

New Private Airport Planned in SW Area

A new privately-owned airport is planned for the Southwest approximately five miles south of New Tamiami airport under construction, the Guide learned this week.

The new field, if it clears all the obstacles, will be similar to the Aero Country Club operation with facilities for chartering, flight instruction and aircraft and engine maintenance, according to Paul Pyle, operator of Paul's

Flying Service.

"I do feel it has a tremendous potential," said Pyle Monday when he confirmed the Guide story.

Land for the proposed airfield is located in Section 504

Quail Roost Drive (SW 200th Street) and the extension of Farm Life Road (SW 162nd Avenue).

The site is that of James Campbell Farms and would replace the Aero Country

Club facilities if the courts order that closed down, Pyle said.

The County has ordered Aero, located off South Dixie Highway south of the Palmetto (See NEW, Page 2)

Fish Not Biting? Everything Else Is

Dog — "man's best friend" — is biting the hand that feeds him.

Hospitals report that dogs are putting the bite on South Dade and Coral Gables residents — as well as throughout the county — in ever increasing numbers this year.

Faithful Fido has sunk his choppers into 2,771 persons for the first six months of this year, an increase of 508 over a similar period last year, said Louis Westbrooke, director of sanitation for the Dade County Health Department.

There were 524 cases last month alone where a

dog had a bone to pick and took it out on a human.

And with playful children free now that summer's here, the danger is greater than ever.

"Dog bites are ridiculous. We average at least two or three a day," said Miss Jo Ann Morrow, day supervisor of the emergency room at Baptist Hospital.

For May, Miss Morrow said, there were 31 dog bites treated at Baptist. Most were children and several were serious enough to be sutured or sewn up. There were also eight cat bites, one snake

S. Miami Abandons Policy On Use of Federal Funds

Over the strenuous objections of Councilman John Brau, South Miami Council passed a resolution seeking federal financial aid in the purchase of a tract at Red Road and Snapper Creek to be used for a park.

In an effort to get other

Council members to vote against the resolution, Brau said, "If we cannot afford to purchase the park land without the federal grant, then we should not purchase it at all."

"We are talking about only \$19,000," he added. "We can afford the park without Big

Brother's Great Society political pork barrel of funds.

"We should not pass control of our cities' land to the federal government."

"Federal grants are inconsistent with the principles of local government," he pointed out.

Passage was by a 4 to 1 vote, Brau not having swayed other Council members to his way of thinking.

The city is filing an application for the funds under the Open-Space Land Provisions of the National Housing Act of 1961. The federal government is making the funds available to municipalities so that more land can be put aside for parks.

But Brau says there are strings attached to funds the city is seeking, one being a stipulation that the land shall never be used for anything other than a park, unless the city received federal permission first.

The city's purchase of the park has the unanimous approval of the Metro Planning Advisory Board.

Metro Planning Director Reginald Walters, at a recent South Miami pre-Council informal meeting, strongly urged the city to seek the

S. Miami Library to Be or Not to Be

City of South Miami's venture into the field of library operation may become a thing of the past during the next fiscal period.

Several Council members are all for making the city's library a branch of the Miami library — but it won't come during this fiscal period.

Councilman Richard Doyle at Monday night's meeting made a motion that the city enter into a contract with City of Miami for Miami to operate the library as a branch library.

Councilman John Brau seconded the motion. Councilman Joe Kline said that if the change is made at all it should be done during the next fiscal period, after Council has decided on what action it should take and provided for the action in the budget.

Council then voted to table any action until the budget is passed.

Doyle's motion came following a letter from Miami City Manager M. L. Reese to South Miami City Manager Richard Barton that a contract between the two cities could be worked out.

"In answer to your letter of inquiry as to the re-establishment of a contract arrangement to provide library service to the City of South Miami, the City of Miami is prepared to offer a full program of library service and to operate the South Miami library as a branch of the Miami Public Library System."

Special Session Petition Readied for Gov. Burns

A petition calling on Gov. Haydon Burns to call a special session of the State Legislature to authorize a state-wide vote on abolishing Metro was scheduled to be mailed to Tallahassee Wednesday.

The petition, sponsored by the Dade County Association of Unincorporated areas, had brought "close to 10,000 names in a three-day period of solicitation last week, said Mrs. Dudley Burton.

Mrs. Burton said she personally got 1,000 signatures and only two refusals during that period. She declined to predict how many signatures could be obtained by the Wednesday deadline when they will be gathered up and sent to the governor in Tallahassee.

"We're getting a terrific

response in Hialeah," said Mrs. Burton.

A half-day special session of the Legislature following the special session on reapportionment would be all that would be necessary, she said. "This could be taken care of very quickly."

"We've been denied the right to vote by our delegation," Mrs. Burton charged.

The Dade Delegation blocked earlier efforts to introduce authorization for a statewide vote on a repeal of constitutional Amendment which created Metro.

federal funds, pointing out that local governments should move now to acquire more land for parks and playgrounds.

The land the city is tentatively purchasing is a 7.2 acre tract bordering Red Road and Snapper Creek.

The city has been using the property with permission from the Catholic Diocese of Miami, which is ready now to sell the land to the city for \$66,250.

The city stands to get about a third of that figure, \$19,875, in federal funds if the city's application for federal help is approved.

Metro planners liked the site of the park because it fits well into Metro's Master Plan. The property is across Red Road from county land and could be used by County as well as South Miami residents.

Zoo Hours At Crandon

Animals and people will observe new summer zoo hours at Crandon Park effective immediately.

The hours permit longer visits at the zoo with increased closing hours boosted an hour. Weekdays and Saturdays remain the same opening at 9:30 a.m. and closing at 4:30 p.m. Visitors inside may remain in zoo area until 5:00 p.m.

Sundays and holidays the zoo will open at the usual 9:30 a.m. but close at 5:30 p.m. allowing inside visitors to stay until 6 p.m. giving zoo fans an added hour.

Crandon Park Zoo operated by Metro Dade County Park & Recreation Department, is located in Crandon Park on Key Biscayne and is free to the public.

Property owners would be able to park their aircraft alongside their homes and taxi up to the strip.

The developers hope also to accommodate seaplanes by using a 90-foot wide drainage canal north of the proposed field.

Still another possibility, Pyle said, is that the soaring field, north of the proposed site, and being used by the Florida Soaring Association, would be moved there.

The association and the Perrine Jaycees, have gone on record approving the plan, he said.

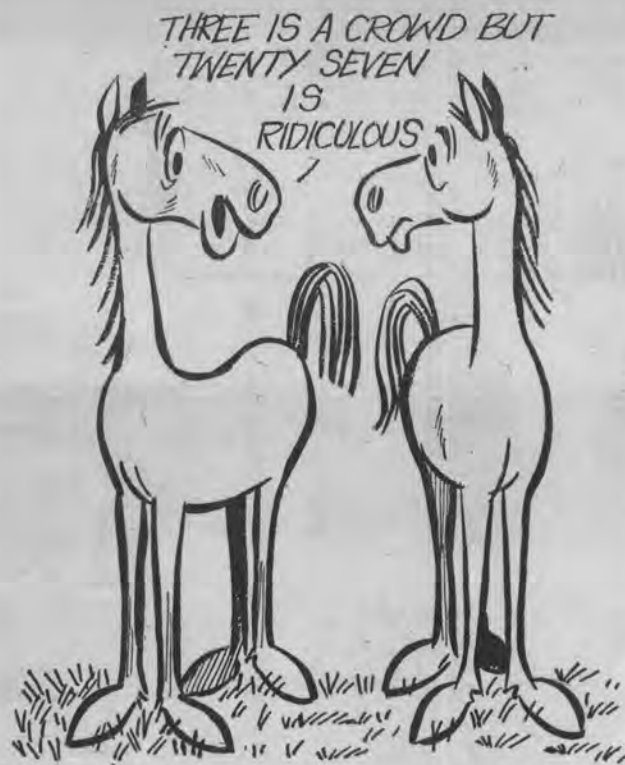
Pyle said he hopes to sell the project to the Greater Miami Aviation Association, the Metro Aviation Advisory Board and the Port Authority.

The partners will also have to clear with the Zoning Board.

If approved, the field would be only one of three with no control tower in Dade County. The others are Homestead General Aviation Field and Aero Country Club.

Aero is the only privately owned field in operation.

Pyle indicated the negotiations have been going on with the federal agency for six months and he expects it will take another six months to get approval.



She's Tired Horsing Around With Zoning

Two horses are a pair, but 27 horses are a herd any way you look at it.

And that's the way Mrs. T. J. Turner looks at the lovely pack inhabiting the acreage alongside her property in the wilderness of the 180th block of North Kendall Drive.

"I'm on the windward side," said Mrs. Turner to emphasize her point.

Mrs. Turner's problem stems from the fact that Dade County, while it has progressed, has not to the point where zoning laws limit the number of horses that may be kept in GU (Interim) zoned areas. These are the zones awaiting specific zoning.

All but a couple of the 27 horses are being boarded, at a reported \$150 a month, which raises another problem about licensing businesses.

The Metro Planning and Zoning Department verified Mrs. Turner's contention that there is no law on the books requiring horse boarding homes to obtain licenses.

"They should establish criteria," said Mrs. Turner, who isn't going to horse around. She's going to Metro Commission to plead for rules and regulations regarding horses.

Chester Czerbrinski, assistant director of the Building and Zoning Department, recently flew

over the area and reported to Mrs. Turner that the area abounds with horses — just as she said.

What would be a fair number?

Her husband thinks four, she'd tolerate a dozen — so many per acre.

It's a nagging problem.

bite and a raccoon bite.

As a matter of record, there were also four 'human' bites, said Miss Morrow. One who was bitten was a security guard at Zayre's, who had stopped a woman for shoplifting, said the head nurse.

Doctors' Hospital reported 23 dog bites since April.

"The public needs to be advised about dogs running loose," said Ralph Piet, manager of the Humane Society.

"The first thing a person sees a dog running loose and runs up to it. The thing to do is to call Metro Animal Control (FR. 7-7885) and have the dog picked up.

"Being a lost animal and looking for its owner," said Piet, "it's going to bite. And during the summer months, dogs are hot, they're looking for water and the whole atmosphere tends to affect the nervous system.

"Even if the dog's in the yard, they're there to protect it and you shouldn't put your hand through a fence."

Piet said the responsibility lies with the parents. "Now, with school out it's going to be a problem."

Architects Form Board In S. Miami

Seven local men joined South Miami's first Board of Architects Monday and agreed to help design a \$150,000 library and a \$50,000 garage for the city.

James Ferguson, temporary chairman, has called another meeting for Thursday at 8:30 a.m. at City Hall, 6130 Sunset Dr.

His committee members include James Deen, Arthur Breakstone, George Hudson, Sam Puder, Scott Arnold and Victor DeKonschin. Phillip Braden plans to attend tomorrow's meeting.

The newly created board also pledged itself to drafting plans for beautifying the city, designing parking areas and recommending a pedestrian overpass across South Dixie Highway.

"Our economics are such that the new library building will have to go on our property in the City Hall complex," Mayor Clyde Taylor told the men.

"But it's up to you to design the building for us or tell us to bring the books here and build us another city hall!"

City Council has already appropriated \$500 in architectural drafting fees for the first stages of design work.

"If anyone sitting here thinks he'll make a lot of money, he's crazy," Deen said. "Here's a chance to do something for the community."

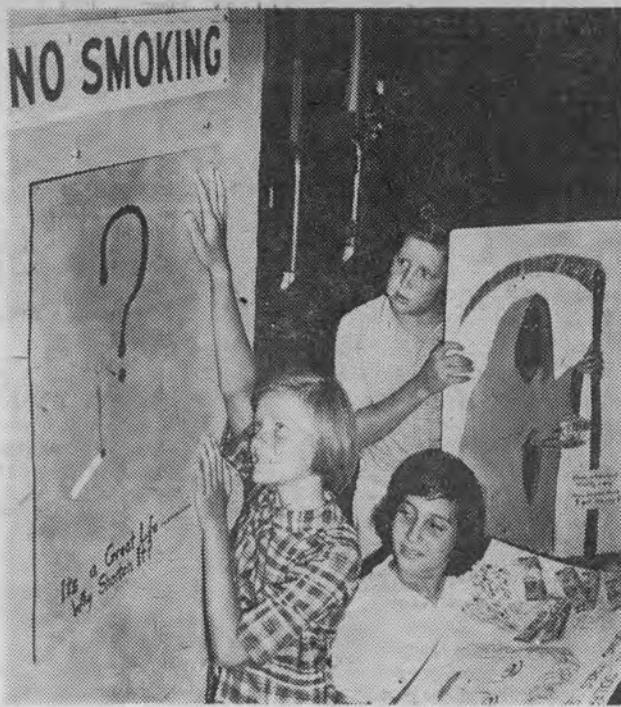



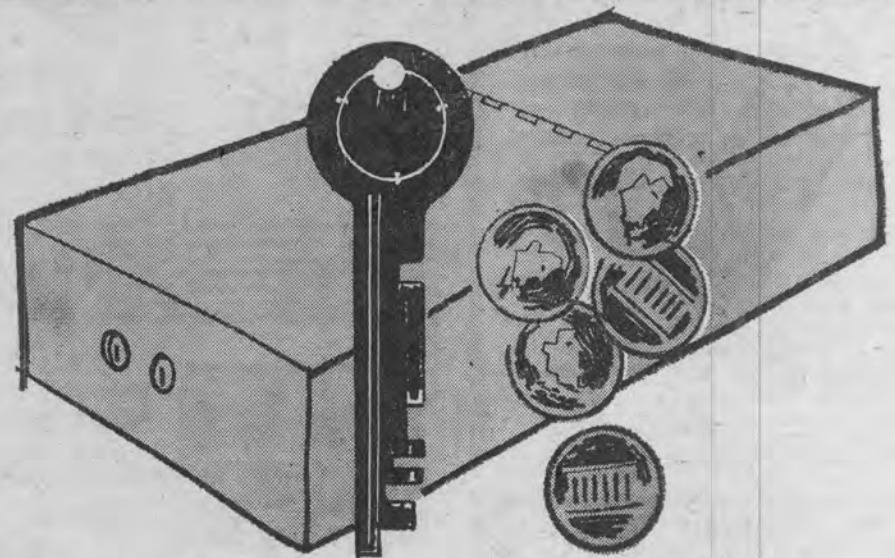

The award is in honor of the late W. W. Edwards who was for many years Secretary-Treasurer of the Underwriters group, and the only man ever to serve as President of the Association three times.

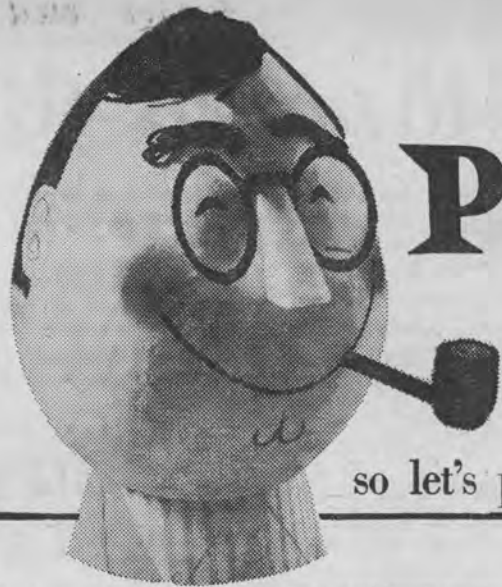

S. Dade Bids to Outshine Miami as Attraction

Chances are good that you've driven from South Miami to Florida City on South Dixie Highway. Most Dade Countians have.

But did you ever wonder where all those roads go that shoot off to the right and

left of the highway?

Mostly they go to homes. But they also go to the finest farming lands, the biggest military installations, some of the best parks and the most unusual attractions in all Dade County.

The big people of South

Dade know this. And they're concerned that the tourists and the local sightseers aren't fully aware of it.

The result is a self-guided tour of South Dade, pointing out attractions in five categories — agriculture, military, industry, parks and attractions.

As you head south from South Miami the tour signs will guide you off South Dixie to attractions in the five categories.

Leading the crusade for better guides to South Dade is a fast-talking, publicity-wise dynamo of a woman who believes that South

Dade has more to offer the tourist than any other part of the county.

She's Mrs. William E. Haast, co-owner of the Miami Serpentarium, 12655 South Dixie Highway, who is ready to back up her theories with statistics.

"Our trouble is this," she pointed out. "South Dade attractions spend thousands annually to entice tourists to South Dade. But when they get here they get lost and have a hard time finding anything."

She brought out that such attractions as the Orchid Jungle, the Parrot Jungle, the Pioneer Museum, South Dade's rich farm lands, most of South Dade's 27 parks and the area's industrial sections are well off the beaten path and difficult for the tourist to find.

Nowhere else in Dade County are there such international attractions as the Serpentarium, the Monkey Jungle, the Coral Castle and Everglades National Park.

"Through the self-guided tour," she said, "we intend to point out attractions to the tourist and the highlights of the area."

The tour begins in South Miami and rambles throughout South Dade to Florida City. To get the full effect of the tour, the tourist should have an accordion-type brochure — a part of the tour — showing maps of the area and points of interest.

Each of the five categories

—agriculture, military, industry parks and attractions—are assigned a color code. If the color code for parks is green, then the tourist turns to the green map in his brochure which locates some 15 of the 27 parks in South Dade.

If the tourist wants to take the Agriculture tour, then he would turn perhaps to the red map in his brochure and visit not only the farm lands, but several canneries and packing houses.

Metro likes the idea so much that it has agreed to pay for the whole works—thousands of brochures, the multi-colored signs and the 138 sign posts needed.

"Everything is being made now," Mrs. Haast pointed out, "and before the end of June the tour should be operating."

She refuses to take all the credit for the tour, although she has spent hundreds of hours selling her plan to various South Dade civic groups and business leaders and Metro officials.

The idea came from Robert W. Shaughnessy, a South Dade attorney and president of the South Dade Council of the Miami-Dade Chamber of Commerce, she said.

"Bob asked me if I would work on it. I said I would and I've been with it ever since. That was last October."

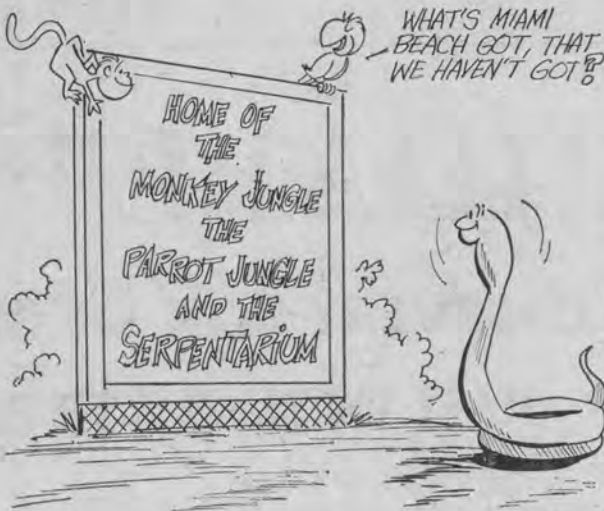

Error of Omission: No Financial Report

The disclosure that State law requiring that counties publish their annual financial reports is not being complied with is a startling one and a matter that should be rectified.

We fail to agree with the State Comptroller's office that the violation is only a technical one.

Motorists are haled into court, fined and jailed on violations that are everyday occurrences — failing to comply with some traffic law or regulation.

We also fail to agree with those who would put the present Metro Commission in jail for failing to follow the law.

The violation is a long standing one that precedes Metro, involves most of Florida's counties and innumerable men who have served in the past as well as the present.

There is no indication that County attorneys or managers ever advised any commission of their responsibility and the finance director's office is under the impression that the law is being complied with by the County, but not by the State, since a detailed budget is furnished the State by the County.

The important thing now is to require that the financial statement be published in a County newspaper, as required by the law, so that all residents may see for themselves where their money went.

There's No Drought In Your Water Bill

We can sympathize with the plight of South Miami residents who find themselves having to pay higher water rates, not because of the higher cost of supplying them with water, but due to the expenses incurred to Consumers Water Company in successfully fighting a reduction of its rates by the City.

The City Council acted in good faith, if in the end they were deemed to have acted unwisely by the Courts, which found that Consumers' profits were less than the legal limit.

The matter points up a problem of determining a private utility's cost of operation, especially when its holdings overlap two municipalities and the unincorporated area it serves as a middleman for another agency producing the water.

The Metro Water and Sewer Board recently eliminated some of the confusion, if not the inequities, by setting uniform rates for all three areas.

This caused a still further increase for South Miami and to Coral Gables and a reduction for the unincorporated area. In any event, residents of South Miami have little choice but to pay and grit their teeth.

What She Asked, We Already Had

Success does indeed have a thousand fathers.

Gables attorney Gerald Pucci's discovery that state law requires that county financial statements be published annually is the end product of a succession of events.

Credit must be given to Mrs. Natalie Reading, Malibu Homeowners' Association, who got the whole thing rolling months ago by asking the Dade County Association of Unincorporated Areas to back legislation to require all public bodies to publish financial statements.

Mrs. Reading had suggested that this be done two years ago, but no one took her seriously. She attempted on her own to obtain supporting information, she said, but was given the runaround by officials.

"I've always gotten evasive answers from everybody," said Mrs. Reading, whose interest in county finances stems from a similar experience back in Livonia, Mich., where she edited a small community paper.

Her inquiries met with the usual, "Are you some kind of a kook," reaction, she says, but she persisted until she convinced someone to take her seriously.

Meanwhile, W. L. Philbrick's People's Committee, was working on the same thing, Philbrick says.

But it was Pucci's careful researching of the law that brought the matter to a head.

Mrs. Ann Tiballi, president of the Central Canal Civic Improvement Association, Inc. who attended the DCAUA meeting at which Pucci made his report, fired off a telegram to Gov. Haydon Burns to investigate.

A check by this newspaper of Pucci's claims drew an admission from Comptroller Ray Green that counties were not being made to comply with the law.

It remains to be seen what the County Commission, will do to rectify this slight oversight.

The law provides for up to a year in jail or \$5,000 fine for those convicted.

While it may be true that the State audits the detail financial reports submitted by the various counties, the public has a right to know how its tax money is spent.

The annual budget makes interesting reading, but often turns out to contain a lot of romance and fiction.

It is the financial report, if true and accurate, that has the meat and potatoes. Like the check book stubs, it really tells where the money went. Or should.

It is certainly not fair at all to consider me as someone political while carefully avoiding to do so when it comes to others.

It also implies, of course, that my broadcasts are farther to the left than left or liberal, which is not true. I have, through all my years as a newspaperman and broadcaster, never stood for anything else but the things Roosevelt, Truman, Stevenson, Kennedy or Johnson stood for. Even my enemies would be happy to confirm that.

Since it has become a matter of taint to be characterized as someone of or with "the hard left line," I think it is not at all a matter of opinion on the part of columnists but a matter of gross unfairness to label someone in this manner, unless this is really and factually so.

I hope, therefore, that you will be kind enough to correct the picture in the next edition of The Guide, through publication in full, of this statement.

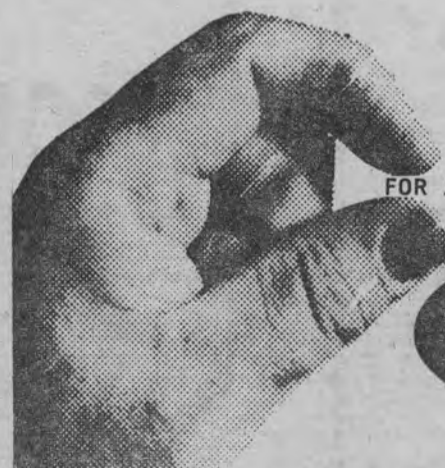

\$700,000 Bond Issue for Library, Sewers OK'd by South Miami Council

City of South Miami Monday night passed into law an ordinance authorizing the issuance of \$700,000 in bonds needed for capital improvements.

Council unanimously passed on third and final reading the 29-page ordinance which paves the way for the city to hook up to the Coral Gables sewer system, which is the prime reason for the bond issue.

According to city officials, the city's growth and public safety are hampered unless the city gets some basic sewer system which could be the basis of a city-wide system.

Most of the bond funds will go for the linking of a basic South Miami sewer system to the already-established Coral Gables system.

Negotiations opened last week with Gables officials.

Other portions of the bond issue revenue will go for a new city library, land for a city garage and a garage building and the purchase of a tentative park site at Red Road and Snapper Creek.

About \$150,000 is slated for the library and a like

amount is earmarked for the land and city garage.

According to City Manager Richard Barton, the city can expect the funds by September, following validation and sale of the bonds between now and then.

The city is pledging its utility tax revenue over the

next 30 toward payment of the bonds.

This will cause no increase in city ad valorem taxes, which City Manager Barton said this week will remain the same as last year.

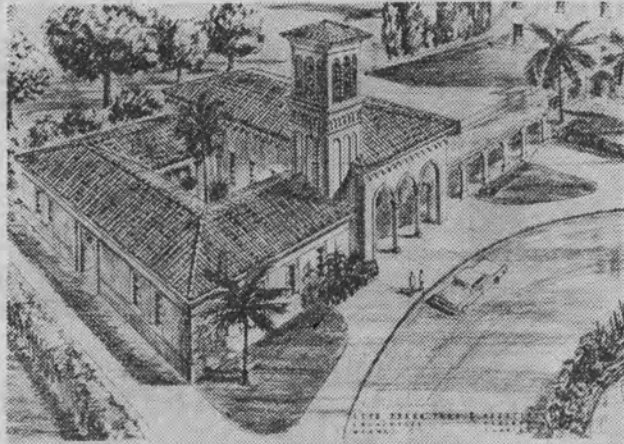
\$120,000 Baptist Chapel To Be Built at Hospital

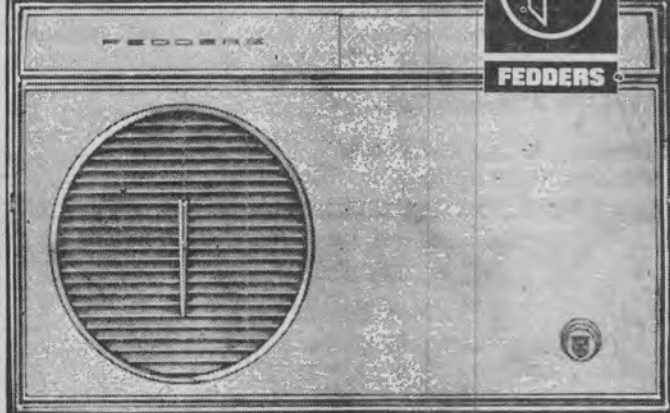

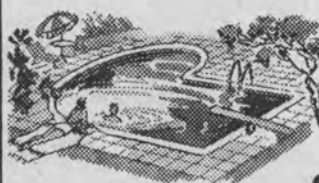

K-9 Corps Combats Cat Burglar

There's a bit of psychology ... a lot of gut-tough training ... and loads of sweat pouring out these days — all to protect Mr. and Mrs. Coral Gables.

The above recipe is what the Gables Commission and police have cooked up — in way of a canine corps — to combat the elusive cat burglar who's struck time and time again.

Three specially-selected Gables policemen are going to school again. They're Russell Jones, Lamar Gilbert and Robert Stewart.

Each day, from nine a.m. to 5 p.m., these three trot out under a blazing hot sun and their German Shepherds tear through a splitting routine that would make Charles Atlas choose beach sand in his face than this daily diet.

The psychology? That's where the dog comes in.

"Everyday the dogs get a different kind of soup. Turkey soup, vegetable soup, beef and

noodle soup," explained **Bill Page**. He's the owner of K-9 Inc., the Hialeah kennel training the men and their dogs.

"The basic food is the same at night. Meal and meat, fortified with vitamins.

"But dogs do have taste. So, on top of this, we add the soup.

"And this way," Page said smilingly, "the dog thinks he's getting a completely new type of food each night. The soup changes the flavor of the food."

That Commando-type training? Beads of sweat and blue fatigues that stick to their backs testify to what the Gables police are going through for this special duty of night work at no extra pay.

"They're doing very well," said Page. "They're doing exactly what we're telling them.

"Actually, we are training the man first and the dog second and the men and the dogs are becoming a good team ..."

Suppose a Gables policeman is cruising down some dark Ga-

bles street at night.

The policeman sees movement in a backyard. He's out of the car. So's the dog. He sees a man.

"Watch him," the officer says. The dog's ears perk up like pencil-points. A spark flares into his eyes.

It IS a cat burglar!

"Stop him!" orders the officer. With that, the dog becomes 100-pounds of flying fur and bristling teeth, trained to lock his powerful jaws on any part of the criminal's body.

The officer runs up. "Leave," he commands the dog.

He then frisks the burglar. If the thief suddenly attacks the officer, the dog — without verbal orders — automatically again leaps at the criminal. The man."

'Sam, Is That a Symphony off the Port Bow?'

How do you prevent a yacht from leaving the auditorium before the concert is over? And how do you get a piano on a barge?

If your name is **Henry Peltier**, and you manage the Greater Miami Philharmonic Society, you worry about such things.

This year the Society is presenting a series of five twilight Pops concerts, conducted from a barge opposite Marine Stadium, off the Rickbacker Causeway.

The stadium seats 6,500, and the lagoon area has room for 200 boats, so music-lovers have the unprecedented choice of attending the concerts afloat or in dry-dock.

USE OF THE stadium, with its large capacity and low rental fee, brings the ticket price down to \$1.00 per person, but the marine approach gives Peltier some knotty headaches.

How to get the piano on the barge, for instance.

"Well, I guess we'll just pull the barge up as close to the stadium as we can, and transfer the piano as smoothly as possible."

How to sell tickets to people aboard a boat?

"Anyone who wants to attend the concert from a boat will have to purchase a ticket at our office or at the

stadium previous to the concert," he said.

"They'll tell us how many people they plan to have aboard, and we'll give them a ticket. Half the ticket will be a printed list of regulations, and the other half will be a decal, with the number of tickets purchased written on it.

"This is to be displayed on the windshield of the boat as it enters the lagoon for the

concert. We'll have a boat stationed at the entrance, and if the number of people aboard exceeds the number on the decal, the boatowner can pay for the additional tickets at that time."

WHAT ABOUT sneaking people in below the deck?

"Well, you can sneak into a drive-in movie in the trunk of the car, too, if you think it's worth it," answered Pel-

tier, "but we're depending on boatowners to be honest with us. We don't anticipate any problems."

Gates to the lagoon will be closed at 7 p.m., half an hour before the concert starts, and all boats are to be anchored by 7:15. Lagoon gates will remain closed until the conclusion of the concert.

The orchestral barge has a fiberglass shell and a special-

ly designed sound system, and Leroy Anderson and Skitch Henderson are among the five guest conductors signed up for the series.

The concerts are scheduled for July 3, 16, 31, and Aug. 14 and 28.

And if the local response is anything like what Peltier anticipates, the Greater Miami Philharmonic Society will have scored a real "Victory at Sea."

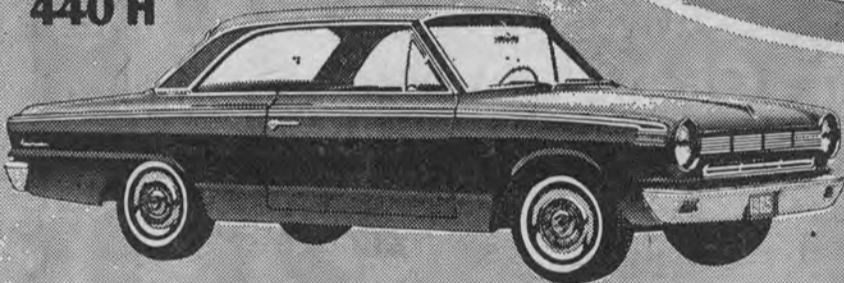
