Are there no lonely people in CG? Cutler Ridge resident wants to know

Needs more customers for telephone program

Cora Dudley is in a fix: she needs more lonely people.

"I have no lonely people in Coral Gables, and I know there are some. I just can't reach them."

Cora Dudley, a tall, stately woman of 87, is director of the South Dade branch of the Telephone Reassurance Program.

Organized under the Urban Ministries of the United Methodist Church of Greater Miami, the Telephone Reassurance Program was started in June, 1974, to recruit volunteers to call elderly people who live alone, at a set time every day — to check on them and keep them company.

Cora, who lives in Cutler Ridge, is in charge of 70 volunteers and 65 "subscribers" or lonely senior citizens living in the southwest area of the county. She has been involved in the program since its inception.

"We had only three lonely people to take care of at first, but the program has really snowballed," she said.

The director has all areas under control except Coral Gables. She has a number of willing volunteers in the area, but no one for them to call.

"We call an elderly person who lives alone once a day at a designated time, to check on his or her well-being," she explained. "When we find a person in need, we step in and offer them the different services of Dade County."

Big roller skating rink coming to S. Miami

South Dade youngsters will have a new recreation facility soon, the largest roller skating rink in Florida.

The rink will be constructed through extensive renovations of a former supermarket at 6600 Red Road. The building has been unoccupied for several months.

A firm headed by W.L. Cox, the owner of the another skating rink at NW 103rd Street and the Palmetto Expressway, will construct and operate the South Miami rink.

But first Cox and his

business associates must get needed licenses and building permits from the City of South Miami.

"After that," Cox said, "we can get the work going and have the rink operating in a month or two."

Cox discussed his proposed roller rink with the South Miami council Aug. 17, in an effort to cut red tape and get the project's wheels in motion.

When Cox first approached the city for permission to convert the former supermarket, the city's building department

Concerned residents and members of the Miami Heights Elementary School PTA are urging the five Metro Commissioners who voted for the widening and straightening of SW 117th Avenue

to reconsider their vote before school starts.

Meanwhile, spokesman for the county manager's office said the manager has instructed Public Works not to start construction until officials have had a chance to re-

consider the project.

A group of Miami Heights homeowners, concerned about the safety of their school-age children, had requested a cul-de-sac in front of Miami Heights Elementary School, 17661 SW

117th Ave.

On July 20, however, Metro Commissioners voted in favor of an alternative proposal offered by Metro's Traffic and Transportation director.

Wily Wiley Maher

At a mere 16, he's already a master of illusion

The young magician picks someone from his audience, then asks the volunteer to write his name on a piece of paper.

Then, the magician burns the paper.

Dramatically, he rolls up his sleeves and rubs the ashes on his arm.

The spectator's name appears.

Like magic.

★ ★ ★

That is Wiley Maher's favorite trick and it's always the last one he does in a magic show, because it's a little messy.

Wiley, 16, of SW 62nd Terrace, is the son of Terry and Shirley Maher.

He is also known as Magilla the Great, a magician, and he performs for meetings or parties, for adults or children, for charity or a small fee — but mostly for fun.

"When I was six-years-old, my dad got me a magic box from Sears for Christmas," Wiley remembers. "I started doing little shows in the backyard, charging the kids 25 cents each.

"Then I got some more

tricks. My grandparents would send them to me. Pretty soon, I started inventing tricks of my own."

Wiley started advertising as Magilla the Great two years ago. His mother suggested the name, based on the cartoon character Magilla the Gorilla, who once stated, "If this is show business, I'll take bananas."

Wiley will take show business.

★ ★ ★

Three tall candles stand in a pronged candelabra.

The magician lights them, then blows out the flames.

He slips a slick sheath over each candle. Then he lights the wicks again.

When he blows out the flames again, one by one, the sheaths collapse — empty.

The candles have disappeared.

Like magic.

★ ★ ★

"Most of the time, real young kids aren't as responsive as the older ones or the adults," Wiley explains. "But the ash trick catches their attention

and so does the trick with the candles.

"That's my hardest trick. You have three chances to mess it up — but if you do it right, all that's left is the silk."

Wiley purchases tricks at magic shops and then works on them to make them both more dramatic and more difficult. He finds that improvising tests his skills and saves him money.

A first class table-top trick can cost \$30 — and Wiley's fee for a show is just between \$20 and \$25.

His largest audience to date has been a charity performance, though, for a group of Boy Scouts at Snapper Creek Elementary School. The show went off without a hitch.

"I don't mess up much

in front of people," Wiley said. "But when you blow one, you can ad lib and the audience never knows.

"You just go on."

★ ★ ★

The magician's table holds a small circus wagon-type cage. It is brightly painted outside and black inside. The magician puts a ballon in the cage and blows it up, tying the end. He covers the cage with a piece of silk cloth.

The magician steps back and whisks the cloth off the cage. The audience looks at the balloon. It pops.

And a rabbit is standing inside the cage.

Like magic.

★ ★ ★

"I use the rabbit trick

to open my shows. It's really an eye opener," Wiley says. "You have to start out with a super trick to get everyone's attention."

The teenager isn't thinking of magic as a business; it's a hobby and it would be a hard way to make a living.

"If you are really good, you can keep it up professionally," Wiley explains, "but it takes money to get started. I've found that the best time to buy tricks is when a store is closing up and wants to get rid of them.

"It's cheaper to make your own tricks. And you can make a whole production out of a \$2 trick . . . you can take a small illusion and make it really nice."

The magician stands in front of a pedestal he designed. He holds up five large cards.

Each is marked differently — with a star, a circle, a set of lines, a square and a plus sign.

He hands a sealed envelope to a member of the audience. It holds a duplicate of one of the cards.

He shuffles the cards on

the podium. He cuts the deck several times. He asks an audience member to tell him when to stop cutting the deck.

When stopped, he always asks, "Are you a sure? Do you want me to do it again?"

But it doesn't make any difference.

No matter where the magician is told to stop, the top card will match the card in the sealed envelope.

Like magic.

★ ★ ★

Wiley doesn't mean to be disillusioning, but he admits, "There's no magic. It's all tricks and illusions. A trick is done out front where everyone can see just what you are doing. An illusion leads you to believe something that isn't really happening."

You can reach Magilla the Great at 271-0381.

But don't expect him to explain his tricks and illusions.

"People want to know, but they really don't want to know," he explains. "Once you know how an illusion works, it's lost. The fun is gone."

or 5, and silverware and cash were taken. Officers said the thief apparently gained entry by prying open a door.

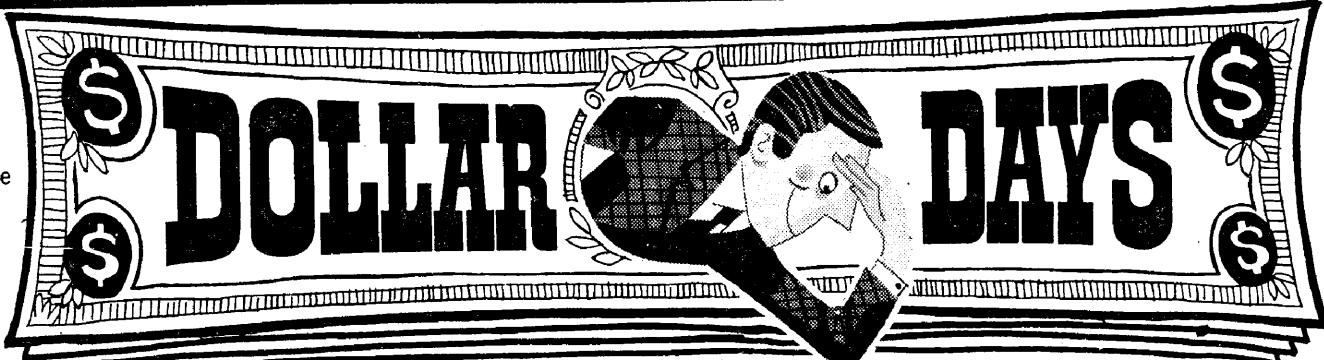

Suspects in Kendale burglaries arrested

Two suspected cat burglars and a self-confessed plant thief who have been plaguing South Dade neighborhoods have been apprehended.

According to Detective Joseph Ruffo of the Metro West District substation, one cat burglar suspect, who has allegedly been creeping into the homes in the Kendale Lakes area for the past year, was arrested this week.

Twenty-year-old Joseph Maskevich, who lives at 8659 SW 137th Ave., has been charged with a rash of house burglaries.

"He is charged with committing 28 burglaries in his own neighborhood, and it has taken us a year to get the suspect," said Det. Ruffo. "It was only through citizen cooperation in the Kendale Lakes area that we were able to catch up with him."

Tuesday, Aug. 10, police arrested a second young man, also suspected of neighborhood cat burglaries.

Ruffo said Clarence Banks, 23, of northwest Dade, has been charged with five counts of burglary and two counts of grand larceny. Banks had allegedly been sneaking into homes in the South Miami area and making

off with goods while families were sleeping, the detective said.

"Banks is charged with stealing from homes in the Red Road and Sunset Drive area for the past three weeks," said Det. Ruffo.

The plant thief suspect, who seems to have a preference for staghorn ferns, is charged with stealing expensive plants from homes in the west end of the county during much of 1975, according to police.

Clarence Gray, 22, who lives at 8777 SW 72nd St., is suspected of at least 11 plant thefts in the neighborhood, said the detective.

"Gray admitted the thefts, and cooperated fully with us, but since he

had sold the ferns at flea markets around town, we have no physical evidence," said Det. Ruffo.

"He told us he worked the area from the Palmetto Expressway west of SW 92nd Avenue for an entire year before he was caught.

"I have no idea why he admitted the crimes, but he did."

The detective said Gray was charged with loitering and prowling, because none of the stolen plants have been tracked down for use as evidence against him.

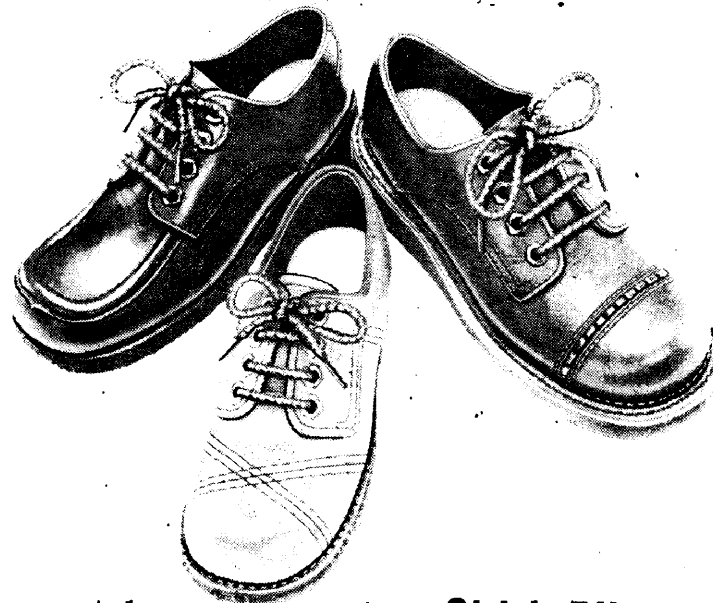

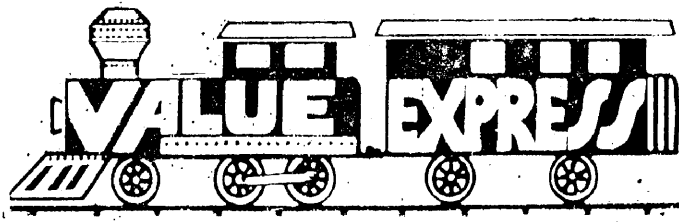

Quell 'outrage' with court action

Two Coral Gables residents, dubbing themselves "outraged citizens", wrote us a letter which we published in last Wednesday's edition.

The gist of the correspondence was that the firing of Coral Gables police officers for conduct unbecoming was mild punishment for alleged acts of wrongdoing — sexual relations with a 15-year-old girl being among them.

We agree — if the allegations that led to the dismissals are true. And the truth of the matter is something for the courts to decide, if an ongoing state attorney's investigation finds reason to bring it to that stage.

We think it will. The officers involved deserve a fair shake and only a full court hearing will enable innocence or guilt to be determined.

Court action will clear the air that has been clouded by the city's administrative action. And it should serve to quell the "outraged citizens" among us.

Cops' leaking roof no laughing matter

The picture on Page 1 of this issue may well bring a smile to the faces of those whose tax dollars weren't laid out to finance a practically new police and fire station that leaks like a sieve.

But the sight of Coral Gables police department secretaries armed not only with typewriters and steno pads, but umbrellas as well, is no laughing matter.

Not when millions were spent to build a fortress, only to later discover that it can't even fend off the wrath of Mother Nature.

Leaking roofs and walls, no jail, a parking lot with impossibly tight turns and support columns lacking supporting steel all add up to an unsound investment.

Coral Gables city commissioners should launch an investigation into the building's brief but inglorious history.

If the city administration is at fault, through inadequate planning, heads should roll. If the builder ignored plans and specifications to cut corners, financial restitution should be made.

Of South Dade's swamps, mosquitos and things that go 'ribet' in the night

Wearing proper frog stalking attire, the flashlight-toting nature freaks gathered on a rainy, windy night to learn about, then seek out those tailless amphibians that dwell in the swamps of South Dade.

There was an eerie feeling as the caravan of cars inched along an unpaved, pot-holed road in search of the perfect frog observation post, that niche in the Everglades where you can hear and identify the mating calls of several different species of frogs.

Forewarned and armed with insect repellent, nearly 30 people showed up last Wednesday night to participate in a "frog walk" sponsored by the Castellow Hammock Environmental Education Center in South Dade. Threatening skies might not have been the best weather for a hike, but for identifying frogs it was ideal.

After a short lecture at the center, naturalist Sally Black led young and old nature lovers on an expedition through the Everglades.

Some caught tree frogs so that others could listen to their call, while others identified squirrel tree frogs by their duck-like sounds and the leopard frog by its multi-colored skin.

Only once did the group hear the illusive chorus frog.

All flashlights went off, so as not to scare it. The sound it made was akin to a finger going down along the teeth a comb.

"I still can't believe I went out there," said Mrs. Frances Meltzer, a South Miami resident who frog-hunted with the best of them.

"If anyone would have seen us out there traveling along that gutty, rut-filled road to look for frogs, they would have thought we were all crazy," she said. "But I'm glad I went because it opened a whole new world of sound that exists out there. The walk was truly delightful."

Accompanying Mrs. Meltzer were her children, Elizabeth 10, and John, 8, and a friend of the family, 13-year-old Joseph Bryant.

"It was fun getting all muddy and looking for frogs," said Elizabeth, a student at Ludlam Elementary School. "It became muddier and rockier as we drove on, but the only time it got a little scary was when we crossed a bridge with no rails," she said.

"I got to learn all the different sounds that frogs make and see what they look like," said Joseph, a student at Ponce de Leon Junior High. "I didn't catch any frogs, but I saw leopard frogs and squirrel frogs and even a baby tree frog," he said.

Wednesday's program was the first of its kind offered at Castellow Hammock. The first frog-walk, scheduled last June, was rained out, according to Ms. Black, a biologist who has been at the South Dade park for more than two years.

There is a wide variety of evening programs at the education center, located at 22301 SW 162nd Ave., at least once a month.

Among programs scheduled for September are a beekeeping lecture and a workshop on edible plants.

The edible plant workshop will be held Sunday, Sept. 12 at 2:30 p.m. and there is a \$3 fee. The beekeeping program will be taught by Sterling Tucker, a beekeeper from North Miami, on Thursday, Sept. 16, at 8 p.m.

WM taxes will rise this year

City of West Miami property owners will pay more in city taxes in the budget year beginning Oct. 1, but services will change little, if any.

This is the essence of the city's proposed budget, which was presented to the West Miami council last Wednesday night.

"It's a skimpy budget," said Mayor Edmund Cooper, "very lean. We are giving small raises to city employes and there is nothing for capital improvements."

The city has set next Wednesday, Aug. 25, as the date for a public hearing on the budget, but Mayor Cooper doesn't believe there will be many in attendance at the hearing.

Cooper said a recent survey of West Miamians showed that the citizenry wanted the same level of services and is willing to pay for them.


"But the survey also showed that they don't want additional taxes for frills and capital improvements that are not necessary," the mayor added.

The millage rate, the medium through which property taxes are generated into dollars to meet needed revenue, will go from this year's 6.009 to 7.5 mills in the coming budget year.

This means that West Miami property owners will pay \$7.50 per each \$1,000 of assessed property, as compared to \$6 for the current budget.

Because of the planned tax increase, two additional public hearings will be required before the city's council passes the millage ordinance next month. But the mayor reported that the dates for the millage ordinance public hearings haven't been set.

Cooper credits the proposed tax increase to the spending in the current budget of a surplus of \$112,000, skyrocketing costs of all forms of insurance and raises for city employes.

Young pianist returns God's gift through music

When Laura Maxey was six years old, there was no piano at home.

But in nursery school — at Granada Presbyterian Church — there was.

The curious pre-schooler developed a fascination for the instrument, and found she could not leave it alone.

"I was always playing it," said Laura, now 17. "My nursery school teacher, Mrs. Allen, finally called my parents and said, 'You'd better get this child a piano.'"

So when the Maxeys moved into their new home on SW 96th Street, their first piece of furniture was a piano — a Wur-litzer Upright.

Laura began taking lessons and before she knew it, she was being asked to accompany various music groups, to teach lessons herself and even to try her hand at composing.

The senior at Westminster Christian School has a Knabe Baby Grande now, and she still can't leave those 88s alone.

She practices two to

three hours a day on school days and four to five hours a day on week-ends.

"It interferes a little bit with my social life . . . a lot of times I'll have to forego something I'd like to do, but you have to sacrifice if you want to get anywhere," she said.

There are considerable demands on Laura's time, besides practicing.

She is a church pianist at University Baptist Church. If a guest soloist comes to the church — like Claude Rhea, director of the music department at Samford University in Birmingham, Ala., two years ago — she must accompany him.

When the Anita Bryant Singers came to University, they too asked Laura to join them, there and at the Around the World Fair at Tropical Park.

"Playing at the church is the greatest experience I could have," said Laura. "It comes easily to me, and the people appreciate it and let me know."

"I just feel it's a good way to use my talent for the Lord — since He gave me the talent."

Her older sister Anita did play the piano as well, but gave it up in high school to become a cheerleader.

Her 13-year-old sister Michelle plays the flute in the school band, and older brother Richard, who sings baritone, was president of the Concert Chorus at Palmetto Senior High School.

In the summer of '75, Laura was chosen to play with one of the student orchestras at the Eastern Music Festival in Greensboro, N.C., after she won runnerup in the concerto competition. This past May, she had her own

solo recital at Gusman Hall. Four hundred people showed up to hear her play selections from Bach, Beethoven, Chopin, Ravel, Griffes, Dohnany and Ginastera for an hour and a half.

"I'm still recovering from that," she admitted.

At Westminster, Laura and another pianist take turns accompanying the school choir. When the school band goes to the Solo and Ensemble Festival to perform for band ratings, Laura plays along.

Receiving the inevitable honors for her efforts takes its toll, too. Recognition at an early age makes the budding pianist even more conscious of where she wants to go. She said her teachers over the years — first Pamela Bedingfield, then Phyllis Warren, and now Rosalina Sackstein — have not pressured her to go to a conservatory.

"I would prefer a school with a strong music department to a conservatory," she said candidly.

"There's plenty of time for a conservatory later, she added.

Whenever the young pianist feels her head swelling from her success, she is brought back to reality with a jolt.

"The minute I start feeling good about myself, something comes along to knock me down, to make me realize I'm going to have to work as hard as anyone else," she said.

"You tend to rest on your laurels if you get too proud."

be able to take it with us," she added.

The antique mantle has gay, hand-painted dark blue, red and yellow flowers.

Almost all the furniture in the living room is more than 100 years old. The Victorian couch and chairs have been reupholstered in a green and yellow cut velvet with a dainty floral pattern. And on both sides of the upright piano are two

old French commodes, a part of the antique collection passed down to Mrs. Steubins from her mother.

The family room is lit by double stained glass window panes that Steubins framed and made into a light fixture. When the Steubins' four teenagers — Jeffery, David, Liza and Mindy — want to give the room a disco flavor, they just dim the lights that come through the green and yellow stained glass.

Eugene Simm, which would eliminate the historically treacherous S-curve near the school.

Simm's proposal would do away with the school's parking lot so that SW 117th Avenue could be straightened and made into a two-lane road with off-street parking on both sides.

Mildred Cobb, principal of Miami Heights Elementary School, Barbara Check, PTA president, and Susan Burt, spokesperson for the homeowners association, all feel that Simm's plan would only create more traffic problems in the already accident-plagued school area.

"The cul-de-sac would be the ideal plan, but if they take our entire parking lot away I don't know what will happen out here," said Mrs. Cobb.

"They are ready to start construction and all I can think about is the children trying to get to

school with the heavy traffic and construction going on at the same time," she said.

Three elementary school children were injured by fast-moving automobiles during the past school year, and Mrs. Cobb is concerned that more accidents will occur if Simm's plan is implemented.

"I don't see how Mr. Simm's plan will help the situation out here," said Mrs. Check. "I don't see how taking the parking lot away will alleviate the problem."

"I have only received one reply, from Commissioner Sidney Levin, who said he would not change his vote because the proposal was in the best interest of the people," she said.

The other commissioners who voted in favor of Simm's proposal were Beverly Phillips, Harry Cain, Harvey Ruvin and Sandy Rubenstein.

According to Mrs. Burt, who lives on SW 117th

Avenue, Commissioner Rubenstein has agreed to meet with the residents after the Labor Day weekend and go over the plan.

"We only need one commissioner to ask for a re-examination of the plan so that a special meeting can be called," said Mrs. Burt.

"We are very happy that they have issued a work stop on the project, but we would like to have the commissioners reconsider now before school starts Aug. 30," said. "There is no sense in waiting until after Sept. 7, and after the elections."

CG police station is no dry refuge from downpour

Chief William Kimbrough of the Coral Gables Police Department was up to his ankles in water Thursday, Aug. 19.

When he came to work in the morning, glad to escape the downpour outside, he found his office to be only slightly drier. Water was streaming from the ceiling and corners, the rug was soaked and his desk had to be moved out of the way of a steady drizzle from above.

The chief, patient but with dampened spirits, was forced to pace through the corridors of the year-old police station while 13 buckets caught the constant dribble in his office.

Chief Kimbrough's office was only one of many on the second floor of the nearly new station that was soaked. The floor of the conference room had to be strategically lined with buckets, and the chief's secretaries, Nancy Powell and Rita DiNicola, kept umbrellas close to their desks.

"We've used about all the wastebaskets we can get hold of, and we bought 25 plastic pails

this morning," said Capt. Robert Beckerich, who keeps a record of leaks in the new building.

"We really need 25 more. We've got leaks on every floor but the first."

Captain Beckerich said this week's torrential downpour was not the first that caused the department to break out the buckets.

Since the Gables police moved into the new building at 2801 Salzedo in June of last year, the rains have come through the roof on four other occasions.

"But this is the worst yet," said Capt. Beckerich. "We called the weather bureau this morning and they said that since 6 p.m. Wednesday, Aug. 18, and 9:30 a.m. Thursday, Aug. 19, we've had 4.44 inches of rain."

The captain added that when a storm comes from the northwest, the huge front windows of the station leak, causing the front lobby to flood.

Although the worst of the storm had diminished to a drizzle by mid-afternoon, department employees had to continue their work amid puddles and the plop, plop, plop of persistent drips.

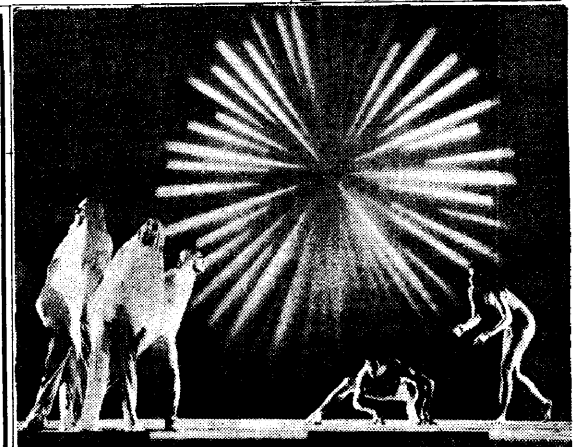

 Cross, United Way Home Care Services, Visiting Nurse Association, the Veterans Administration and the Dade County Police Department are just a few of the agencies Cora and her organization call upon for help.

"Many times, our volunteers go much further than just calling," said Cora. "They fall in love with their senior citizens, and visit them and have them to their homes as well."

One of the main reasons the program was started was the high incidence of senseless accidents and deaths among the elderly, who fell down in the night or became ill and were unable to get help.

"When a volunteer can't reach a subscriber at the designated time, she'll call me, and I'll try to contact a neighbor of the senior citizen," said Cora. "If I can't reach a neighbor, then I'll call police and they'll check on the person."

Cora recalls several such incidents, when the police had to break down

the door to reach a person who had slipped and broken a limb, unable to reach the telephone.

One case involved Cora's youngest subscriber, a diabetic and epileptic woman in her 40s, who lives alone in Cutler Ridge.

Cora said the woman's volunteer, unable to reach her, called Cora, who alerted police.

"We knew it was an emergency because of the woman's condition," said Cora. "When the emergency rescue squad got there, within 10 minutes, they found the woman. She had had a seizure, her nose was broken, her face was cut up and she was unconscious.

"But she's home doing fine today, thanks to the volunteer."

The Telephone Reassurance program doesn't cater only to such emergencies, however. Although it has no funds from which to draw, volunteers often find people at their churches and in their neighborhoods willing to contribute small niceties to lonely old peo-

ple.

Cora said the majority of her volunteers and subscribers are women — the volunteers because they have more free time, and the subscribers because elderly men are apparently reluctant to admit they are lonely.

"An elderly person living alone has so little con-

tact with the outside world," said Cora. "We are trying to provide human service."

Any elderly person who lives alone in the South Dade area, especially Coral Gables, and wants someone to call every day, is urged to contact Cora at 235-2051.

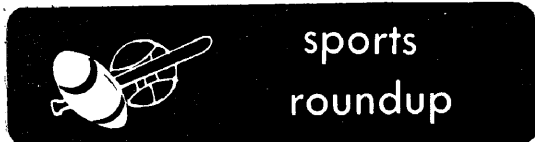

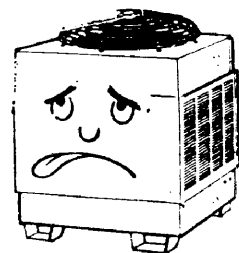

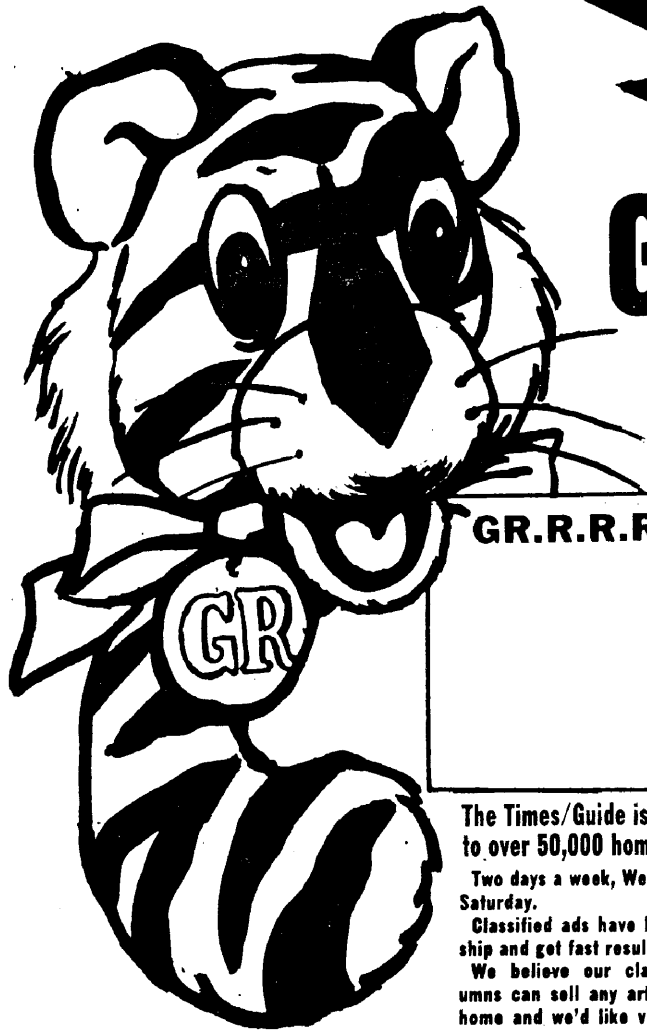
