# Move to Control Deviation Picks Up Important Support

The need for more action and legislation on the growing problem of homosexuality and pornographic literature received support Monday from Sen. George Hollahan, State Attorney Richard Gerstein and Robert Haverfield, former Metro Commission chairman and candidate for the State Legislature.

Earl Faircloth, who is destined to take over as Attorney General from James W. Kynes, was reportedly out of town and could not be reached for comment.

"I do think we need new legislation to deal with the problem," said Gerstein. "I don't think it (the problem) has been exaggerated."

Gerstein said he has written to obtain information from a recently completed study of the New York Academy of Medicine on Homosex-

uality to base any future recommendations on.

"I would hesitate to say what I would do until I see what Mr. Gerstein's office comes up with," said Hollahan.

The veteran legislator saw increased distribution of pornographic and homosexual literature as largely responsible for the growth of the problem.

The pseudo-body building magazines were cited by Hollahan as examples of what he was talking about.

"This is something we are definitely going to do something about," said Hollahan.

Florida, he said, has depended on movie censors in the State of New York to screen films shown here, but he indicated that this is in for a reappraisal.

"We're going to take a strong look at that too," said

The first public meeting of the newly created Citizens Committee to Inform Floridians on the Problem of Homosexuality and Indecent Literature has been set for June 5.

Dade Federal Savings & Loan Association, South Dixie Highway and SW 104th St. will be the meeting place at 7:30 p.m., according to Mrs. Chris Proctor, 13001 SW 77th Ave., at whose home the May 20 organizational meeting was held.

That meeting got off to a spectacular start when an anonymous caller phoned Mrs. Proctor just before the meeting to warn her that her home would be bombed.

"You'd better get off it or

your home will be bombed," Mrs. Proctor quoted him as saying. The caller sounded

## Long Loses Fight on Water Bills

South Miami water users will continue paying \$1.50 a month minimum rates because of a

recent ruling by the Florida Supreme Court.

The city lost a six-year

battle to have the water bills lowered to \$1.40 for its 3,000 water consumers.

The 20,000 Coral Gables water users pay \$1.50 minimum while 12,000 unincorporated pay \$1.80 for the same water out of the same pipes.

"Thirty cents a month may sound small but that amounts to \$40,000 yearly," pointed out Hughlan Long, attorney for South Miami during the long struggle. "People who live across the street from South Miami land are paying larger bills for the same service."

"And to top it off Metro is contemplating a plan for Consumers to set its own rates Countywide."

The District Court of Appeals still hasn't ruled up on who should pay the \$90,000 court costs accrued by Consumers.

Meanwhile South Miami will select an attorney for further negotiations into the possibility of the city purchasing Consumers.

## Planners Sidetrack Tollway

A move to change the proposed route of the South Dade Tollway so that it passes closer to Dixie Highway in the South Miami area will be made "in the near future" said Charles Crumpton, Metro's chief of project planning.

According to the Wilbur Smith plan — presently under consideration — the toll road swings away from Dixie Highway to bypass the business district between Red

Road and the Palmetto Expressway.

Crumpton's change would bring the highway closer to the business district and more in line with Metro's Master Land Use Plan.

"The Wilbur Smith plan has it cutting through a residential area," explained Crumpton.

"I can't say how we'll go about it. We'll have to play it by ear," he said.

Another change would continue the tollway parallel to the Seaboard tracks to connect with a future 117th Avenue expressway instead of turning south between S.W. 97th and 102nd Avenues.

"The Wilbur Smith plan doesn't even take into consideration the 117th Avenue expressway," said Crumpton.

At the present time, official action on the tollway is largely

# Those Birdies Get the Point



Cal Jureit and His Bed of Nails  
... helps banish roosting birds

Two South Dade businessmen have yanked the welcome mat from under Florida's pole-roosting birds, and slipped a bed of nails under man's feathered friends.

A foul gesture?

Perhaps the birds think so, but not humans who'll benefit.

The bed of nails invented and manufactured by Calvin and William Jureit is being mounted atop Florida Power and Light poles to keep birds from roosting, and ultimately causing damage.

Cal Jureit, of 7560 SW 78th Ct., said 5,000 of the 5-by-20-inch nail-studded galvanized steel plates have been delivered to FP&L for installation on wooden cross arms of utility poles in South Florida.

"Birds have a way of causing short-circuits," Cal said.

"This not only causes expensive damage and repairs, but a lot of inconvenience to people

who suddenly don't have power."

FP&L's use of the nail planks is almost accidental.

Actually, the bird banishers were designed primarily for holding together wood trusses used in building construction.

William Jureit, of 8920 SW 118th St., mentioned the device to a friend at FP&L and suggested they might be used to keep utility pole cross arms from splitting.

"But they told my brother a better use would be to install the nail plans upside down to discourage birds," Cal said.

The brothers' firm, Automated Building Components, also has supplied the Coast Guard with 25 of the gangnail planks for installation on channel markers which are severely damaged by roosting birds.

"The office joke these days is that we open a branch in India to sell to Indian fakirs who sleep on nails," Cal said.

at a standstill. "Right now there's not much really doing," said Crumpton. "We're waiting for results from the comprehensive transportation study."

The study is a statewide survey of all forms of transportation and is being conducted with the State Road Department and the federal Public Works Administration.

Although the entire study won't be complete for about a year and a half, preliminary results are expected to be ready in a few months.

If official action is slow, action by private citizens is moving right along.

An informal citizens group headed by Frank Poe, Mrs. Lorraine Prince, and Mrs. Arthur Sekoff will meet next week to select a name for the group and further solidify its opposition to the tollway.

For several weeks the group has had the blessing of Coral Gables Chamber of Commerce's Retail Merchants Division, Gables City Commission, South Miami Council and Coconut Grove Chamber.

Hollahan, pointing out that the movie industry has strong lobbies in the legislature.

Hollahan also blamed parental laxity, and lack of supervision for growth of homosexuality.

Both Hollahan and Gerstein pointed out that decisions of the U.S. Supreme Court have made enforcement of laws on pornography except for hard core materials, more difficult to deal with. The current law, said Hollahan, is based on recent Supreme Court decisions.

The test of obscenity has been reduced thusly:

"Whether to the average person, applying contemporary community standards, the dominant theme of the material taken as a whole ap-

peals to prurient interest ..."

Under the law, the Circuit Court may enjoin a violation on a complaint filed by the state attorney and issue a restraining order before the matter is decided by a jury.

Quick justice is assured by providing for a trial within one day after the violation is affirmed and decision within two days of the end of the trial.

"Pleasure Was My Business," and "Tropic of Cancer," were banned in Dade County using this procedure.

Gerstein said that the problem of homosexuality in Dade is great as it is in any resort area.

The state attorney, who has attacked the Florida Legislative Investigating Committee for its treatment of the problem in the so-called "Purple Pamphlet," said he favors a different approach.

Haverfield saw the problem as one that should be handled by a committee of professional people.

He backed the approach of setting up the Homosexual Practices Control Advisory Pa-

nel — a group of persons from all walks of life — to tackle the problem and come up with recommendations to the Florida Legislature.

"This is something of concern to every parent," said Haverfield.

"I would support a well-planned program that would correct the situation ...," said Haverfield, who saw the solution in providing wholesome recreation to youth, getting them to think in more constructive channels, informing the public and having a coordinated effort by all levels of government.

James Duane Barker, assistant to the personnel director of the Broward School Board and member of the recently created

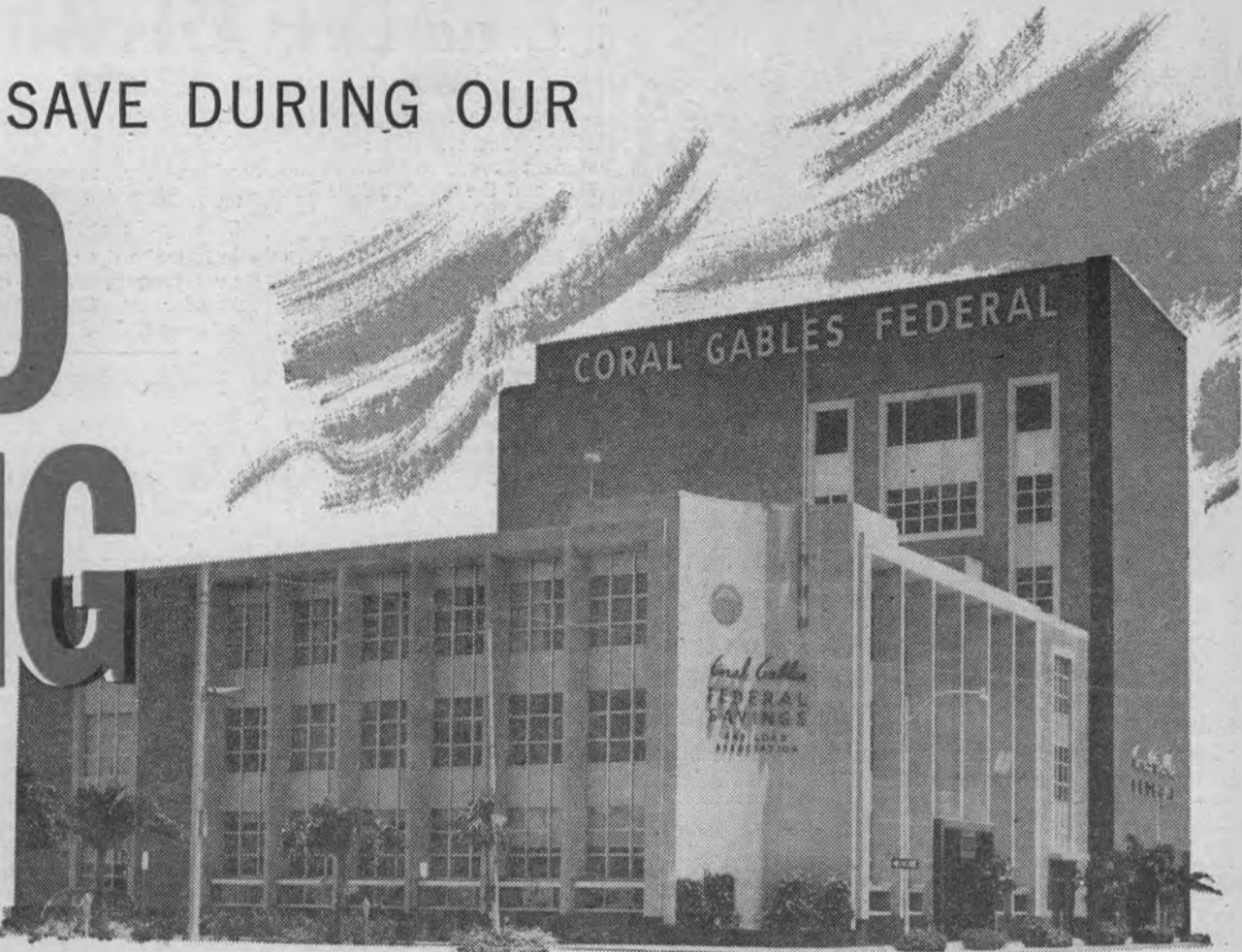
Homosexual Practices Control Advisory Panel, will address the group.

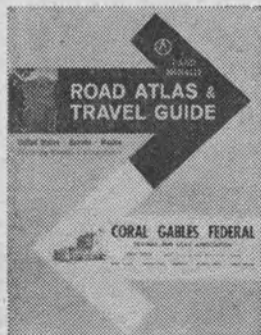

# Aero Airport Dispute Tabled by Metro

The Metro Zoning Appeals Board deferred until June 17 the controversial revocation of a permit for operating the Aero Country Club airport, between SW 70th and 75th Avenues and between SW 108th and 110th Streets.

Alleged permit violations include unauthorized night flying and failure to employ a night watchman.

In other actions, the board approved the application of Farm Stores Inc. at SW 87th Ave. and SW 9th Terrace for a variance of cubic content requirements, use variance for an access drive and parking space and erection of a 76.25 square foot detached sign.

Denied was a variance to permit the sign seven feet instead of the required 10½ feet from the front of the property line.

**APPROVED** James Heiman's request for variance of parking requirements to eliminate required back-out area between tiers of parking to permit attendant parking in double rows without a back-out area in a portion of Bird Road at 6521 SW 40th St. Denied was a request for 37 instead of 71 off-street parking spaces for the existing restaurant.

# Act Your Sex, Save Your Child Says Report on Homosexuals

NEW YORK — The influential New York Academy of Medicine urged the nation's physicians to state clearly that homosexuality is an illness, and in some cases can be cured.

The academy called on other medical groups to promptly correct the "common misconception" that homosexuality cannot be successfully treated. "Although treatment is difficult and prognosis is guarded," the committee said, "it can be successful and of value."

ed by a growing aggressiveness on the part of homosexuals in trying to promote their way of life, an increase in salacious literature and a rising venereal disease rate in New York City.

ty, may only be a small proportion of the total homosexual population," the committee reported. It said that by the very nature of the condition, data are often inaccurate and misleading. "It is exceedingly difficult to take a census . . . as many go their unobtrusive way and would be missed in the count," the medical group explained.

Society is "uncertain and confused" about what its attitude toward homosexuality is, the academy's committee on public health stated in a nine-page special report.

"The earlier the treatment is started and the less intense the condition, the more successful the treatment," the medical group added.

A spokesman for the Mat-tachine Society indicated there wouldn't be any immediate formal commitment on the report, but he said, "we don't believe the idea that homosexuals can be cured."

The physicians warned, however, that homosexuality appears to be more open and obtrusive. It said the condition is more prevalent in literature and the theater. Many homosexuals, would have it believed theirs is a noble way of life, the committee said.

"Homosexuality is indeed an illness, the contrary conviction and protestations of the confirmed homosexual notwithstanding," the report declared. "In a strict sense it is a symptom of illness."

A spokesman for the academy said it was believed the committee's report was the first public stand by a major medical group on the problem. Committee members said their report had been promptly

The society describes itself as an organization of homosexuals and others. It has a library, bail bond service and monthly lectures and has contributed to research projects on homosexuality. A spokesman said the group has about 300 members.

"This is a fallacious argument that is contrary to fact," it added.

The academy began work on the pioneering study in December. It was decided first to state clearly the medical nature of the condition. "We wanted to set the matter straight," a spokesman said. "As time goes on, we may come up with additional thoughts on what might be done."

"The homosexual is an emotionally immature individual who has not acquired a normal capacity to develop satisfying heterosexual relationships," the academy said. It added that the condition may be an expression of fear of the opposite sex or an inability to accept adult responsibility.

Homosexuality is regarded as sinful by major religious groups. Under certain circumstances it is against the law in New York.

The family is believed to exert the most influence on homosexual development, the medical group said. It added that homosexuality is "frequently associated with a fatherless home or its equivalent, as an absent or neglectful father, or a dominant mother with a weak, ineffectual mate."

The number of homosexuals, however, remains unknown. "The aggressive homosexual, so familiar to socie-

The report stressed that although treatment may be difficult, it can be successful and valuable. To support its position the academy cited a nine-year study by Dr. Irving Bieber, a New York physician. That study, published in 1962, showed a 27% rate of cure among 106 homosexuals treated.

Dr. Bieber, in an interview, said the patients had been treated by psychoanalysis for periods of two to five years. He said treatments had been taken two to three times a week, with other visits to a physician in some cases. "Barring the flagrantly effeminate homosexual who presents himself, one can't say categorically that patients can't be successfully treated," Dr. Bieber said.

He explained that the majority of patients had wanted their homosexuality concealed. Those who stayed in treatment longer had the best results, the physician added.

The academy stressed that treatment should take place as soon as possible — at least in early adolescence. It said that as preventive medicine there is widespread need for "proper and authoritative sex education."

Although a countywide clamor for automatic warning signals at railroad crossings is being satisfied, the unwary mo-

torist has only a hazy assurance that these bells, lights and gates function properly.

Who inspects the signals to insure that they are working

properly to warn about the approach of an oncoming train?

Metro doesn't.

The signal departments of Seaboard Airlines Railroad and Florida East Coast are located in Jacksonville and St. Augustine, respectively. No local officials had any information concerning the frequency of inspection.

The Interstate Commerce Commission has made two investigations on the FEC to determine the degree of compliance with the Signal Inspection Law.

The ICC stated that in all except one instance the crossing signals were operating properly and the devices were adequately maintained to insure that they would perform their intended functions.

Meanwhile a FEC train engineer was found innocent of negligence Monday in a Colonial Drive rail crossing accident which killed three teenagers.

The County is now installing stop signs at some 58 unguarded Seaboard Airlines Railroad crossings while FEC is ordering signs for 104 of its intersections.

The Commissioners, June 2 will discuss a resolution to conduct a selective enforcement program with regard to vehicles stopping at the crossings marked with stop signs.

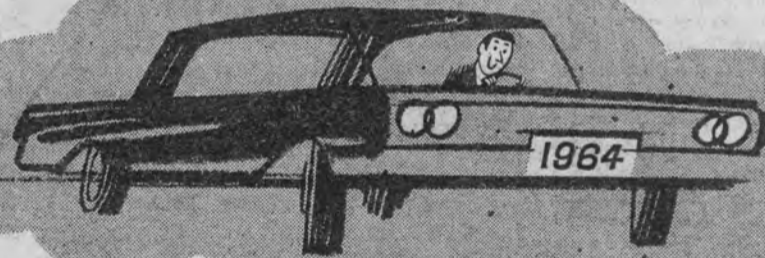

# FP&L Eyes Homestead Plant Site

More electricity for Dade County is the aim of Florida Power and Light Co., which hopes to build a new fuel burning plant at Turkey Point, off Homestead, and add one 425,000 kilowatt natural gas unit at its Cutler plant.

These new expansion plans came on the heels of a company announcement that it could not guarantee the availability of natural gas to accept a permit for two units at Cutler.

Officials sent a letter to County Commissioners advising them of an option to buy the land if it be zoned for industrial usage.

"When we're certain that gas is available, we'll reapply for a permit at Cutler," a company spokesman reported.

The three-square mile Turkey Point site is 9 1/2 miles east of South Dixie Highway and 2 1/2 miles south from Homestead Bayfront Park.

The new site is far from any residences compared to the Cutler site surrounded by luxury homes. The Southwest and Cutler Residents Association was formed to fight expanding the Cutler plant.

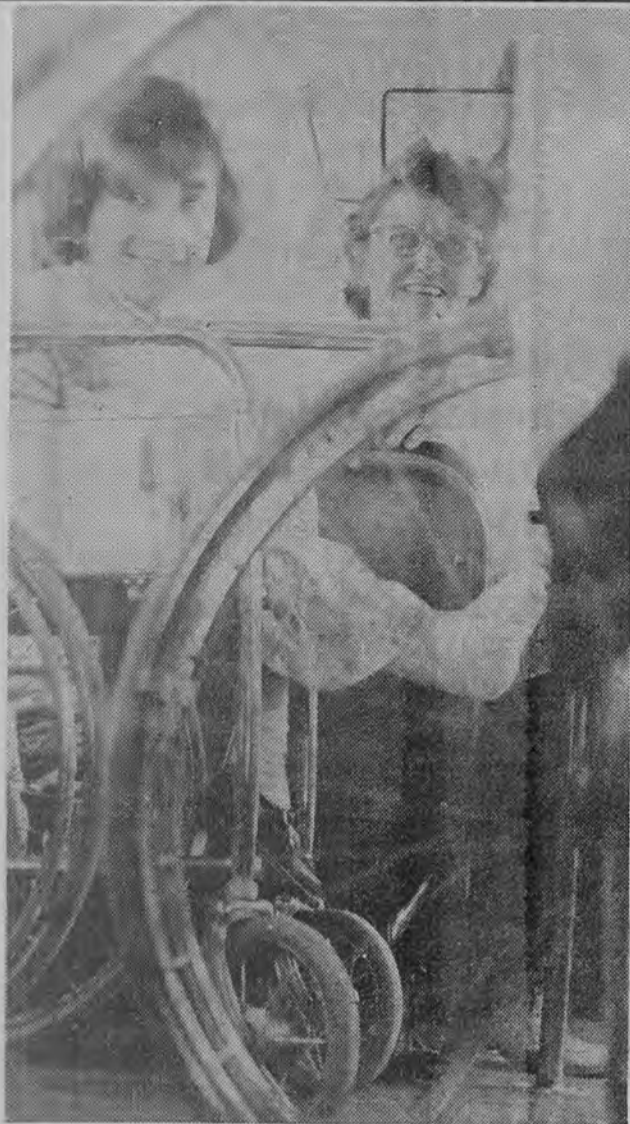

# Riding This Bus Takes Big Heart

If you want to ride Rose Helseth's bus, bring along a big heart ... a strong back ... and eyes that don't easily spring tears.

That's because Mrs. Helseth drives a bus — a very special bus — that carries handicapped children to classes at three Dade County Schools.

Mrs. Helseth travels 68 miles a day bringing 17 children with braces or in wheel chairs to and from their South Dade homes.

This mother of two-grown sons is in her tenth year as a bus driver for the Dade County schools, five of which she has spent with handicapped children.

"These special children with various handicaps bring a lot of joy into their lives and mine," said Mrs. Helseth. "There just isn't one without a smile. I know them all and feel closer to them than I did to the non-handicapped students."

The lady bus driver's part-time job starts at 6:30 a.m. when she leaves her home at 8425 SW 116th St. In her school bus with the special hydraulic life she drives to the homes of all 17 children.

First school stop is made at 8:10 a.m. at Southwest High 8855 SW 50th Ter., where her riders attend classes with normal children as well as with each other.

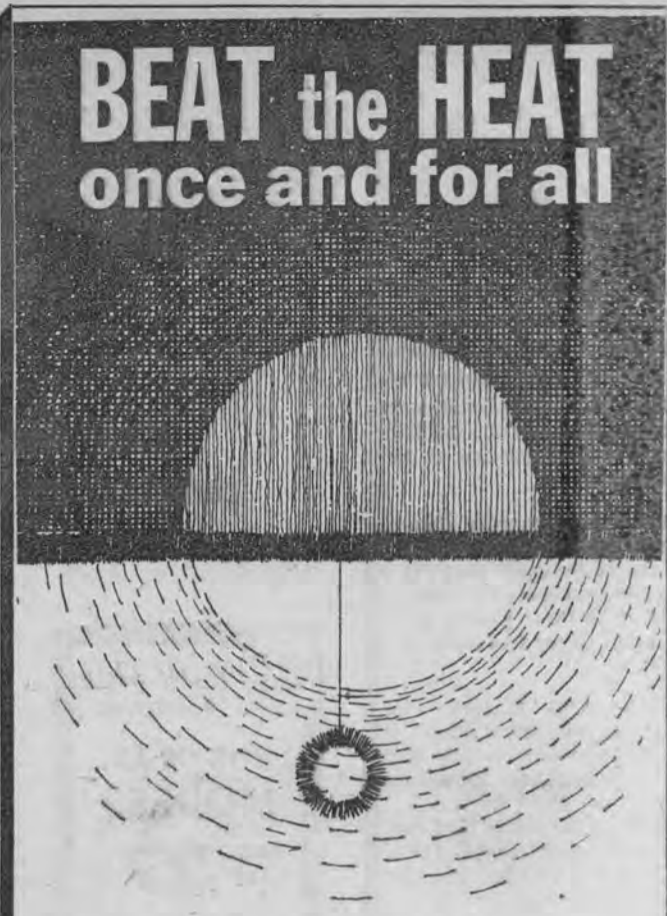
At 8:25 the Helseth bus arrives at Tropical Elementary School, 4545 SW 104th Ave., and Riviera Junior High, 10301 SW 48th St.

The rounds begin again at 2:45 p.m. when the children, ranging in age from 7-16, are picked up at the three schools. The last one arrives home at 5:10 p.m.

"I like children and I like to drive, I'm proud of this job," explains Mrs. Helseth, "and the job leaves plenty of time to spend at home."

The driver attends occasional group meetings of county bus drivers and monthly safety sessions. "We're all friends and compare notes," she added.

"My passengers are just like all the other children. They talk and act the same. But what I appreciate the most is the high regard they have for each other."

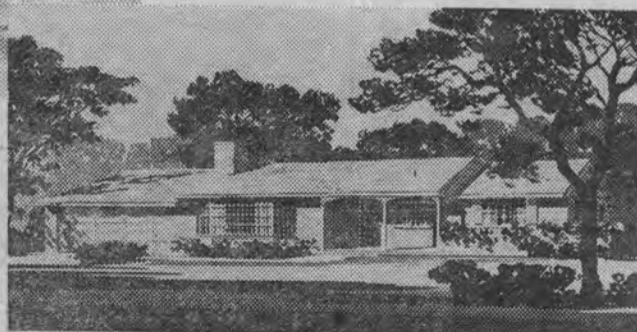

# You May Have a Nice House to Sell, But...

What should you DO? What should you NOT DO, if you want to sell your house in a hurry?

If yours is one of the hundreds of families subject to transfer after a residence of from three to five years in Miami, then you might be faced with this highly competitive challenge of selling your home before the moving truck arrives.

Whether your house is in the high price bracket, medium, or low, the same rules of thumb apply. Realtors often say "a house sells itself."

★ ★ ★

**GENERAL NEATNESS:**

Did you ever notice the exquisite colored photographs in House Beautiful? Or House and Garden? The pantry door is ajar, and what is inside? Four plates, four cups, four goblets. No more. That makes a lovely picture. Impractical, of course. But, as far as practical, take the tip. Remove as much clutter as possible.

Linen neatly arranged in stacks speak of good housekeeping, and will often tell a Buyer that you have been equally diligent in seeing that cracks were patched when they occurred, mildew treated immediately, termites obliterated with the first sign of their appearance.

Untidy housekeeping is often so bad that a purchaser recoils and won't consider for a moment a house that, if more ship shape, would ap-

peal to him. Dishes in the sink. Beds unmade. Dirty windows, bathrooms, floors.

Buyer should be controlled. The more attractive the children, the more out of the way they should be.

When a buyer starts talking to the youngsters his attention is diverted and he'll miss half of the good features that should be pointed out to

him. Watch this, it might cost you a sale.

This same rule applies to beautiful furniture (particularly antiques) and lovely flower arrangements. Play down your private possessions. Don't dramatize them.

**TRAFFIC PATTERN:** Study your house and call attention to its convenience of plan. The door from the front hall to the kitchen, for instance, if left ajar, will visually illustrate to a Buyer this convenience of access. Bathroom doors, left open-

show at a glance their location in relation to the various bedrooms.

A powder room door should be left open to call attention to its existence. An inside door to a garage, though usually closed, might well be left

ajar while a Buyer is considering the floor plan as a whole.

Is your house on the market today? It will probably be one of twenty or so a buyer will consider. Are you giving it a chance to sell itself?

## Home Building Rising

Spending for construction of new private nonfarm residential buildings in April amounted to \$2.2 billion, 17 per cent more than in March and 10 per cent above April, 1963, reports the U.S. Census Bureau at Washington, D.C.

On a seasonally adjusted annual rate basis, expenditures in March and April, 1964, were virtually the same.

Total new private construction expenditures amounted to \$3.7 billion in April, 10 per cent above the levels in both March

and April, 1963.

The value of total new construction put in place in April was \$5.2 billion, the Census Bureau said, 11 per cent above the estimate for March, and 12 per cent above the April, 1963, level.

# Realtors Like Mayor's High-Rise Plan

Mayor Joe Murphy's plan to rezone the Douglas area of the Gables to permit a controlled high-rise apartment park is meeting with "very favorable reaction," the mayor said this week.

"I made the proposal (before the North Ponce Development Association) so we could find out people's reactions. If, after study, we decide it would be good for the city, we'll ask the city commission to rezone the area," said Murphy.

The plan would enable builders to put up high-rise apartment buildings in the area south of the Trail and between Douglas and Le Jeune Roads, south to duplex-zoned areas.

"This area needs development," said Murphy, "and what better way than by allowing private enterprise to build — with the stipulation that they provide plenty of open space and off-street parking."

An ordinance defining just how much open space is needed for specific height limits is currently being drawn up by the Coral Gables Association of Architects.

"We want to be sure there

is plenty of green planting around the buildings in order to get away from any asphalt jungle look," said Curtis Haley, the association's president.

The proposed ordinance will be submitted to the city commission in about three months, said Haley.

Frank Kerdyk, president of the Coral Gables Board of Real-

tors, agreed that with the proper controls, high-rise construction would not detract from the city's beauty.

"This is the coming thing and it is time Coral Gables grew up

and stretched its wings a little," said Kerdyk.

"Unquestionably it would be good from the economic standpoint," he added.

Murphy said he is proposing the idea in order to eliminate the "red tape and mish-mash" that builders must go through to get approval for high-rise buildings.

"By allowing it in a specific area they can't say we're against the concept," he said. "We want people to want to live in the park."

## Tax Would Hurt Building?

The city's proposed flat 10+ utility tax on large buildings and apartment houses apparently is developing opposition from owners of such income property.

Several chamber of commerce officials, who said the proposal should be tabled, said such a tax would discourage construction of large buildings.

"We're on the brink of trying to encourage developers to build new and large

buildings in Coral Gables and this kind of tax would be harmful," a chamber official said.

## Ideas For Improving Designs

Apartment buildings that are squeezed into a lot with a shoe-horn, and awkward homes that add no quality to a community are quietly being negotiated "out of site" by an interesting innovation by Biscayne Federal Savings and Loan Association whose success is hailed not only by architects, but by commercial investors all over the country.

The story opened three years ago when E. Albert Pallot, Biscayne's president, pioneered an architectural advisory board consisting of five top area architects whose function was to give professional verdicts on the merits of building designs submitted for loan applications.

They are paid a monthly retainer, their professional services come free of cost to the builder and homeowner applicants. The architects make changes, revisions, recommendations. The result has become so unique a marriage of the practical and the creative that national magazines have picked up the idea as a new direction for civic and property enhancement, and easily adopted by the more than 5,000 savings and loan associations in the United States.

Not the least important is the enthusiasm of the architects themselves who have welcomed "the opportunity to express with commercial people," as one architect put it. All five were interviewed this week to give a professional verdict on their own merits in elevating, changing or removing some designs and standards they always deplored.

The hand-picked five on the Architectural Advisory Board, all Fellows of American Institute of Architects, are Herbert H. Johnson who succeeded the late Robert Law Weed, Robert M. Little, Russell Pancoast, Igor Polevitzky and Robert Fitch Smith.

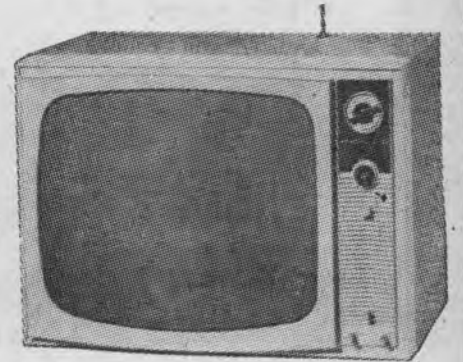

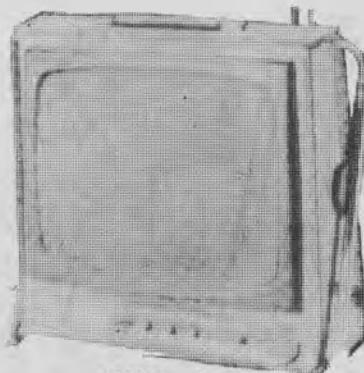

Mrs. Weintraub represented the South, and the other women represented the North, West, and Mid-West. They formed a consultation board on how women's groups could take part in the Salk Institute (named for the discoverer of the anti-polio serum).

"What makes the Institute unique," she said, "is that all the scientists live under one roof. They have separate laboratories though. The scientists are divided into 'Dry' and 'Wet.'"

She explained that Dry meant paper work, and Wet was laboratory experiments. In the capacity of advisor,

Mrs. Weintraub and the other women tell the Institute how women's groups can best inform, educate and solicit funds for the research work. The women were selected for their past experience in women's activities. The planning is on a national scale.

There is a pilot group already started in LaJolla. This group will experiment and determine which approaches are successful.

The Institute will study the causes and cures of cancer, birth defects, arthritis, and other biological maladies. The "Dry" scientists will try to find ways of making the aged comfortable.

## It Started In a Radio Station Bathroom...

Alan Courtney walks alone. This Gableite's sandpapery voice is known to thousands of Greater Miamians who cluster around their radios each night at 11 p.m. for three hours of what is perhaps one of America's most controversial shows.

Courtney, who asked that his home address not be given, had paid a heavy price for his show — now in its 15th year.

He has: **FOUND** a fake bomb in his driveway.

**ALMOST** been kidnaped along with his wife, Bernice, by two Castro agents — who grabbed the wrong man — after Courtney blasted the Cuban leader.

**SLAMMED** into differences of opinion with old friends and has come close to losing them.

"I think it's worth it, despite all the heartaches and headaches," said Courtney, garbed in sports clothes as he relaxed in his plush living room.

"Over the years, I have made some close, personal friends and we find ourselves on opposite

sides on a particular issue.

"And they'll call me," Courtney continued, lighting up a cigarette, "and say 'Al, why in the world did you say that?'"

"But," Courtney said, shrugging his shoulder, "I must walk alone."

Nevertheless, radio — in an era of television's greatness — has been good to Courtney.

His show first hit the air waves in Miami when he joined WGBS in 1949 and moved seven years later to WQAM, where he is now.

And it all began for the 51-year-old father of two grown sons when he was a green, 16-year-old lad visiting a New York radio station — and an announcer took too long in the Men's Room during a show.

Courtney, "and he introduced me to the announcer."

"And," Courtney said with a slight chuckle, "he came up to me and said 'Listen, I have to go to the Men's Room and if I'm not back in time, introduce the next number.'"

An orchestra was playing a musical tune at the time. "He went into the Men's Room and he didn't come out!" Courtney went on.

"And a little guy in the booth started screaming for somebody to do something (when the number ended) so I got up — scared to death — and started to say something and I introduced the next number."

The station's owner was listening, liked Courtney's moxy, and gave him a job at \$12 a week.

"I did a little bit of everything... a little announcing... singing... comedy. I even swept the floors. Played records... gabbed... and did the news," Courtney reminisced.

At 21, he became the youngest radio station manager at the time when he took over the helm of Station WOV in New York.

During the late 30's, the indomitable Courtney did

the "Gloom Chasers," a variety show that reached 400 stations coast-to-coast on the Mutual network. His announcer was Henry Morgan, now a panelist on TV's "I've Got A Secret."

As for his present show — which Courtney wants to measure the pulse beat of public opinion — he said:

"I have a very deep feeling that if we are going to keep alive the channels of communication, we must give people a

chance to express themselves. "I feel," he said, "that this is the nearest thing to a 'Town Hall' which made our country great."

"I'm not a crusader in that I feel I'm going to change the world," explained Courtney, "but we all have a role to play."

"We have to have people in the community — call them a gadfly or an irritant — who make a contribution."

## Studio M Owner Gets Break

Studio M's new owner — 33-year-old, Cuban-born Eric Santamaria — thought his golden moment had come when he bought the little theater on Bird Road from Ruth Foreman. He was wrong!

The bachelor's really "big break" came when he stumbled down a flight of stairs in the theater . . . tore a couple of ligaments in an ankle . . . and sprained his back.

Now, with his first play, "Gigi," in production, Santamaria's hobbling around on a cane.

"Gigi," which will run for two weeks, stars Carolyn Wohl, who won acclaim for her portrayal of Joan in "Joan of Arc," a recent offering at Studio M.

Adversity? Santamaria laughs it off. Just as he does when anyone asks him how he expects to be successful when former owner Ruth Foreman found only "disappointment."

"In a way, I was lucky," Santamaria said, leaning on his cane in the semi-darkness of his theatre. "I was all alone and I was running up the stairs to the lighting booth to check the lights when I fell.

"I could have broken my neck," he chuckled, "and laid there 'til the next day without anybody finding me.

"But yesterday, I was walking around with a crutch. Today," he beamed, "a cane."

As for buying Studio M — at a price he does not want to reveal — he knows he jumped in feet first.

Why? What of the risk? "When I started my own theatre in Havana, there was no playhouse there. That," said Santamaria, "was about 12 years ago.

"When I started, it was worse there than it is here.

"People with experience said to me it was impossible. But I said 'No! I want to try it.'"

Try it, he did. He had nothing but success, with some plays running for 150 to 200 performances. Six years later, a dozen producers had opened other theatres in Havana, Santamaria said.

"I am a hard worker," said Santamaria, "and I believe that people like theater. I have faith in the theatre — and in the people.

"I think," Santamaria said, not searching for words because he was sure of his beliefs, "if you give people what they want then they will come.

"If I had listened to people in Havana who told me 'No,' then I would have nothing today.

"And," he added, "the theatre is my life."

Santamaria joined Miss Foreman while she still owned Studio M about six months ago. He worked as her assistant director.

When Miss Foreman decided to sell, Santamaria—who came here four years ago — said several people had faith in him and lent him money to buy her out.

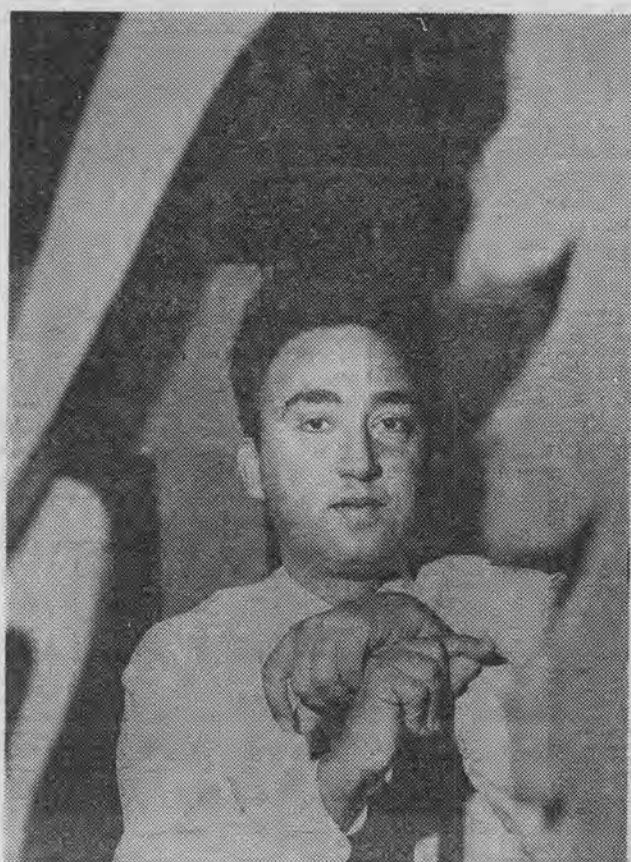

## Good Show Suffers From Weak Voices
