

What Metro Needs Is a Divining Rod

Let a man sell whisky that has been watered down or on which the due tax has not neen paid and State and Federal agents will pounce upon him and cause him to be thrown in jail.

But the same man may drink water contaminated with human and animal waste, allow others to drink it, contract a communicable disease, spread it to others, and no worse can happen to him than to be quarantined.

There is no law in the State of Florida to seal a private well and prevent its use for drinking until such time as it can be made safe again.

Who in his right mind would drink water that is not safe?

If Metro officials are to be believed, we have several families in the Southwest Dade area that have been doing so for the past eight months.

The ideal solution to this problem, of course, is for everyone to obtain, immediately, a safe source of water by hooking into a "city supply."

From a practical and economical standpoint, this is not always feasible. If a high hookup cost presents a problem to the School Board or an industrial plant — what of the poor guy who builds a house in the boondocks thou-

sands of feet from the nearest supply?

Officials say that home filtering and chlorinating plants cannot be trusted and none will remove chemical detergents.

Some way must be found then to force the owners of contaminated wells to obtain bottled or treated water for drinking and household purposes so that the populace will be protected from possible epidemics.

Metro has the power under Home Rule to enact the necessary legislation.

The move to set up a water district in the affected area is also a constructive one.

Metro should also require builders to lay water and sewer lines in subdivisions as is done by many municipalities.

This should be done whether treated water or sewage collection is immediately available.

The time will come when most of Dade will be truly the metropolitan area some zealots already believe. Now is the time to lay the groundwork for it.

That is, unless we want to go on tearing up roads and side walks periodically, and endlessly adding to costs and creating a general mess.

Child Ruined? Man Tell Me About That 7-11 Robber

Despite mounting evidence to the contrary, there are those who cling to the myth that homosexuality presents no problem of any great consequence to society.

If this were the only publication you read, you might get that impression, since the arrest, prosecution and conviction of deviates involved with children consistently fails to make news.

Ironically, the only public body that ever sought to



bring the problem to light has been soundly castigated and this not only made news but has been the subject of a series of editorials demanding its abolishment.

In the light of this, the actions of Criminal Court Judge Gene Williams last week in imposing the heaviest sentence ever on a convicted perverter of children is something to marvel at,

By sentencing Daniel Edward May, 41, a Hialeah biochemist to three consecutive terms of five years at Raiford, Judge Williams should be commended for his couragous stand.

Letters and petitions bearing hundreds of names protesting any efforts to introduce legislation liberalizing laws on homosexuality are being sent to Sen. George Hollahan.

Gama Xi Chapter of Beta Sigma Phi, has organized a campaign to get out the letters and signatures following reports that such legislation will be introduced later this month before the State Legislature, according to Mrs. Libby Bowen, Citizenship Chair-

Illinois is the only state in the Union which had legalized the acts of consenting adults, but moves to liberalize the law are afoot in New York and California

He's just back from Viet Nam.

And this Ivy Leagueshirted young man who looks like a first year seminary student with 145 lean pounds stretched taut across a six-foot, two-inch frame looks anything but like one of those courageous pilots you read about casually over your morning coffee.

Lt. Fischer has wound up a year fighting the Viet Cong and has come home for re-assignment to a grateful wife, a daughter he doesn't remember too well, and an eightmonth-old son, Michael, he has seen for the first time.

"Oh, yes, I've been scared several times," Lt. Fischer readily admitted. But one thing, you don't Scared ... ?

really remember fear . . . or pain.

"It's not really so much fear. But it's being unsure.

"Viet Nam looks very much like the Everglades. All dense vegetation. No open areas. Like a green umbrella," he said in spurts, like the 750-perminute bullets his copter's M-60 machineguns spit out.

"If the helicopter crashes," he said like he was talking about yesterday's ball scores, "it twists you, burns you, mutilates you.

"But a Viet Cong bullet? It makes just one ...small...hole."

This is the man who stepped off the University of Miami campus in 1962 with an ROTC Commission and has been awarded an Air Medal with 18 oak leaf clusters and an Expeditionary medal.

He has been honored by the Vietnamese Army and Government and his name has been submitted for the Distinguished Flying Cross and Army Commendation Medal.

"Most of our combat missions are in the early morning," Lt. Fischer said, as his daughter left the refuge of his lap and began thumbing through a book entitled 'My Happy Dog.'

"Seems like all the battles start in the morning. And you're very vulnerable — like a floating duck.

"The Viet Cong are concealed. They fire at you. You hear it. But you don't know where it's coming from," said Lt. Fischer, who's logged more than 900 combat flying hours and has gone through 4,000 sorties.

"I've taken four holes," he said dryly. "I was hit the first week I was in Viet Nam. I thought a

City Hires Fiscal Men For Bonds

South Miami Council Monday night appointed the investment firm of Barcus Kindred & Co. as the city's financial advisor and fiscal agent in connection with a \$700,000 bond issue the city plans to float.

The bonds will be financed by revenue certificates payable from utility taxes over the next 20 to 30 years.

The bond issue will not raise city taxes.

According to Mayor Clyde Taylor, the \$700,000 will go for a sewer hookup with the City of Coral Gables, a site for the city garage and a garage for the site, the purchase of the Chamber of Commerce building at Fuchs Park for a youth center and a 71/2-acre site at Red Road and Snapper Creek for an area park and play-

A new city library building also would come from the bond issue.

It will take from 75 to 100 days for Barcus and Kindred to validate and sell the bonds.

Earlier in the meeting, Council authorized City Manager Richard Barton to borrow some \$100,000 from First. National Bank of South Miami to pay for a tract the city has bought for a city garage.

The short-term loan will be repaid in about six months from the proposed bond issue.





Don't hedge. Don't be afraid to say no. And above all co-operate with the church and school. Bill Ashby, Minister of Music and Education at Coral Baptist Church, Charles Harris, Administrative Principal of South Dade High School, and Rev. Morris Elliott, Director of Juvenile Rehabilitation, Miami Baptist Association, offered this advice and more in the Tuesday evening session which was completely question-answer.

How can parents help the public schools?

"Make a child face the music if he's done wrong," Harris answered. "Too often, they cover up. That's no way to keep things from happening. If it's wrong, it's wrong."

Be an example to your teens, the panel advised their audience. "Religion is more caught than taught," Ashby, stated. "Actions go with verbalizing. Don't live contrary to your Christian beliefs."

"Make young people feel important," Rev. Elliott interjected. "They need to know there's a place for them."

"Patience and understanding, you've got to have that," Harris a tall intense man said. "Take time to work with them, ride the crest of their wave. They recognize sincerity when it's on the level.



He Tinkers with Infinity

Jacques Wolfe has had . 23 one-man showings of his photographic work, including the one that runs through April 17, at Sindelir Gallery, 91 Almeria, Coral Gables. He is also the composer of songs classics, such as "Shortnin' Bread" and "De Glory Road." His achievements in both fields have brought him quantities of critical praise.

But Jacques Wolfe is not simply a successful artist; he is essentially a man who tinkers with the infinite, a man whose mind leaps to the un-

Shy and modest, he is nevertheless impatient with restricted techniques, what he calls the "cliches" of artistic standards. Both his music and his photography testify to his restless search for new

As a young soldier stationed at Greenville, S.C., during World War I, he'd take long Sunday afternoon walks through the country. "I heard exciting music coming out of those little Negro clapboard churches," he said. "Later, I discovered some song poems which fit in with my idea of using the spiritual idiom in the form of concert song."

After the war, Wolfe returned to New York, where he taught high school music by day, and worked on his compositions at night. He created "De Glory Road," 'Gwine to Hebbin," the operetta "The Trysting Tree," and collaborated with Roark Bradford on "John Henry," a folk opera, which was produced on Broadway.

"I was fortunate that some of the greatest voices of the day - Lawrence Tibbett and John Charles Thomas wanted to sing my music,"

Wolfe taught high school for 25 years in Brooklyn; his wife, Rose, taught first grade.

'As I neared my 50th birthday, it started getting to me. The kids were fine, but all they demanded from the music was the right to blow loud. I decided not to spend another ten years waiting for my pension."

She he and his wife quit their jobs, sold their furniture, packed the car and headed south.

One of the items that made the trip south with the Wolfes was Jacques' \$7.50 Kodak box camera.

After watching other camera addicts fiddling with the details of their equipment, Wolfe decided that the first thing he had to learn was how to take a picture; techni-.cal experience could come later.

I refer to Baby Ribs, that narrow, tender, tasty strip of meaty bones that encases the pork tenderloin in a young pig. The processor takes a 13 rib strip and trims it down until only the "heart" remains. The final product is a strip of ribs exactly three inches wide. They are tasty morsels when barbecued over hickory wood and basted with a tangy harbecue sauce. with a tangy barbecue sauce.

Where can you get them? Well, there's a spot on West Flagler Street between 47th and 48th Avenues called Mr. Rib serving 12 ounce to an order, The price is \$1.49 and includes French-fried potatoes, cole slaw, and garlic bread.

Furthermore, Mr. Rib has an interesting menu, with items like Chinese-style spareribs, beef ribs, chicken, ham steak and beefsteak. I plan a return visit, particularly to sample the heef ribs, of which I am an aficionado. It is good to know that one can obtain Baby Ribs at realistic prices.


