gives you a new feeling of pride in your community and the type of people who live there.

Such an event has again taken place and it deserves our attention.

Beth David Congregation, a Conservative Jewish Synagogue on Coral Way, had discovered that many of their members had moved into the growing South Dade suburban area. In order to provide these suburbanite members with religious school facilities, the Beth David members decided that a branch should be located in South Dade.

When the Rev. Fred E. Stinson and the board of trustees of the Kendall Methodist Church, at 10431 S.W. 77th Ave., heard of Beth David's needs, they offered the use of the church facilities consisting of a separate building containing 12 classrooms.

"We are happy to be able to assist in furthering the religious education needs of our many Jewish neighbors and friends," the Methodist minister said.

Rabbi Norman Shapiro of

Beth David was equally gracious and considerate in accepting the aid of the Protestant minister.

So, in September the new Conservative Jewish religious school will be quartered at the site of a Methodist Church.

This isn't the first time things like this have happened. In the past years, such cooperation among Jewish, Protestant and Catholic organizations and churches has occurred with increasing frequency.

In North Dade only a few years back, a Jewish congregation and a Protestant congregation in a suburban area decided to share facilities until their groups were financially able to build their own buildings. There have been dozens of other similar exchanges of good will and interfaith cooperation.

But, every time you hear of things like this, it takes on new meaning. I have never cared much for the slogans and the placards which appear once each year to signify "Brotherhood Week", but when those slogans taken on the form of action among men, they really seem to count.

Bus Service Meets With No Response

Bus service to Matheson Hammock County Park on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays has so far met with a disappointing lack of response, officials say.

On July 8-9 the service was used by 191 passengers, but on July 15-16 this dropped to 179, on July 22-23 to 165, on July 29-30 to 154.

The new route opens up to pedestrians a wilderness area, with nature trails, a picnic grounds, salt water bathing beach on Biscayne Bay and a unique wading area. The bus fare is 20 cents, with free transfers from other lines.

Buses leave the Gables terminal every hour from 9:30 a.m. until 4:30 p.m., departing at half past the hour. The return trip from Matheson is on the hour between 10 a.m. and 5 p.m.

Coral Way Homes Offered Water; Meeting Is Friday

There will be a meeting tomorrow night (Friday) at 8 o'clock at Coral Way Methodist Church, 7900 Coral Way, for homeowners in Coral Way Home Sites at which representatives of Community Utilities Corporation will discuss in detail the plan for installation for water services in that area.

The Metropolitan and Dade County Water and Sewer Board extended a certificate to Community Utilities Corp., permitting them to serve the home sites—with the condition that at least 200 home owners sign up for the service within 60 days of the award, or by Sept. 10.

The board received bids from Consumer Water Company of Coral Gables and Community Utilities.

At a public hearing, the board's accountants related that the Community bid offered to supply the services at less

cost to the home owner.

Under the applied plan, Community will install lines to each residence at the cost of \$200 to the owner. This may be paid over a four year period at \$4.80 per month.

L. W. Johnson, a spokesman for Community, said, "Water to be supplied in Coral Way Home Sites area, as well as to all customers in the southwest area, is fully treated, city of Miami water of highest qualities and adequate pressures."

Coral Way Home Sites is not a newly developed area. It is bounded by Coral Way and 36th Street and by Palmetto Expressway and 82nd Avenue.

"Homeowners in this area are now getting water from wells. They have wanted city water for some time because the water from the wells is yellow and not well treated," a spokesman for Community said.

South Miami Council, already bitter against Metro and the county's Traffic and Engineering and Transportation Dept., became riled again

at a Council meeting last week because the county took one of the city's traffic lights.

City Manager C. B. Petry told Council that some workers for the county's Traffic Engineering and Transportation Department came into the city Tuesday afternoon, removed a traffic light at SW 64th Street and 59th Place and left the city before a police car could be called to the intersection to retrieve the light.

"But we'll get the light back or know the reason why," Petry told the Council.

Although Metro has taken over the city's traffic and transportation problems, the city nonetheless owns all its traffic lights which are listed on the city's books as fixed assets. Cost of the light is about \$600. The city, according to Mayor Paul U. Tevis, also has the authority to install traffic signals on city streets oth-

er than county-maintained streets through the city.

The location where the street light was removed was in the city's Negro section where many accidents occurred before the erection of a traffic light.

The city has had other arguments with the Metro Traffic Engineering and Transportation Department, mostly over the movement of traffic on South Dixie Highway.

Metro requested from the city and was promptly turned down on a proposal to take

all parking off South Dixie Highway through the city to allow for three lanes of traffic on South Dixie Highway.

In another instance, the county changed the times on a traffic signal at South Dixie Highway and 62nd Ave. to allow more time for South Dixie highway traffic and less time for 62nd Ave. traffic.

The city was not informed of the time changes and wrote Metro a strongly worded letter objecting to the changes.

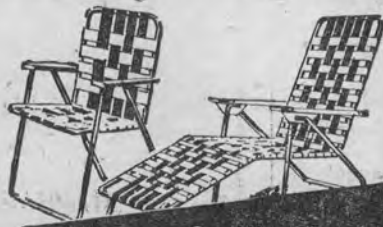

Orchids should not be left outside during a hurricane. Take them into the garage, workshop or some other sheltered place. If this is not possible, lay them on their side and cover them with wire such as screen, chicken wire or fish net. Fasten covering solidly to the ground. If you live near salt water and must leave your orchids outside, rinse them off as soon as possible after the storm and then allow them to dry for a few days, also rinse covering or shade trees. Never Too Old to Learn to Swim

A petite young woman in a bright red swim suit tossed her wet curls and declared, "you have to kick harder, HARDER!"

Her student spluttered and kicked harder.

The young woman is a member of the Venetian Mothers' Aquatic Club. She is a trained Red Cross swimming instructor and is one of 15 teachers donating their time to teach nearly 100 adults to swim.

"I took the lessons last summer and passed the test, too. But I'm doing it over again this summer because I enjoy it. It's a good way to relax after work," said Mrs. Inez Brown, 10300 SW 52nd Terr.

"And it gives me more confidence."

The Dryer family is learning to swim together. Mr. and Mrs. Morris F. Dryer and daughter Barbara, 18, have lived in Miami for three years, at 5912 SW 31st St. They endorse the program enthusiastically.

"I didn't believe they could do it in six lessons but now I do. Even I'm learning — and I could never even stay afloat," says Mr. Dryer.

Mrs. Jean Cooper, of 3014 Douglas Rd., was having her first lesson Thursday night. She was, with the aid of teacher Mrs. V. DeMarco, 231 San Malan, beginning in the shallow water at the side of the pool.

Other classes lined the wall of the pool, some hanging on the side until it was their turn to swim out to their teacher some 15 feet away.

It seemed strange to see a 115 pound teacher hold a 180 pound student afloat with one hand.

"Easy does it now," cautioned the teacher.

"Okay, boss," said her happy student, gasping from the exercise.

Mrs. Harriet Cason, supervisor, 7960 SW 36th St., explained that the sessions, sponsored by the Youth Center, are open to the public, free, except for a half-price admission of 25 cents to the pool. The instructors, all Red Cross trained, donate their time.

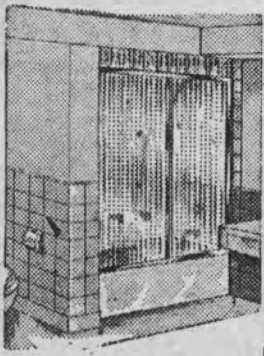

South Miami Roundup

MADEIRA BEACH, St. Petersburg — Time, that great judge of men, is tugging at both ends of our vacation this week here in this beautiful city jutting out like a thumb into Tampa Bay on Florida's west coast.

ON ONE HAND, time always travels faster on a vacation. It speeds by like the cool breeze drifting in from the Gulf of Mexico and onto the cool white sands. It races by like the out-of-state cars that passed us on the Tamiami Trail, that highway that connects Miami with the west coast.

BUT YET, in another way time has been good to us here. We have found that the people, the vacationers and permanent residents alike, have slowed down time. The pace is slower here. And the people are less easily aroused. We are following suit.

NOTHING IS MORE exciting than the early morning on the day one leaves on a trip. For us, it was about 6 a.m. With the station wagon loaded with suitcases, fishing equipment and hangers full of clothes, we backed out of the driveway, turned west toward the Everglades and we were on our way.

FROM MIAMI to Naples, the first city on the trip, is 110 miles of nothing but sawgrass, Palmettos and water. They call it the River of Grass. And they are right. It's a lonely drive. But a delightful one. There is little traffic.

THE SUN IS behind you and the Everglades birds swoop down in front of the car as if they were going to sail through the windshield. You test the car and find it is holding the road easily at 60 mph. And you are already beginning to relax.

TWO HOURS later we pulled into Naples, one of the prettiest and best-planned cities in the state. The townspeople are just beginning to stir. And almost half of our journey is over. We drove through Naples to the Gulf of Mexico, where the waves were rolling onto the beach.

WE THREW shells into the surf and then aimed the car up the west coast. The next city is Ft. Myers, a lazy kind of town where Thomas Edison had his winter home. This seems to be the big tourist attraction, aside from the millions of shells on Sanibel Island near there.

PUNTA GORDA is the next little town. It's called the home of the Silver Tarpon,

one of the fightingest fish in the state. Like all of these west coast cities, Punta Gorda has also grown. It now has several nice restaurants that abound with tourists. It's also near several huge retirement villages that beckon to the elderly.

VENICE COMES next followed by Sarasota, another of the most attractive cities in the state. This is the winter headquarters for Ringling Brothers-Barnum and Bailey circus and the year-round site of the Ringling Art Museum. It's nestled on Sarasota Bay opposite the Gulf Beaches that serve the area.

FROM SARASOTA through Bradenton and Palmetto there are almost continuous buildings where once there was wide expanses. It's difficult, except for the city limit signs to tell where one city stops and the other city begins.

FROM PALMETTO, the only means across Tampa Bay to St. Petersburg is the Sunshine State Skyway, a causeway-bridge that has made the St. Petersburg-Sarasota area nearly one continuous line of buildings.

PRIOR TO 10 years ago, the only way across Tampa Bay was by ferry boat, a quaint little operation that thrilled tourists whose only previous boat ride had been a rowboat outing in New York's Central Park.

TRAVELING ACROSS the Skyway, the view of the area

is breathtakingly beautiful. One can see from one end of the bay to the other, across the bay and far out into the Gulf. Cars travel up a steep incline to the top of the bridge and then speed down the other side, which is St. Petersburg.

HERE AT OUR cottage, the question most often asked of us by our neighbors is, "Why is a family from Miami on St. Petersburg Beach for a vacation?" The answer is simple and twofold. We wanted a change and there aren't many beaches left in Miami — at

least not with reasonable cottages and as wonderful a beach for rent for a week.

COMPARISONS with Miami — To show how less expensive living is here, haircuts at Webb's City are 65 cents all the time. King-size cigarettes are 23 cents a package — all the time . . . the streets are wider and traffic less congested . . . the west coast beach areas are having a big summer season.

MORE COMPARISONS — Most out-of-state license plates are from Ohio, Michi-

gan, Illinois, and the southern states . . . In Miami, most out-of-state cars are from the east coast states, mainly New York . . . cafeterias get as much or more of the eating business here as do restaurants . . . the Miami newspa-

pers are better than the St. Petersburg papers . . . On the beaches here, the accent is on cottages and small motels . . . There may be a lot of elderly people in St. Petersburg, but there are few on the beach.

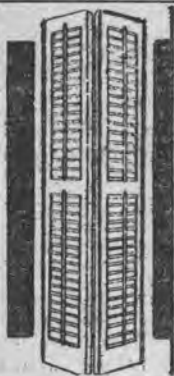
