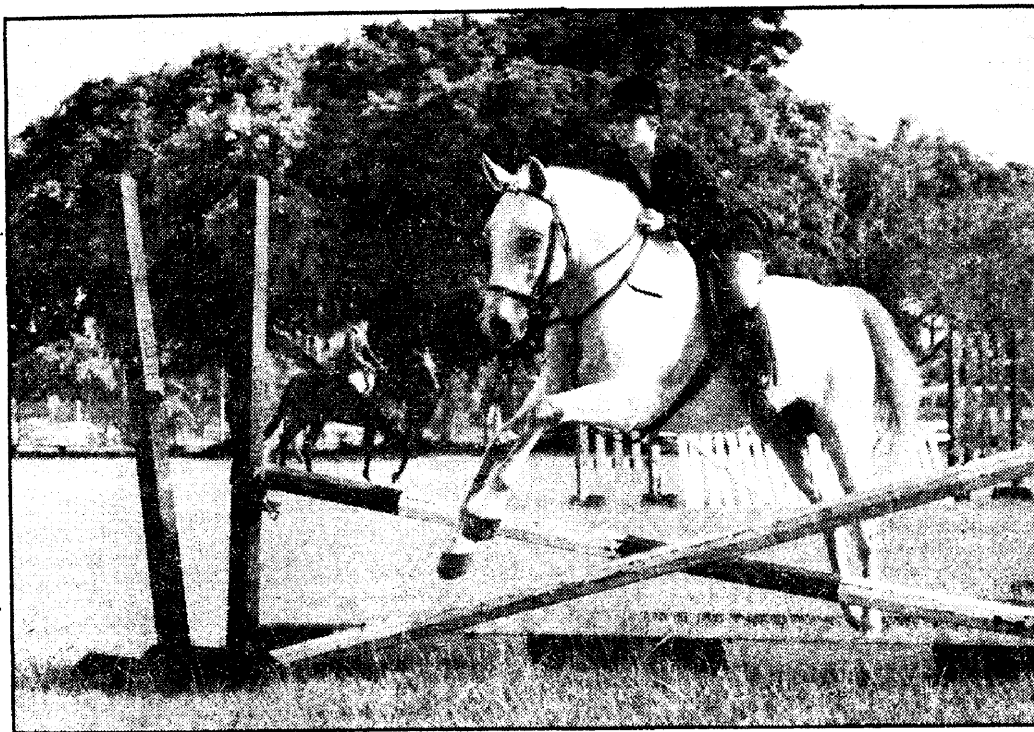

Driver kicks kids off school bus

Ed Leavey was furious when his 13-year-old son, Joseph Ruiz, came home from school late one day last week.

But the youngster had a good excuse.

As he was riding a school bus home from W.R. Thomas Junior High, he and a friend began to tease a girl who was sitting in front of them. According to Leav-

ey, the boys were pinning a sign in the girl's hair.

The bus driver, Laura Gibson, got angry and stopped the bus.

Instead of reprimanding the boys, or taking them home or back to school where they would be disciplined, the boys said the driver let them off right on Tamiami Trail, west of the turnpike.

"She let them off right in the middle of nowhere,"

said Leavey, who lives at 9801 W. Flagler St. "There was a bar nearby where some bad, drunk characters were hanging out. Joseph and his buddy had to start walking home."

Along the way, a friend's mother saw the boys and offered them a ride. They accepted and arrived home tardy, but safe.

Leavey claims he called

the county school bus system and was told that Ms. Gibson would be reprimanded for booting the boys off the bus and that would be the end of it.

But Jim Gray, director of transportation for Dade County Schools, told *The Times-Guide* that the matter is still under investigation.

"I've been in contact with Thomas Mertz, prin-

A 60-year-old South Miami resident, afflicted with terminal cancer, leaped to his death from atop the David William Hotel in Coral Gables Thursday morning, Sept. 16.

Despondent over poor health, Nicholas J. Murphy of 5252 Sunset Dr., jumped from the balcony of the top floor of the building, located at 700 Biltmore Way.

According to police, Murphy apparently walked into the elegant hotel and went unnoticed as he took the elevator up to the penthouse.

It wasn't until after he jumped and his body was sprawled on the circular driveway in front of the hotel that someone finally took notice.

"I was standing behind the door when, out of the corner of my eye, I saw him falling on the driveway," said Reggie Bailey, the hotel's doorman.

A construction worker employed by one of the hotel tenants had another version. "I was working in the back when I heard a bunch of people yelling that some guy jumped from the building."

"I got some sheets and covered him," the worker said, adding, "No one had ever seen him around here before."

Until recently, Murphy had been employed as a real estate salesman with Quinn Properties in Coral Gables.

"He had been employed with us for about five years, but he left six months ago because he was ill and couldn't keep up," said Robert Quinn.

"I think the problem was that his health had been declining for some time. He had been in and out of the hospital, he had cancer and had been taking cobalt treatments for years."

Metro Detective Fabio Alonso said Murphy jumped from the balcony ledge of the penthouse and cleared the 14-foot overhang covering the hotel's driveway.

"We are sure it was suicide," said Deputy Chief Medical Examiner Ronald K. Wright, after analyzing footprints left in a balcony planter.

"Anyone in reasonably good shape could have made the leap and cleared the overhang," he said.

Murphy is survived by his wife, Eileen.

Hostage released

Stephanie Hirsch, a Coral Gables psychiatric therapist working at the Counseling Institute of South Florida, was released Friday evening after being held hostage by a patient for more than 24 hours.

Wayne Wilson, a former inmate at South Florida State Hospital, reportedly became agitated during a counseling session Thursday, Sept. 16, at institute offices, located at 304 Palermo.

Reportedly armed, Wilson had been holding Ms. Hirsch hostage since Thursday, although police didn't learn of the situation until Friday morning. She was released unharmed Friday evening.

Coral Gables policemen and a S.W.A.T. team armed with rifles had a three block area around the institute cordoned off. The office is across from the new Coral Gables police and fire stations.

Volunteers' work aids asthmatics

When the ambulance finally arrived at 6055 SW 128th St., Laura Brown, 10, had already fallen unconscious. Her face was blue from a suffocating asthma attack.

At Variety Children's Hospital, Laura was put in intensive care. It was not a new experience. She had been rushed to the hospital almost every two weeks since she was one-year-old.

That was four years ago. Today Laura rides

horses and leads a normal life thanks to the National Asthma Center in Denver, Colo., where she spent two years being tested, diagnosed and treated.

Her asthma is now controlled with medicine and a special breathing machine that she must use three to four times a day.

"We really feel that NAC saved Laura's life," said her mother Susanne. Laura is only one of hundreds of children who owe their health to the

treatment they have received at the Colorado asthma center.

And, because treatment there costs about \$25,000 per child, they also owe their health to NAC auxiliaries that raise money to finance treatment and care.

In the past four years, about six South Dade children have been admitted to the center, estimates Deena Birenbaum, who does publicity for local auxiliaries.

This year, the top three

contributing auxiliary in the nation are all from Dade County. Lober Chapter, most of whose members are South Miamians, contributed the most, \$60,021.21.

It's not easy to raise that much money in one year. Lober members hold raffles, flea markets, rummage sales, a bike-athon, a golf tournament, radiothon, a day at the races, and sell everything imaginable.

"These are a very dedicated bunch," said Selan

Rappaport, Lober Chapter's publicity chairman.

The money raised by each group goes directly to the NAC, not to a specific child. If a child from the South Dade area is suffering from asthma, he may be referred by his doctor to the center. Specialists in Denver accept or reject a child solely on the basis of need, not on ability to pay. Once accepted, his care is entirely financed by NAC donations, unless his parents willingly contribute.

Dollar cab fare gives Gables man his 'freedom'

A recently inaugurated \$1 door-to-door taxi cab service has not only provided a means of transportation for James Bryan, but it has also given him the sense of freedom he has yearned for over the last several years.

Bryan, who works for a banking firm in Coral Gables only a few blocks away from his small Gables apartment, has been confined to a wheelchair since he was afflicted with polio in the early 50s.

Since moving to Coral Gables, Bryan, who lives alone, has had to pay \$3.20 a day to get to and from work. He has done most of his shopping by mail because he had no way of getting to and from stores without paying the high price of regular taxi service.

In addition, Bryan said he had to move to a higher rent area just so he could be near a grocery store.

Since he started using the county-operated special taxi service for handicapped people two months ago, Bryan has been able to do his own shopping along Miracle Mile, go to the movies, visit friends, and attend

church services.
Under a six-month

transportation demonstration program, three local taxi companies have been authorized to accept \$1 prepaid vouchers issued to those using the service.

Taxi drivers involved in the program have been specially trained to assist the users during their trips, and hydraulic lifts are provided for those who need them.

"Most handicapped people are independent, like me," Bryan said. "But you are restricted and confined when you can't get places.

"This service is the best thing that could happen to us and the community as well. Just because you

are in a wheelchair doesn't mean you don't want to live."

Bryan does have one complaint about the service, and that is not enough people know about it.

"It isn't because the

handicapped people don't want it, they just don't know about it, and don't know how good it is."

The taxi or van rides are available seven days a week from 6 a.m. to midnight and the potential user can request a physi-

cally handicapped application from the Dade County Transportation Office at 579-2594, or the South Dade Citizens' Information Office, 233-7941, or the West Dade Citizens' Information Office at 264-9041.

A cop-out

The Coral Gables Police Department has what is known as a Crime Watch program.

Citizens may call a certain number and find out what's happening in Coral Gables crime-wise should they so desire.

This information is recorded daily by the public information officer.

However, there's at least one problem.

If something happens on a Friday, chances are when you call the crime watch number to find out what's going on, you'll get Thursday's run-down.

The public information officer doesn't work on Friday.

(If you happen to have a police band radio you're in luck because you may get the bare facts there.)

Case in point:

Residents were calling our office on Friday morning trying to find out what the heck was happening in the 300 block of Palermo. Police were all over the place, the SWAT team was out and cops with guns were bustling about.

We called the police station to get the story but they referred us to the public information officer.

His day off is Friday, remember? So we were informed, "No one else can give you that information."

And that means that even if you live next door to whatever is taking place and you're afraid to leave your house and you call the police to get information, "no one can give you that information."

The Metro Police Department has a public information officer on duty 24 hours a day, seven days a week to let citizens know what's happening. (The officers in the department take turns.)

And the Metro Police say, in addition, that in reality any police officer can give a brief run-down on the crime picture as long as he's aware of what you're talking about.

Now, we're not saying that the Coral Gables public information officer, or any officer for that matter, doesn't deserve time off from the daily rigors of fighting crime, but certainly there must be at least a couple of cops working on Friday who can keep an eager public informed as to the status quo.

When there is no public information officer, does it mean there is no public information?

Eventually the crime news will be heard on the radio, seen on TV or read about in the paper if the crime is great enough, but that's not the point.

You either have a full time police public information office or you don't.

Metro has one.

Thoughts of the '26 hurricane still cause stomach butterflies

She is 81 years old now, grayhaired and a little bent with age. But her memory of that terrifying night when the 1926 hurricane hit the southwest area of Miami 50 years ago this week is still indelibly clear.

She is Mrs. Sylva Martin, who still resides in the little frame home where she went to bed on that Friday night, Sept. 17, to wake up later to the shriek and the howl of the 150 mile per hour winds that didn't subside until the next day.

"I'll never forget that night as long as I live," she reported. "We had gone to a movie at the old Riviera Theater where the Holsum Bakery building is now on South Dixie Highway.

"I even remember the movie. It was Rudolph Valentino in 'The White Eagle' and when we got

out of the movie about 10:30 the wind was beginning to pick up a little.

"The newspapers had reported that a hurricane was on the way. But no one thought that much about it because no one had ever been through a hurricane.

"I went to bed on the porch. But I woke up later to the most terrible noise I have ever heard. It was the wind, gusting and screaming through the trees.

"I moved inside the house. But none of us got much sleep that night. Later in the night a huge pine tree fell over the porch where I had been sleeping and it crushed the roof like it was a matchbox."

The night was a long one for the Martins and others in the Coral Gables-South Miami area. The eye of the hurricane

didn't come until the next morning about seven o'clock when daylight showed some of the damage done by the wrathful winds.

"Many people then didn't know why the winds had stopped so suddenly," said Mrs. Martin, squinting her eyes in memory. "But we learned later that the eye of the hurricane had passed right over Coral Gables and South Miami.

"And when the lull was over in about an hour, the wind came back from a different direction. I used the period during the dead calm to move my car, a little Dodge road-

ster, to a safer place. And I made it back to the house in time."

In the 50 years since that fateful weekend, there have been many hurricanes to leave their mark in winds and water on Miami.

"But none of them has been as bad as that 1926 hurricane. The '35 storm was a bad one. But that was smaller.

"Nevertheless, whenever there is a hurricane warning, I can't help but think back to the '26 hurricane. I still get butterflies in my stomach, even after 50 years."

Gables band did not show disrespect

EDITOR:

Your recent Letter to the Editor by a Mr. Jack Griffith accuses the Coral Gables Band and it's director of disrespect and discourtesy by "suddenly beginning to play after the Killian Color Guard had begun marching to the center of the field and the Killian Band was in position playing."

Mr. Griffith must have been in another stadium watching another game, for the events he mentions did not take place in that order.

Prior to the game, the Killian Band (home) stood in the north end zone for at least six or seven minutes quietly. The Killian team entered the field and went to their sideline with the band still standing quietly and not playing as their team entered.

The Coral Gables Football Team was still in the south end zone. When our team did enter shortly after Killian's, our band

struck up the school fight song as it does every game. As our team entered and as we began playing as we do each and every game, the Killian Band had yet to play a note of music, the Killian Drum Major had not blown a whistle, nor given a signal, and not one person in that band or color guard had moved from the position they had been standing in for those six or seven minutes.

Our principal and area superintendent were both in attendance and are in agreement with the sequence of events.

While our team was still pouring on the field and while we were playing, the Killian Band did begin it's downfield march, rather than wait until our team had finished entering and we had finished playing.

There are two usually accepted procedures for pre-game Colors in Dade

County and the State of Florida:

1) Present colors prior to both teams entrance to the sideline.

2) Present colors after both teams have entered and are on the sideline." Killian chose to follow neither accepted procedure, but began the presentation of colors with their team on the sideline and Coral Gables still entering.

Furthermore, if the Killian band director had extended the accepted courtesy of the "home team" director calling the "visiting team" director prior to the game to coordinate entrances and exits of the bands at half-time and to inform us of his intentions at pre-game as long as he was not following normal procedures.

Dan Wills, the Killian band director, did not extend this courtesy to us. Fifty-three seconds before half-time, Mr. Wills approached me for the first

time this year and said, "I guess I should have called you this week and let you know what we were doing pre-game to avoid all that confusion." He also began wondering at that time if our band would be exiting through his band's entrance.

This exception to the norm appears to be standard operating procedure at Killian. Last chance to oppose WM tax hike

West Miami taxpayers will have a final opportunity at next Wednesday's 7:30 p.m., Sept. 22, council meeting for a say-so 30 per cent tax increase proposed to support the city's new budget going into effect Oct. 1.

The first of the public hearings was held Sept. 8, when some 24 taxpayers turned out to learn of the city's need for nearly a third more in tax dollars.

"Of the 24 people there for the public hearing on

the millage rate," reported Mayor Edmund Cooper, "three spoke on the increase in taxes."

The mayor added that one of the three complained of the sharp increase in taxes, another thought the budget should have been cut and the third merely wanted to know the reasons for a 30 per cent tax hike.

The city's council listened to the property owners, but nonetheless passed on first reading the millage ordinance.

Before compiling the budget, Mayor Cooper,

the city's administrator, conducted an extensive survey, the results of which showed that most West Miamians would, albeit reluctantly, pay the tax increase to maintain the services they receive.

The city also sent out one of its periodical newsletters to each home in the city explaining the need for the sharp rise in taxes.

"... The budget reflects the desires of West Miamians that the city continue to provide all the present municipal services and their willingness to pay the necessary in-

crease in taxes," the mayor pointed out in the newsletter.

Mayor Cooper credits the spending of a \$112,000 surplus in the current budget, higher costs of workmen's compensation, vehicle and medical insurance and increased costs of operating vehicles for much of the anticipated ad valorem tax hike.

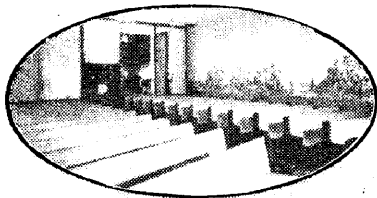

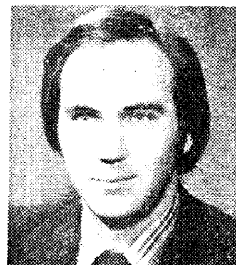

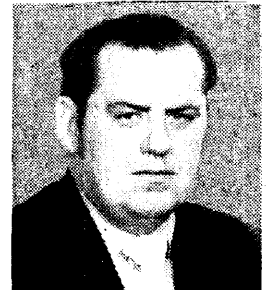

24-year-old rabbi heads new Jewish worship center

Just this month, a new Jewish worship and education center — the Chabad House — opened on the University of Miami campus.

The center, located at 1540 Alangra Ave., on fraternity row, will not only cater to university students but to the surrounding Jewish community as well. Twenty-

four-year-old Rabbi David Eliezie is director.

"We are offering a multi-faceted program," Rabbi Eliezie said. "The center will be everything from a kosher-pizza-felafel shop to a yeshiva."

There will be an education center that will begin offering five courses the week of Sept. 27. Jewish Mysticism, Jewish Philosophy, Modern Hebrew,

Jewish Cooking, Chassidic Philosophy, and Tal-

mud will be taught evenings at no fee.

Various worship activities will also be held at the Chabad House. High Holiday services in the classical Jewish tradition will be offered Saturday, Sept. 18, beginning at midnight.

Nicknamed by the Rabbi as the "Midnight Special," the service will be a traditional Slichos service.

Rosh Hashana services will be held at campus fraternity houses, but a major Simchat Torah celebration will be held outside the Chabad House, Saturday, Sept. 23, beginning at 8 p.m. The street will be closed off, and everyone from college students to members of Coral Gables' Temple Judea congregation and residents of South Dade are invited.

Friday evenings, Sabbath Eve activities will be offered, and those interested can participate in traditional Sabbath meals, classes and worship services.

"We call that our Shabbos Experiential program," the rabbi said.

Rabbi Eliezie explained that Chabad House is de-

signed to serve as a resource to existing Jewish institutions in the South Dade area, and its aim is to work closely with the community.

A community board, known as the South Dade Executive Committee, composed of many South Dade residents, underwrites the expenses of the center's activities and those of other community Jewish agencies. Paul Kaplan is chairman.

In the near future, the center will set up a 24-hour hot line, which problem-ridden Jewish students can call. The staff manning the hot line will talk to the student, whether his anxiety be over a fight with a girlfriend or confusion in his spiritual life, and help him define the problem.

The rabbi said he intends for the center to offer friendship and spiritual direction in an informal, but meaningful manner.

"The rabbi doesn't stand in a pulpit and look down on the congregation," he said. "I work together with the people instead of condescending, and everyone calls me 'David' not 'Rabbi Eliezie'."

"So many young Jewish people are alienated today. They are the victims of poor Jewish education and lack of true Jewish exposure. Hopefully, this program — which is strictly student-run — will offer outreach stressing the old values.

"You have to work with young people on a gut level," he said.

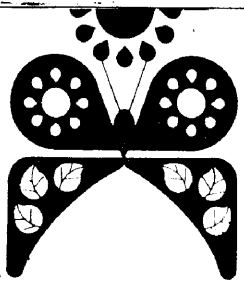

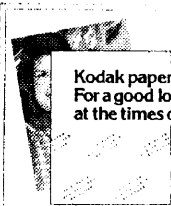

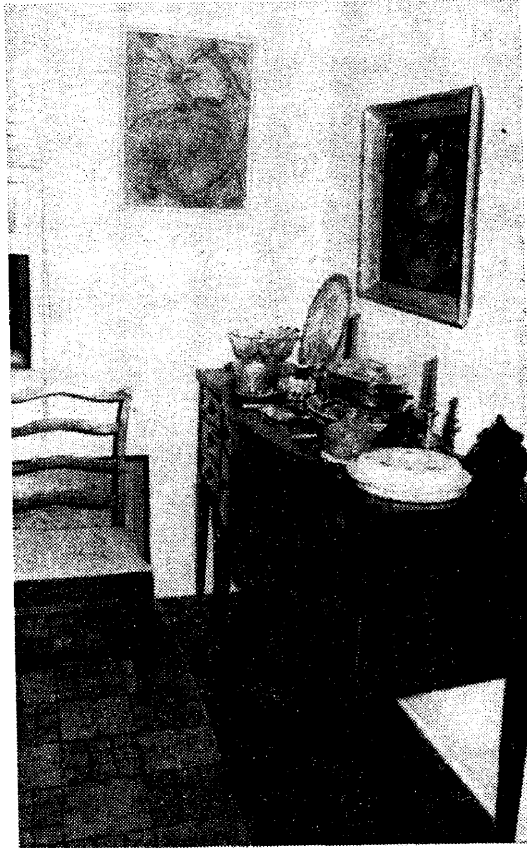

She lives in one of the oldest homes in Coral Gables and in it she keeps what she calls her beautiful "precious trash."

The home of Mrs. Hazel Harrison, long-time Gableite, artist and poet, is like a gallery depicting her life — a life of adventure and travel.

Born in Jamaica of British and Spanish parentage, Mrs. Harrison studied art in Canada. She became a nurse during the First World War and worked in that capacity in Mexico, Cuba, England

and Switzerland.

When she first moved to Coral Gables in 1937, she brought with her many of her paintings. Mrs. Harrison was the founder of the Blue Dome Art Fellowship and the Coral Gables Art Group, of which she is now an honorary member.

Even the landscaping of the home reflects Mrs. Harrison's artistic talents.

She spends many hours in her backyard, where the vegetation is as lush as any tropical garden, and extremely well manicured.

"I love gardening. I

rake the leaves almost every day and I really enjoy it. I also feed the birds that come to my garden.

"I call it my jungle," Mrs. Harrison said proudly as she opened the back door that leads to the yard. "Everything grows back here. I have all kinds of fruit trees — banana, orange, lemon and akee, a native fruit of Jamaica. And flowers, yes, many flowers."

Reflected in many of her paintings that decorate the dining room and kitchen walls are pictures of the various fruits that grow in her garden.

Furnishing the dining area are neo-classical pieces that were bought nearly 40 years ago. A dark wood table, chairs, old-fashioned china cabinet, server and commode make up the pieces of the dining set.

Mixed with the colorful

fruit paintings are Mrs. Harrison's portraits of Jamaican natives done in their native land.

Across the wall that separates the foyer from the living room is an array of Mrs. Harrison's classical paintings. The rustic walls of the antique home are accentuated by rugged red tiles that decorate the floor of the en-

'Seen, not heard' philosophy could do harm

In the "old days," children were supposed to be seen and not heard.

Today, such a philosophy could and often does severely harm a child's emotional health, accord-

ing to Dr. Stephen Mack, a 28-year-old South Dade psychotherapist.

Dr. Mack, who is active with the Mental Health Association of Dade County as a volunteer in the "Listen To Children" program, kicked off the

year's first training session Tuesday morning, Sept. 14. He spoke in Coral Gables to a large group of prospective volunteers.

"Always treat children as if they were adults, but don't expect them to act like adults," he said.

Whatever the problem, Dr. Mack said, children manifest the stress they feel in their behavior: they become withdrawn, they become aggressive, or they become compla-

cent about school work.

This is where the volunteer comes in. He or she goes into the school at least once a week for two hours, talks to the young student, finds out what might be bothering him, and simply listens.

Love and affection is most often what's missing in these children's home lives, said the young psychotherapist. All they may need is someone to really communicate with.

"Love is something you can't measure statistically, or something you can put down on paper," he said. "It is unequivocally the most important element in raising an emotionally healthy child.

"And it is just as important for all human beings, at all stages of development."

Dr. Mack, who proudly sports a "Have You Hugged Your Kid?" sticker on his car bumper, said the

motto should be broadened to read, "Have You Hugged Anyone You Care About Today?"

"When we get down into the realms of feeling, aren't we all pretty much the same?" he asked. "If you feel good about who you are, what you are, you've usually got it made.

"But many of these kids are not so lucky. Your job is to listen, and to really hear them."

Horse lovers ride at Ponce Jr. High

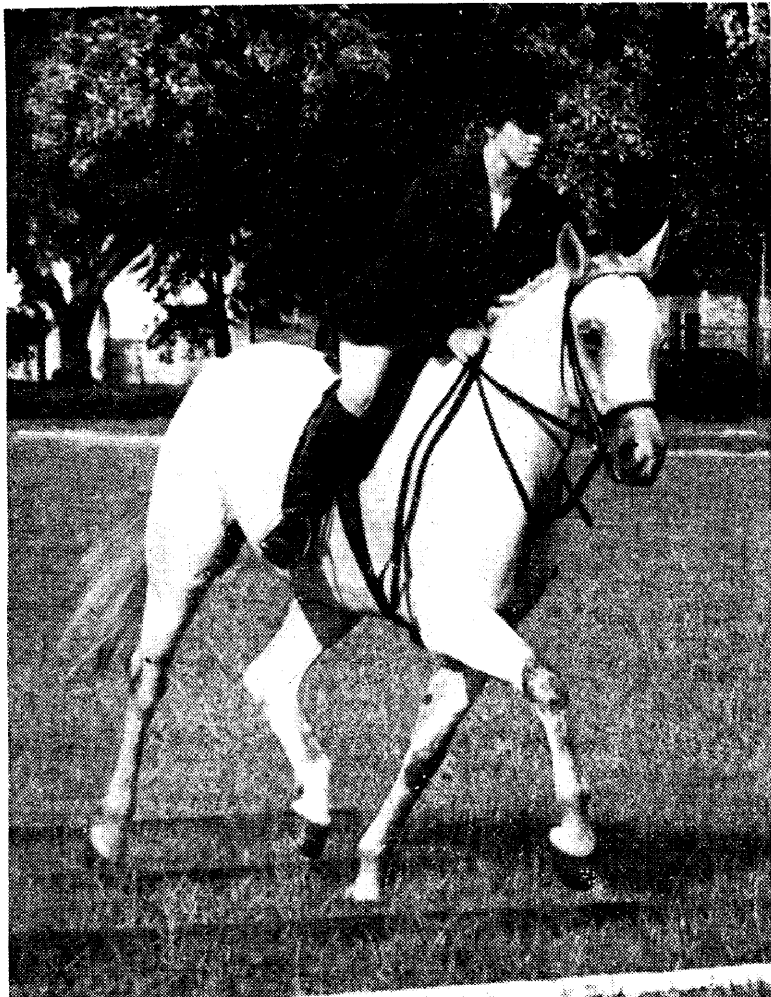
