" said the resolution passed by the League,

League President W. Keith Phillips Jr. said Monday that the Leagues has yet to learn official from Metro about their request that the League, Council of Mayors, and the Dade County Association of Unincorporated Areas study the provision of the division of responsibility recommendations of the Metro Planning Board.

This was done two weeks ago, but Phillips says the League has yet to hear about it. The DCAUA turned down the proposal two weeks ago, claiming that it had insufficient time and resources to study the provisions and report back in time.

Phillips complained also that the municipalities and the League were never notified or consulted by Metro before the controversial Uniform Penal Code, which proposed to abolish all municipal courts, was adopted.

Here are the major provisions of the bill drawn up by the DCUA:

Five-man commission running from and elected from districts who would split up the administrative duties now performed by the county manager.

Bi-partisan elections to replace non-partisan elec-

Return the offices of tax collector, tax assessor, clerk of the Circuit Court, voter registrar and county surveyor to elective status and keep the present elective sheriff provision.

Abolish all special boards authorities or courts created by Metro.

The governor to appoint a budget commission to act as a watchdog over County finances and spending.

Board of Visitors to be restored to the jurisdiction of Youth Hall.

Present Commissioners to serve out their terms with an election to be held 90 days after the amendment is ratified.

Commissioners to serve four years.

In short, with some few exceptions, the amendment, if passed would return Dade County to the form of government that existed before 1957 and that in effect in the other 66 counties of Florida,

Why did the DCAUA make this move?

Here are the four reasons outlined in Barr's letter to Rep. Williams:

"Metro is an extreme centralization of government with excessive feder-

al control, therby by-passing state authority.

"Metro has increased the cost of local government from a \$30 million in 1957 under pre-Metro government, to a \$65 million budget in 1964 under Metro-Socialistic govern-ment. From \$38.49 cost per capita in 1957 under pre-metro county government, to \$60.28 per capita in 1964 under Metro-Socialistic government.

"Metro is a socialistic form of government.

"Metro has subjected the people of Dade County to police state tactics, loss of individual freedom, and excessive federal intervention,"

One such move, sponsored by a Hialeah-based group, would create "Kennedy County" whose boundaries would be everything north of the City of Miami and west of the proposed Miami Beach County.

"Most of the municipalities have superior rolls," Kimball told the business and professional men.

Coral Gables generally has benefitted in the county assessments, said Kimball, contradiciting what some City officials have been saying.

Brake, using Kimball's figures, attacked the Metro roll, something he had already done in a suit, which is pending before the Florida Supreme Court.

He also attacked those he said had advocated the change by repeating the charge that they had been the benefactors. Among those were the officials of both the Miami Herald and Miami News and county officials themselves.

The study of 10,000 parcels, including 32 hotels listed at \$60,000 or more, revealed that their assessments were at 158% of fair market

The law requires that assessments be pegged at 100% of fair value. "Is it any wonder that the hotels on the Beach want a separate county?" Brake asked.

He rattled off a long list of hotels, their assessments and what they actually sold for. One hotel listed at \$1,226,-

600, he said, sold for \$672,-620. Another assessed at \$582,800 sold for only \$200,-000.

Turning to gas stations, Brake quoted Kimball's figures to show that sales indicated they were generally pegged at 48%.

One gas station site assessed at \$33,000, he said, sold for \$105,000. Another sold for \$160,000 that had been assessed at \$99,000. Still another assessed at \$15,-260 sold for \$65,000.

Brake pointed to other alleged discrepencies in the

Within the same area in Hialeah, he said, average assessments varied among four subdivisions. In the first subdivision, the builder was assessed at 93%. His competitor to the south was assessed at 86%, to the east 86% and to the north, 109%.

In Coral Gables, the assessments amounted in effect to Homestead exemption of

pleted homes.

Business reportedly fared even better. Of three properties, one assessed at \$181,800 sold for \$190,000; another assessed at \$24,600 sold for \$75,000 and a third, assessed at \$28,800 sold for \$70,900.

"We're going to have to adopt the very assessments that he mentioned," said Gables City Commissioner Joe Murphy, pointing out that some pay far too little and some far too much in taxes.







## A Look at County Manager Porter Homer

Dade County's third manager in seven years, Porter W. Homer, is now in full command of the Metro government. He succeeds Irving G. McNayr, who departed several months ago after being fired by the Metro Commission - a fate shared with his predecessor, W. (Hump) Campbell.

What sort of man is the new manager? For an insight into Dade's new administrative leader, we contacted William Small Ir.. managing editor of the Tucson in Tucson, Ariz., where Homer was city manager for seven

The following are his observations.

On. Sept. 20, 1955, Democratic Mayor Don Hummel and the Tucson City Council selected Porter W. Homer, director of research and budget for the City of Kansas City, Mo., to become Tucson's new city manager.

Homer was selected from a field of 80 applicants and took office approximately 30 days later. He held the office until March, 1962.

It was during Homer's administration that Tucson increased in size from 63,000 persons living in 14 square miles to 225,000 persons living in 72 square miles.

Tucson's municipal government also increased in size and complexity during the same period. The number of city employes doubled, from 670 to nearly 1,400.

There were similar increases in the assessed valuation of private property within the city, the miles of streets, the number of city water customers, the number of parks, the number of fire stations, the number of building permits, library circulation and virtually every other city government statistic.

In 1961, when Hummel and his Democratic council were nearing the end of their third term in office, rumblings began at City Hall,

The city nearly paid almost \$660,000 for water bearing lands later appraised at about \$350,000. A Republican councilman — and later a grand jury — discovered that the city had paid between 10 and 100 times too much for some steel which had been passed off as being high-carbon steel, but in reality was just ordinary. The jury found no evidence that Homer was involved in the purchase.

The years of annexations in order to add as much population to the city before the 1960 census had kept the city from maintaining a high level of services, particularly in the newly annexed areas.

Mayor Hummel did not seek re-election, but three of his councilmen did, with one of them running for mayor. The voters went nearly two to one for a slate of Republican newcomers who promised a business-like administration with much attention on providing services. When the smoke cleared, the 1961 city election left Tucson with a Republican mayor, Lew Davis, and six GOP councilmen.

Shortly after that election, five of the Republican councilmen met in a private home and agreed to demand Homer's resignation. Three days later, he submitted it, to be effective March 15, 1962.

Homer was hired at \$12,000 a year. When he left here he was earning \$20,400. His successor, hired at \$21,-000 in 1962, now is earning \$23,000.

Before leaving Tucson to become city manager of

The administration of Porter W. Homer under a three-time Tucson mayor, Don Hummel, and a Democratic Party-controlled City Council, is characterized by Tucson newspaper executive Bill Small as having the strength to depose men outgrown by their jobs in a rapidly growing community and the guts to put through a sales tax to put the city in a stronger financial posi-

"Homer, like Hummel, a strong-willed man. Their thinking ran along the same course on most matters, but when they disagreed, they argued sometimes vehemently until one convinced the

"If their differences couldn't be settled by argument, Homer generally gave in to Hummel. Hummel, after all, was the mayor and had three of the six councilmen (sometimes four of them) ready

to follow him on any item .

"I would characterize Homer as an intelligent and vigorous city manager. His major fault - if you could call it that was that he tried to do too much himself instead of delegating duties to his department heads. Because of the demands of his job and the way he chose to perform it, he sometimes didn't have the time to check things out to the most minute detail.

Rochester, N.Y., Homer and his wife were guests of honor at an appreciation luncheon in Tucson. More than 350 local citizens paid tribute to him at the affair.







## 33% Fare Hike Asked By Taxis

Taxicab firms operating in Coral Gables are asking for 33% increase in rates increase already granted in Miami Beach, Miami, Miami Shores, North Miami and North Miami Beach.

A public hearing has been set for May 11 by the Coral Gables City Commission on the proposal.

Julius Bauer III, owner of University Cab and Gables Taxi, and John McKenna, manager for Checker Cab of Coral Gables, a Yellow Cab subsidiary, appeared before the Commission Tuesday, but the matter was postponed until a public hearing could be scheduled.

"It's getting to a point when taxicabs cannot operate on the same revenue because of increased operating cost per mile," Bauer said Wednesday.

While revenue has gone up 25% Bauer said, cost of operation is much higher.

Pay is up 66%, administration, 52%, insurance, 350%, repairs, 68%, professional services, 76%, taxes 34%, utilities, 471/2% and depreciation 43% Bauer claimed,

The basic rate of 30 cents per mile has remained un-changed since 1945, the cab company owner said.





## Blunt Questions, Frank Answers Spark Sex Learning in Church for Teens

The medical terms were frank

The questions blunt.

And over 125 teens who filled the First Methodist Church of South Miami, learned something about Venereal Disease and how to behave themselves when they get to college.

The inter-denominational discussion-hootenanny was the second phase of a program involving parents and young people from five South Miami churches, sponsored by the Protestant Social Welfare Services. Represented were, The First Baptist Church of South Miami, South Miami Lutheran Church, St. Thomas Episcopal Church, University Christian Church, and the host, South Miami Methodist.

Prepared questions and thoughts from the audience were fielded by five teenagers and Circuit Judge William Herin, Dr. Ray Mummery, General Practioner; Dr. Wilford Provo, Psychiatrist: Miss Priscilla Hayden, director of the Information and Referral Services and Volunteer Services of the Dade County Welfare Planning Council, and Stephen Blane, Guidance Counselor, Palmetto Senior High School. Moderator was John Hodgin, director of Protestant Social Welfare Services.

"The next step is to evaluate what happened and decide where to go from here." he said. "We've got to do something, but what?

"I looked at the 120 teens singing at the hootenanny afterwards, and realized there must be other things," Hodgin observed. "Here we had all these kids together and on a Saturday night."

Conversation, give and take between panelists was the rule. "It was very animated and involved," Hodgin stated. "These were things that needed to be talked

The unusual program was born six months ago, when several South Miami ministers began meeting weekly. "We started out with no idea why we were getting together," Hodgin recalled. "Then we saw the Dade County Public Health Department statistics on the rise of VD among young people."

"I brought it up before them," he continued, "and we decided to have Dr. E. L. Matta, Director of the division of Maternal and Child Health Services of the Health department speak to

"This seemed to be a proper area for the church," the Director related. "We dis-cussed morality, What is the Christian view, What is the school's responsibility, where does the church come in. We decided to leave the interpretation up to the different denominations."

How did congregations accept the program? "Everywas pleased," said the Thomas Episcopal Church secretary. "We sent out letters to each parent informing them of what was coming.

"Girl Scout Little House" says the sign on Ludlum Road.

Don't you believe it.

It's the Girl Scouts' house, all right, but there's nothing little about it.

The house itself is a large, rustic lodge, with few of the comforts of home, sitting roughly in the middle of four and a half acres of natural hammock.

Thirteen troops, meet here regularly, ranging from Brownies to Cadettes; sometimes three troops meet simultaneously, in the "Big Room," on the porch and in the Cheekee, or outdoor hut.

Adults in the scouting movement use Little House, too, for meeting and planning; troops from as far as Homestead use the area for weekend or overnight camping; Awards Courts, Fly-Ups and other ceremonies are held at the house.

And somewhere out in the nammock, troop of Boy Scouts is building a tree house.

Little House, one of five in the Greater Miami area, is ten years old. Built on land leased from the city of South Miami, it has four major areas plus storage rooms.

The "Big Room" has the approximate dimensions of a basketball court with cathedral ceilings; a large brick fireplace with a raised hearth is on one wall, and

French doors lead to the screened porch.

The kitchen is arranged to provide maximum work area, in the event a harassed troop leader has to produce two dozen peanut-butter-and-jelly sandwiches in record time.

And a tiled bathroom with a dual shower stall is available to all but those stalwarts taking part in what Scouts call a "primitive"

North of the house is the Chickee, or outdoor meeting room, and the Fire Circle, for cookouts. On the South opposite the trefoil flag base, lawn, is a space reserved for the second Cheekee,
