

Needs more customers for telephone program

By ELIZABETH OWEN

Cora Dudley is in a fix: she needs more lonely people.

"I have no lonely people in Coral Gables, and I know there are some. I just can't reach them.'

Cora Dudley, a tall, stately woman of 87, is director of the South Dade branch of the Telephone Reassurance Program.

Organized under the Urban Ministries of the United Methodist Church of Greater Miami, the Telephone Reassurance Program was started in June, 1974, to recruit volunteers to call elderly people who live alone, at a set time every day - to check on them and keep them company.

Cora, who lives in Cutler Ridge, is in charge of 70 volunteers and 65 "subscribers" or lonely senior citizens living in the southwest area of the county. She has been involved in the program since its inception.

"We had only three lonely people to take care of at first, but the program has really snowballed," she said.

The director has all areas under control except Coral Gables. She has a number of willing volunteers in the area, but no one for them to call.

'We call an elderly person who lives alone once a day at a designated time, to check on his or her well-being," she explained. "When we find a person in need, we step in and offer them the different services of Dade County.'

Big roller skating rink coming to S. Miami

South Dade youngsters will have a new recreation facility soon, the largest roller skating rink in Florida.

The rink will be constructed through extensive renovations of a former supermarket at 6600 Red Road. The building has been unoccupied for several months.

A firm headed by W.L. Cox, the owner of the another skating rink at NW 103rd Street and the Palmetto Expressway, will construct and operate the South Miami rink.

But first Cox and his

business associates must get needed licenses and building permits from the City of South Miami.

"After that," Cox said, "we can get the work going and have the rink operating in a month or two."

Cox discussed his proposed roller rink with the South Miami council Aug. 17, in an effort to cut red tape and get the project's wheels in motion.

When Cox first approached the city for permission to convert the former supermarket, the city's building department

At a mere 16, he's already a master of illusion

The young magician picks someone from his audience, then asks the volunteer to write his name on a piece of paper.

Then, the magician burns the paper.

Dramatically, he rolls up his sleeves and rubs the ashes on his arm.

The spectator's name appears.

Like magic.

That is Wiley Maher's favorite trick and it's always the last one he does in a magic show, because it's a little messy.

Wiley, 16, of SW 62nd Terrace, is the son of Terry and Shirley Maher.

He is also known as Magilla the Great, a magician, and he performs for meetings or parties, for adults or children, for charity or a small fee but mostly for fun.

"When I was sixyears-old, my dad got me a magic box from Sears for Christmas," Wiley remembers. "I started doing little shows in the backyard, charging the kids 25 cents each.

tricks. My grandparents would send them to me. Pretty soon, I started inventing tricks of my own.

Wiley started advertising as Magilla the Great two years ago. His mother suggested the name, based on the cartoon character Magilla the Gorilla, who once stated, 'If this is show business, I'll take bananas."

Wiley will take show business.

Three tall candles stand in a pronged candelabra.

The magician lights them, then blows out the

He slips a slik sheath over each candle. Then he lights the wicks again.

When he blows out the flames again, one by one, the sheaths collapse

The candles have disappeared.

Like magic.

"Most of the time, real young kids aren't as responsive as the older ones or the adults," Wiley explains. "But the ash trick "Then I got some more catches their attention



and so does the trick with the candles.

hardest "That's mv trick. You have three chances to mess it up but if you do it right, all that's left is the silk.'

Wiley purchases tricks at magic shops and then works on them to make them both more dramatic and more difficult. He finds that improvising tests his skills and saves him money.

A first class table-top trick can cost \$30 - and Wiley's fee for a show is just between \$20 and \$25.

His largest audience to date has been a charity performance, though, for a group of Boy Scouts at Snapper Creek Elementary School. The show went off without a hitch.

"You just go on."

The magician's table holds a small circus wagon-type cage. It is brightly painted outside and black inside. The magician puts a ballon in the cage and blows it up, tying the end. He covers the cage with a piece of silk cloth.

The magician steps back and whisks the cloth off the cage. The audience looks at the balloon. It

"It's cheaper to make your own tricks. And you can make a whole production out of a \$2 trick . . . you can take a small illusion and make it really nice."

He hands a sealed envelope to a member of the audience. It holds a duplicate of one of the cards.

Wiley doesn't mean to be disillusioning, but he admits, "There's magic. It's all tricks and illusions. A trick is done out front where everyone can see just what you are doing. An illusion leads you to believe something that isn't really happening.

But don't expect him to explain his tricks and illusions.

"People want to know, but they really don't want to know," he explains. "Once you know how an illusion works, it's lost. The fun is gone.'



Suspects in Kendale burglaries arrested

Twenty-year-old Joseph Maskevich, who lives at 8659 SW 137th Ave ., has been charged with a rash of house burglaries.

"He is charged with committing 28 burglaries in his own neighborhood, and it has taken us a year to get the suspect," said Det. Ruffo. "It was only through citizen cooperation in the Kendale Lakes area that we were able to catch up with him."



Quell 'outrage' with court action

Two Coral Gables residents, dubbing themselves "outraged citizens", wrote us a letter which we published in last Wednesday's edition.

The gist of the correspondence was that the firing of Coral Gables police officers for conduct unbecoming was mild punishment for alleged acts of wrongdoing - sexual relations with a 15-year-old girl being among them.

We agree — if the allegations that led to the dismissals are true. And the truth of the matter is something for the courts to decide, if an ongoing state attorney's investigation finds reason to bring it to that stage.

We think it will. The officers involved deserve a fair shake and only a full court hearing will enable innocence or guilt to be determined.

Court action will clear the air that has been clouded by the city's administrative action. And it should serve to quell the "outraged citizens"

Cops' leaking roof no laughing matter

The picture on Page 1 of this issue may well bring a smile to the faces of those whose tax dollars weren't laid out to finance a practically new police and fire station that leaks like a sieve.

But the sight of Coral Gables police department secretaries armed not only with typewriters and steno pads, but umbrellas as well, is no laughing matter.

Not when millions were spent to build a fortress, only to later discover that it can't even fend off the wrath of Mother Nature.

Leaking roofs and walls, no jail, a parking lot with impossibly tight turns and support columns lacking supporting steel all add up to an unsound investment

Coral Gables city commissioners should launch an investigation into the building's brief but inglorious history.

If the city administration is at fault, through inadequate planning, heads should roll. If the builder ignored plans and specifications to cut corners, financial restitution should be made.

Of South Dade's swamps, mosquitos and things that go 'ribet' in the night

Wearing proper frog stalking attire, the flashlight-toting nature freaks gathered on a rainy, windy night to learn about, then seek out those tailless amphibians that dwell in the swamps of South Dade.

There was an eerie feeling as the caravan of cars inched along an unpaved, pot-holed road in search of the perfect frog observation post, that niche in the Everglades were you can hear and identify the mating calls of several different spe-

Forewarned and armed with insect repellent, nearly 30 people showed up last Wednesday night to partcipate in a "frog walk" sponsored by the Castellow Hammock Environmental Education Center in South Dade. Threatening skies might not have been the best weather for a hike, but for identifying frogs it was ideal.

After a short lecture at the center, naturalist Sally Black led young and old nature lovers on an expedition through the Everglades.

Some caught tree frogs so that others could listen to their call, while others identified squirrel tree frogs by their duck-like sounds and the leopard frog by its multi-colored skin.

Only once did the group hear the illusive cho-

All flashlights went off, so as not to scare it. The sound it made was akin to a finger going down along the teeth a comb.

"I still can't believe I went out there," said Mrs. Frances Meltzer, a South Miami resident who frog-hunted with the best of them.

"If anyone would have seen us out there traveling along that gutty, rut-filled road to look for frogs, they would have thought we were all crazy," she said. "But I'm glad I went because it opened a whole new world of sound that exists out there. The walk was truly delightful."

Accompanying Mrs.-Meltzer were her children, Elizabeth 10, and John, 8, and a friend of the family, 13-year-old Joseph Bryant.

"It was fun getting all muddy and looking for frogs," said Elizabeth, a student at Ludlam Elementary School. "It became muddier and rockier as we drove on, but the only time it got a little scary was when we crossed a bridge with no rails," she said.

WM taxes will rise this year

City of West Miami property owners will pay more in city taxes in the budget year beginning Oct. 1, but services will change little, if any.

This is the essence of the city's proposed budget, which was presented to the West Miami council last Wednesday night.

"It's a skimpy budget," said Mayor Edmund Cooper, "very lean. We are giving small raises to city employes and there is nothing for capital improvements."

The city has set next Wednesday, Aug. 25, as the date for a public hearing on the budget, but Mayor Cooper doesn't believe there will be many in attendance at the hear-

Cooper said a recent survey of West Miamians showed that the citizenry wants the same level of services and is willing to pay for them.

"But the survey also showed that they don't want addi tional taxes for frills and capital improvements that are not necessary," the mayor added.

The millage rate, the medium through which property taxes are generated into dollars to meet needed revenue, will go from this year's 6.009 to 7.5 mills in the coming budget year.

This means that West Miami property owners will pay \$7.50 per each \$1,000 of assessed property, as compared to \$6 for the current budget.

Because of the planned tax increase, two additional public hearings will be required before the city's council passes the millage ordinance next month. But the mayor reported that the dates for the millage ordinance public hearings haven't been set.

Cooper credits the proposed tax increase to the spending in the current budget of a surplus of \$112,000, skyrocketing costs of all forms of insurance and raises for city employes.

CG police station is no dry refuge from downpour

Chief William Kimbrough of the Coral Gables Police Department was up to his ankles in water Thursday, Aug. 19.

When he came to work in the morning, glad to escape the downpour outside, he found his office to be only slightly drier. Water was streaming from the ceiling and corners, the rug was soaked and his desk had to be moved out of the way of a steady drizzle from above.

The chief, patient but with dampened spirits, was forced to pace through the corridors of the year-old police station while 13 buckets caught the constant dribble in his office.

Chief Kimbrough's office was only one of many on the second floor of the nearly new station that was soaked. The floor of the conference room had to be strategically lined with buckets, and the chief's secretaries, Nancy Powell and Rita DiNicola, kept umbrellas close to their desks.

"We've used about all the wastebaskets we can get hold of, and we bought 25 plastic pails this morning," said Capt. Robert Beckerich, who keeps a record of leaks in the new building.

"We really need 25 more. We've got leaks on every floor but the first."

Captain Beckerich said this week's torrential downpour was not the first that caused the department to break out the buckets.

Since the Gables police moved into the new building at 2801 Salzedo in June of last year, the rains have come through the roof on four other occassions.

"But this is the worst yet," said Capt. Beckerich. "We called the weather bureau this morning and they said that since 6 p.m. Wednesday, Aug. 18, and 9:30 a.m. Thursday, Aug. 19, we've had 4.44 inches of rain."

The captain added that when a storm comes from the northwest, the huge front windows of the station leak, causing the front lobby to flood.

Although the worst of the storm had diminished to a drizzle by mid-afternoon, department employes had to continue their work amid puddles and the plop, plop, plopping of persistent drips. Coral Gables Police Chief.

Cross, United Way Home Care Services, Visiting Nurse Association, the Veterans Administration and the Dade County Police Department are just a few of the agencies Cora and her organization call upon for help.

"Many times, our volunteers go much further than just calling," said Cora. "They fall in love with their senior citizens, and visit them and have them to their homes as well."

One of the main reasons the program was started was the high incidence of senseless accidents and deaths among the elderly, who fell down in the night or became ill and were unable to get help.

"When a volunteer can't reach a subscriber at the designated time, she'll call me, and I'll try to contact a neighbor of the senior citizen," said Cora. "If I can't reach a neighbor, then I'll call police and they'll check on the person."

Coral recalls several such incidents, when the police had to break down the door to reach a person ple. who had slipped and broken a limb, unable to reach the telephone.

case involved One Cora's youngest subscriber, a diabetic and epileptic woman in her 40s, who lives alone in Cutler

Cora said the woman's volunteer, unable to reach her, called Cora, who alerted police.

"We knew it was an emergency because of the woman's condition," said Cora. "When the emergency rescue squad got there, within 10 minutes, they found the woman. She had had a seizure, her nose was broken, her face was cut up and she was unconscious.

"But she's home doing fine today, thanks to the volunteer."

The Telephone Reassurance program doesn't cater only to such emergencies, however. Although it has no funds from which to draw, volunteers often find people at their churches and in their neighborhoods willing to contribute small niceties to lonely old peo-
