

# CITIZEN WITH ORCHIDS SEEKS MOST COURTEOUS GABLES MOTORISTS

Orchids to the most courteous drivers of the week! That phrase will take on meaning in Coral Gables next week, all because a private citizen, who wishes to remain anonymous, wants to do something to promote courtesy among local motorists.

This citizen has deposited with The Riviera a check to cover the purchase of two orchids a week, for the next four weeks, to be given to the two motorists who, each week, exhibit some courtesy of the road that makes them stand out among the "run of mill" motorists.



It may be someone who stops to let an aged person or a child cross the street, or who pauses in the flow of through traffic to allow a waiting driver to proceed from a side street. Maybe it will be the fellow who stops to ask another car owner with a flat tire if he can be of assistance, or who performs some other act of kindness or courtesy in connection with his driving.

Police officers who patrol the Boulevard, or who ride in the squad cars will be asked to keep on the lookout for these little acts of courtesy. When they observe some motorist going out of his or her way to help the other fellow, they will make a note of the license number, the incident, or if possible, obtain the driver's name. These "nominations" will be turned in to Lieut. Floyd P. Brasher, head

of the Coral Gables Police Traffic Division. Private citizens, who observe similar acts of courtesy, are invited to make nominations through The Riviera. Each week, these nominations will be sifted by a board of impartial judges, and the two "Courtesy Drivers" of the week will be selected.

To each of them will be delivered a beautiful orchid, through the courtesy of the anonymous citizen. They will also be photographed and their pictures and names will appear in The Riviera.

So be on the alert for these little acts of courtesy on the road. If you see one, get the license number and tell us about it. And while you're redying, keep courtesy uppermost in your mind. Who knows? Perhaps you will be the Courtesy Driver of the Week!

Gables Kiwanians Protest Action Of Beach Group

Announcement of plans for an exclusive club and casino on Sunny Isles, to be called the "Key Club", drew an angry protest this week from the Coral Gables Kiwanis Club.

The matter was called to the club's attention by The Rev. John Harvey Fritsch, who pointed out that the club was taking the name of the Kiwanis sponsored "Key Clubs", which are organized in high schools throughout the United States. The local chapter is located at Ponce de Leon High School.

Kiwanis Lieutenant Governor Henry Clay Anderson reported that the matter was taken up with the club's state officials in Jacksonville last Saturday, and assured the members that the protest would be followed through.

"The Key Clubs are known throughout the United States as builders of character in boys, and no enterprise of this kind should be allowed to usurp the name," Fritsch stated.

Daniel Redfern was speaker on Tuesday's program, outlining the need for a new state constitution and effecting of economies in our state government.

## \$100,000 Apartment House Planned for Coral Gables

Plans for the construction of a \$100,000, 20-unit apartment, to be constructed at the corner of Douglas Road and Avenue Antilla were made public Tuesday at the meeting of the city commission.

The apartment will be constructed in five buildings of four units each, with an attractive court in the center. The commission was asked, and granted an exception to the zoning ordinance to permit changes in the facings of the buildings, to carry out the plan in harmony.

The apartment will be constructed by the B and L Housing Corporation, an affiliate of Babcock and Lamont, contractors, who will do the actual construction work. Application of a construction permit is expected to follow the granting of the zoning exception.

## City Wins First Round in Bar Battle

Judge Stanley Milledge in circuit court, Wednesday, granted a City of Coral Gables motion to quash an alternative writ of mandamus calling on the city to issue a liquor bar license to Ed Hassenteufel or to show cause why the license should not be issued.

Milledge granted Hassenteufel's attorney, William Kirtley, 30 days in which to file an amended writ. Hassenteufel brought the suit to compel the city to issue him a liquor bar license for his Howard Johnson's restaurant on Tamiami Trail.

## Condemnation Trial Date Established

Coral Gables' suit to obtain the block at Avenue Aragon and Salzedo Street for municipal purposes, including a new bus terminal has been set for trial on March 28, City Attorney Edward L. Semples revealed today.

Semples said that approximately half the lots in the block have already been obtained through outright purchase agreements.

## Legal Frat To Install On Saturday

The Richmond Rasco chapter of Phi Alpha Delta, national legal fraternity, will be installed at the University of Miami in ceremonies Saturday at the Coral Gables Community House and Library, Frank W. Ludwig, Washington, supreme officer of the fraternity, will supervise the installation.

Governor Millard Caldwell will head a coterie of distinguished guests, including five state supreme court justices, who will come to Coral Gables to witness the ceremonies. Judge John W. Holland launched the festivities attendant to the installation with a dinner for alumni members on Wednesday evening at the Pied Piper.

Following Saturday's installation will be a banquet at the LaGorce Country Club of Miami Beach. Colonel John Doyle Carmody, USA ret., a past supreme justice of the order, will be one of the local residents taking part in the ceremony. Colonel Carmody is the only supreme justice of the fraternity ever to serve two terms.

Three U.S. presidents, William Howard Taft, Woodrow Wilson and Harry Truman have been active members of the fraternity, and Truman has been extended an invitation to attend the event. A contingent from the University of Florida chapter will conduct the installation ceremonies.

## Halt Ordered On Cab Licenses

The Coral Gables city commission, Tuesday, ordered a halt put to the acceptance of taxi license applications.

Informed by City Manager William T. McIlwain that 21 cabs are now licensed in the Gables, the commission stated that no new applications are to be accepted until it is decided that more cabs are needed to serve the community.

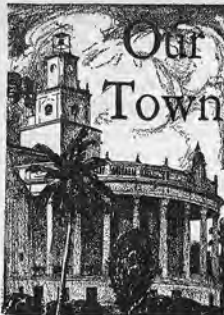

Now there is nothing remarkable in the fact that five of the waitresses in the Mayview Manor dining room were from Dade County. You probably won't even be too shocked when I tell you that in the winter, those same five women taught school in our local school system.

But here is the fact that hit me right between the eyes. The chances are, that this winter those five women will not be teaching school. Instead they will probably be found in the dining room of a Miami Beach luxury hotel, waiting on tables.

What is the reason that five educated women, trained to devote their lives to teaching and guiding our children, should desert their careers to take jobs as waitresses? It's purely a matter of elementary mathematics.

Figuring their rooms, meals, tips and salaries, those teachers earned the equivalent of \$500 per month during the period they spent at the North Carolina hotel. They can do the same thing this winter, so why should they go back to the classroom with its meager salary?

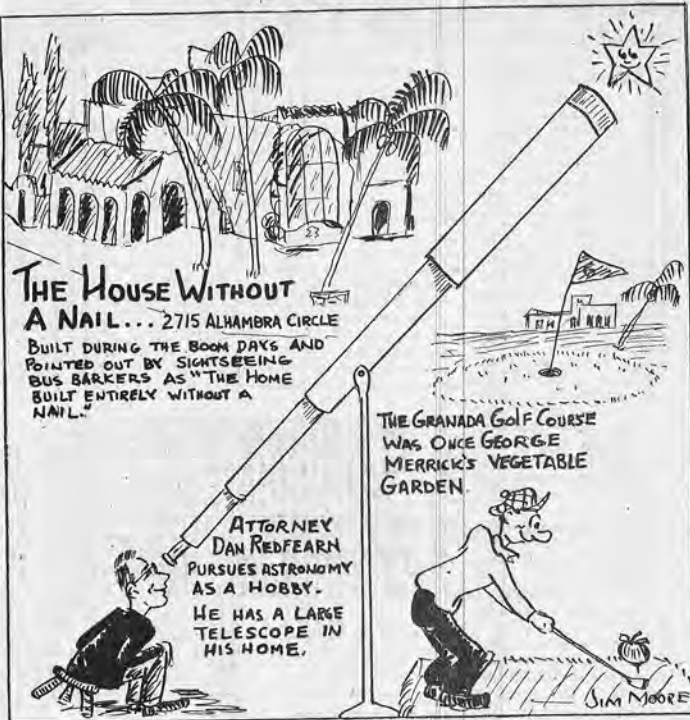
Isn't that a fine state of affairs? Here we have a state with its treasury literally bulging at the seams, while its teachers desert their careers for menial tasks, just so they can get enough money on which to live comfortably?

Mr. Redfean also told us of a favorite expression employed by Florida politicians, speaking of our schools. It's "Thank God for Mississippi". The reason it is employed is because Mississippi is the only state in the Union with a lower educational rating than Florida, and the only reason Florida doesn't rank last.

Coral Gables, with the University of Miami and its other fine schools, is one of the state's great educational centers. As a city of culture, our citizens have always evidenced

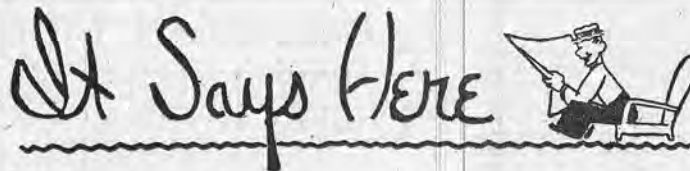

Gables Attorney Starts Second Season As Florida State Racing Steward

Hollis Rinehart, Jr., prominent local attorney, will start his second year in the Judges stand as Steward Representing the Florida State Racing Commission, at Tropical Park on December 2nd, opening day of the Miami winter racing season.

A tall, slender Virginian, Rinehart lives in Coral Gables and has practiced law here since 1931. His background, though horsey, has been confined mainly to hunt meetings and the show ring.

He was reared in Charlotteville where his closest neighbors were Uncle Billy Garth and Doc Jones, the well-known Virginia trainers and thoroughbred breeders.

On the Rinehart farm, however, he observed with a laugh, "We bred mules." His father was a rail contractor and mules were needed to haul the rails.

His brother, Roger Rinehart, is master of hounds at the Farmington Hunt Club in Charlotteville, and the youngest judge of hunters to ever act in that capacity at the Madison Square Garden horse show.

Rinehart's first impression when he entered the stand last season was one of surprise at the multitude of precautions taken by race tracks to protect the public, State, and horsemen. "You're frequently hearing of the lack of honesty in racing," he said, "but I don't think this should apply any more to the turf than to business. I never realized how vigorously the State and the race tracks, themselves, try to safeguard the public."

Another strong thought which came out of his initial season as a Steward is, "the feeling that horsemen and jockeys should be treated as human beings, and that the rules are made for the biggest owner and trainer as well as the smallest".

During the racing season, "the State gets ninety percent of my time," he explained. He arrives

at his law office in the Ingraham Building at 8 a.m. and departs at 11, leaving any unfinished business to his two assistants. In the afternoon he is at the track.

Watching a race from the stewards' stand, he has found, is entirely different from watching one from the grandstand. "You have to divorce yourself from the idea of who is winning, and watch the field as a whole," he said. "The minute you concentrate on any particular horse you miss any infractions of the rules in which others may participate during the running of the race."

Rinehart enjoys the work, "It gets you out in the air and away from other people's troubles. You know, the law business is nothing but other people's troubles." However, along about the last two weeks of the season, he finds he's a little weary of horses, and glad to return to work.

THE TREE THAT PAID THE DEBTS

Surely you have seen the Sausage Trees. There are several around the Gables. One, on Le Jeune Road at 16th Street, is in the heart of the city.

But have you visited "THE SAUSAGE TREE" at the Charley Black place on Ingraham Highway, just past Mathe-son Hammock? This tree paid the family debt.

The Blacks are collectors. Not of stamps or autographs, but of tropical trees and plants. The glory of their collection is the Kigelia Pinnata. The seed of the tree known as the Sausage Tree was brought from Cairo by Dr. David Fairchild, propagated at the government experimental station and distributed to interested friends.

For thirty years the Blacks tended their miniature orchard. They beautified it with rock gardens and grottoes. They planted ferns and cacti and everything flourished under their ministering care. Kigelia Pinnata, which had been planted nearest the highway, grew faster than other trees, adding a foot each year to its stature.

Pinnata was producing about five "sausages" a year when the Blacks erected a filling station by the side of the tree. Just about that time, a new highway was planned to the south and tourist travel to Key West was routed away from their orchard.

Like every one else in the area, the Blacks were feeling the economic pressure of the times, and every day someone would say, "Charley, you've got a gold mine here! Fence in your sausage tree and charge admission to it!"

But the Blacks insisted, "We would no more think of commercializing Pinnata than of selling her."

The bank account diminished to an all-time low. Tourist trade was practically nil. Then it was that Pinnata and the orchard literally came to the rescue and paid the family debts.

In summer, the fruit trees bore bumper crops. Fruit had to be preserved in jellies and marmalades and offered for sale. In the early fall Kigelia Pinnata astonished visitors from the North with 45 sausages!

The Blacks tried to find some way of using the fruit, but when it was cut open it looked and smelled like a dried watermelon. It was utterly unpalatable. It had no value except as a curiosity, but what a value that was!

Thousands of people drove out Ingraham Highway to see the Sausage Tree; thousands of jars of sweetmeats were sold at the shop; thousands of gallons of gasoline were poured into tanks; seven thousand, five hundred dollars went into the bank account and the orchard had paid the debts.

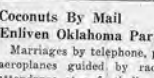

**FLORIDA INDUSTRIAL ACTIVITY BOOSTS ELECTRICAL OUTPUT**

The high level of industrial activity in Florida is marked by the production of 374,986,000 kilowatt-hours of electric energy for industrial purposes during the first nine months this year, the research and industrial division of the State Chamber of Commerce stated yesterday in its third report on new industrial development in the state.

"No other indicator is more sensitive to industrial expansion than the volume of electric energy used by manufacturers. The cost of electricity is fractional in comparison with costs of labor, raw materials and other manufacturing expenses, but as electricity is the principal means employed to turn the wheels of industry, it therefore serves as a gauge of levels of production," the researchers brought out.

"It would appear that because of retractions in war production in the state, the volume of electric energy consumed by industry in 1946 would shrink considerably below the immediately previous years. This, however, is not the case. Consumption since those retractions has remained consistent-

ly higher than pre-war years and only slightly below war peaks.

"Monthly production of electric energy by industrial establishments in Florida has averaged 42,000,000 kilowatt-hours this year through September. The high for the period, 45,558,000, occurred in August and the low, 36,476,000, in January."

In addition to the production of industrial electric energy, the utility plants of the state were reported as producing 1,826,717,000 kilowatt-hours for public consumption.

"The installed capacity of electric generating plants in Florida totaled 550,140 kilowatts as of January 1, 1946, 11 per cent higher than in 1943. The national increase in capacity was 1 per cent and the South Atlantic Regional gain, 5 per cent, both for the same period," the report concluded.

**Hunters Should Handle Rabbits With Caution**

Coral Gables rabbit hunters were cautioned this week by the State Board of Health to beware of handling rabbits which showed symptoms of sluggishness or for any other reason appeared abnormal. This, as a safeguard against tularemia, an infection found in wild rabbits which can be passed on to housewives, butchers or any individual who cleans the animals.

There has been scarcely any tularemia reported in Florida during the past five years, but because it is a disease easily carried by animals from section to section, the Health Department always wants hunters to be cautious when cleaning wild rabbits.

Although wild rabbits are regarded as the most common carrier of the disease it was explained that tularemia may also be contracted through the bite of blood sucking flies or wood ticks which previously have fed on infected animals including muskrats, opossums, squirrels and deer.

So highly virulent is the tularemia bacteria that they have been found active in wild rabbit carcasses kept frozen solid at 5 degrees above zero for three and one-half years. No conclusive evidence ever has been advanced to prove the disease is transmitted from one human to another. However, housewives are warned to cook rabbits thoroughly in order to guard against any possible danger of such transmission.

The disease which enters through minor cuts or abrasions kills about 5 per cent of those it

afflicts. Tularemia may persist over a period of months during which time it causes the glands to enlarge, brings on alternate chills and high fever and results in severe prostration accompanied by considerable pain.

Wear rubber gloves always when handling or dressing wild rabbits.
