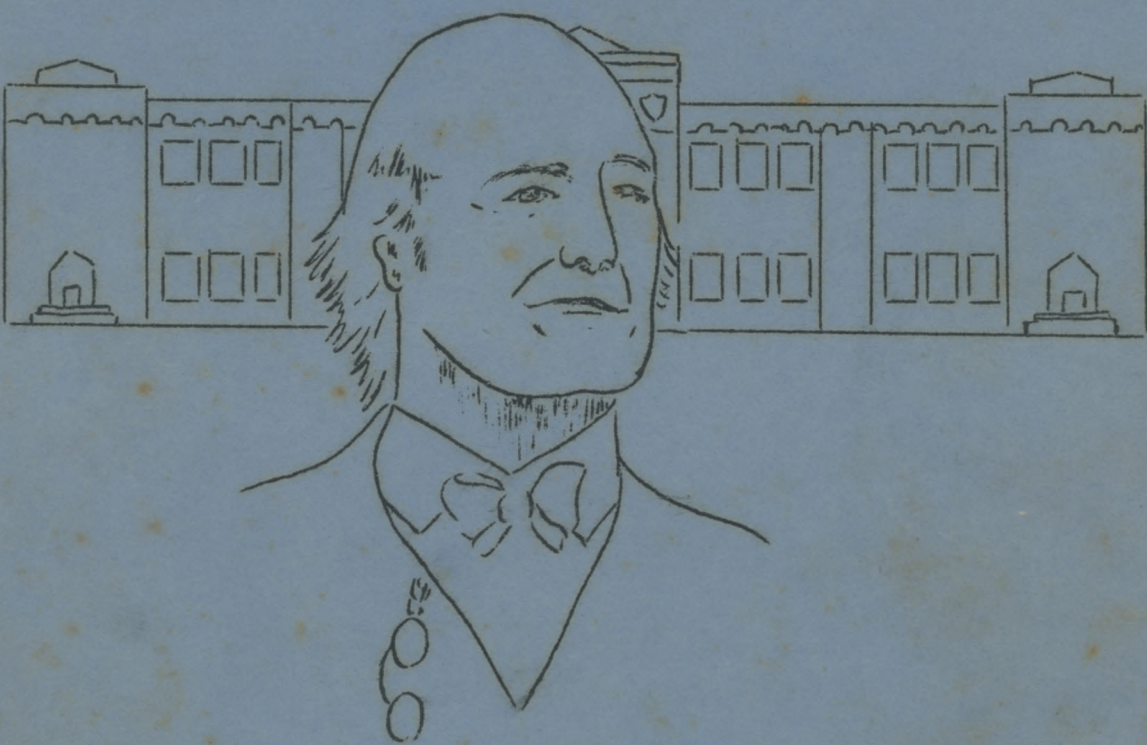

CLASS HISTORY

Of the present graduating class of 1940, eight pupils started their history in the first grade under the direction of Mrs. W. R. Partee. These were: Owene Harry, Joan Henshaw, Juanita Nord, Beverly Bravand, Patricia Gilcrest, Lamont Duncan, Herbert Huff, Lester Kalch, Harry McAdams, and Merle Hawkins. Mrs. Partee says--quote. "Among the class of 1940 are pupils who established a splendid reputation for cooperation and effort in their very first year of school life. It makes their first grade teacher very happy to see them having run the race successfully thus far."

Our present graduating class has an enrollment of 75 pupils, which is quite an increase from the few who were in the first grade. The number of elementary teachers has increased from four in 1931 to nine in 1940.

In the second grade these new pupils were added to the class of Miss Tompkinson, (now Mrs. Hanafourde): Hugh Cross and Warren Blanton. Mrs. Hanafourde said quote--"I am glad to see such a fine class reach graduation."

In the third grade there were no new entrants.

Mrs. Myers was the class teacher during the fourth and fifth grades. Among the new pupils who entered then were: Ruby Long, Marvin Spence, Barbara Hagberg, Marjorie Hammock, and Marion Tilghman. The class at that time was interested in an Audubon club.

Martha Wharton, Ella Brooks, Donald McCubbin, Roberta Grantham, Ernest Foley entered Bryan in the

sixth grade with Mrs. Nettie N. Jones as teacher.

A highly expectant class awaited the novel experience of Junior High school, where they were joined by pupils coming from Opa Locka, Ojus, and Miami Shores. The following pupils so greatly increased the class enrollment that we were divided into three sections which were under the direction of Miss Ridge, who is now Mrs. Cooper, Mrs. Bozeman, Mr. Maloney, and Mr. Volland.
