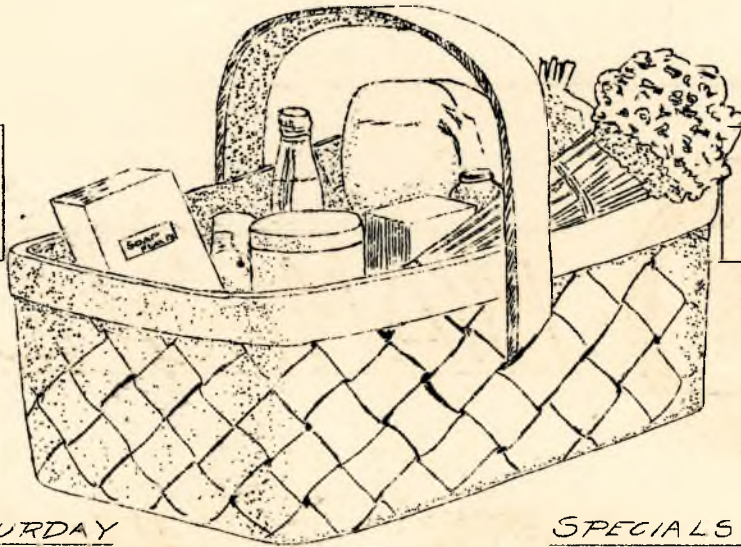

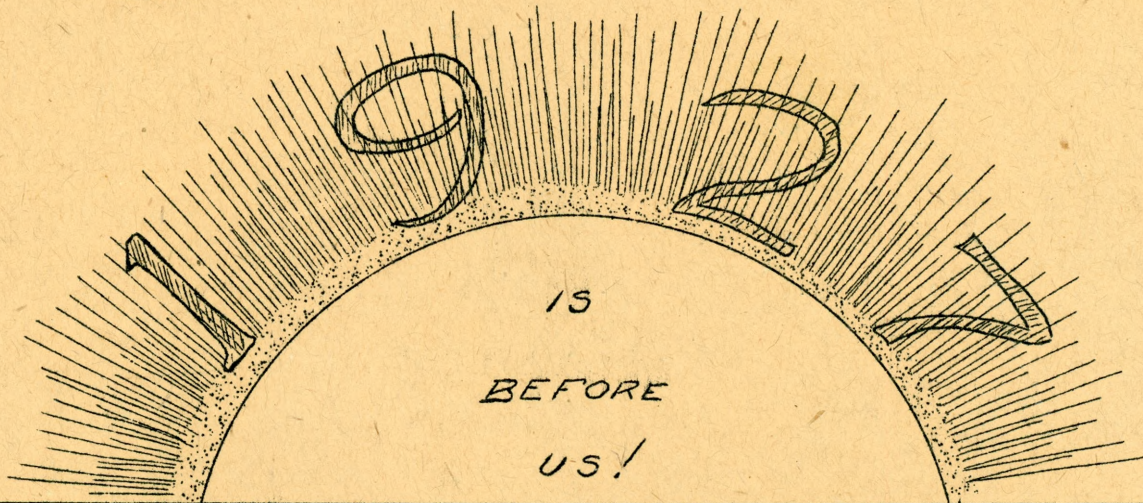

Step on the Gas

The Sunny Isles Ocean Beach Company are repairing the bridges which go from the road along the beach over to the islands. Geo. E. Long, Contractor has the work in hand and will not only re-construct the damaged sections, but will build one new bridge as well.

Most of the dredging of the canals is completed and the beauty of the islands is returning. Where the approaches to the bridges are washed out great masses of concrete and coralrock weighing many tons are suspended in the air. The sight is quite interesting and speaks well for the sturdy construction of the bridges. Lights are to be put on the corner pillars of each bridge. Stakes have been set out for sidewalks to be put in along the highway and on the Atlantic Island.

Miami Shores folks are much interested in the reconstruction of the road and approaches to the bridge at Bakers Haulover. North of the Haulover the road is completely washed out for a distance of two miles. There is no land to be seen for a block on either side of the bridge but a dredge is now on the job to start the fill. Right now the work is awaiting the arrival of steel piling which is necessary before the fill can be made. The task at hand here is a big one and we are glad to see it started.

It is announced by Mayor Baker that sealed proposals for the construction of 386,482 square feet of concrete sidewalks already authorized, will be received at the Town Hall until Monday, Jan. 31, 1927, when they will be considered by the Council. The award of the contracts will be made as soon thereafter as practicable.

The Town Council met as an Equalizing Board last Tuesday to consider any complaints which might be made on the special assessment roll published for three weeks in the Miami Tribune, covering the street and sidewalk improvement program. No objections were raised and the assessment roll was approved and confirmed by the Council.

Fines and forfeitures aggregating \$299.40 were imposed in five cases by Judge Baker in Municipal Court on Monday, January 10th.

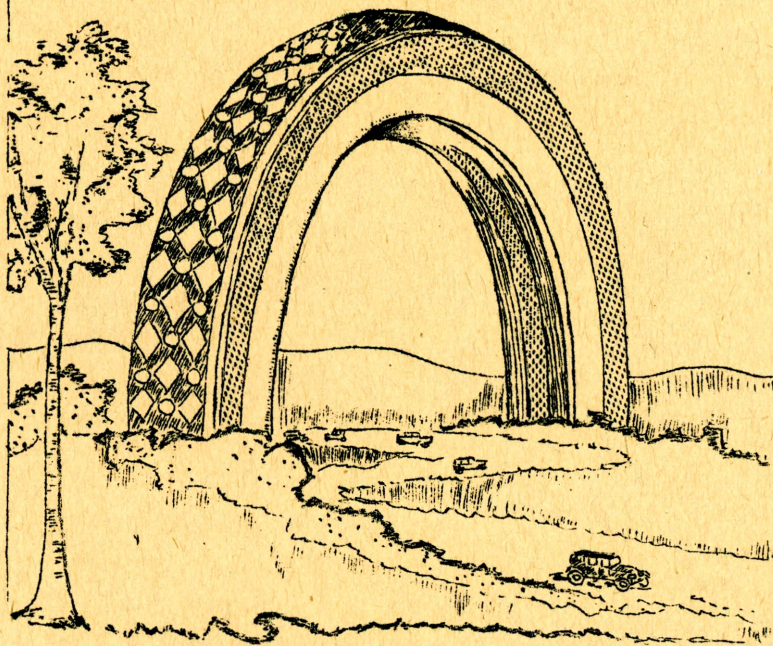

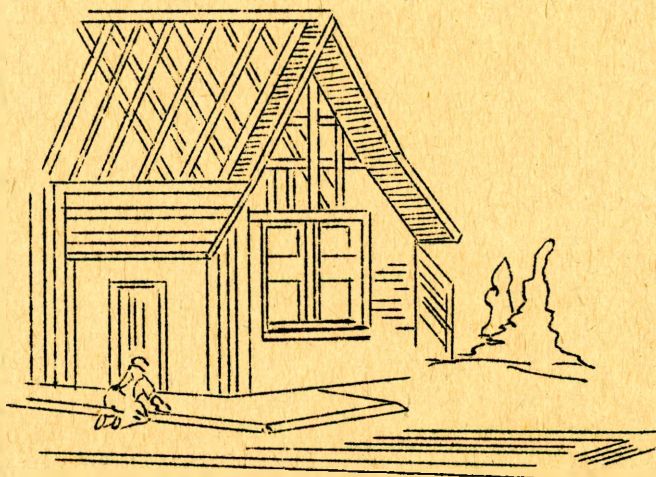

LEGAL NOTICES.

Sealed Proposals for the construction of 386,482 sq.ft. of Concrete Sidewalks will be received by Town Clerk of the Town of Miami Shores Florida, at his office in the Town Hall until eight o'clock P.M. on Monday, Jan.31, 1927 at which time and place they will be publicly opened and read at a meeting of the Town Council, and the award of the contracts made as soon thereafter as practicable. Each proposal shall be made in good faith on forms which may be secured at the office of the Town Clerk. Each Proposal shall be accompanied by a certified check upon a Bank or Trust Company of Florida, payable to the Town of Miami Shores in an amount equal to two and one half($2\frac{1}{2}$) per cent of the total amount of the Proposal.

The deposit of any bidder to whom a contract is awarded, will be forfeited to the Town as liquidated damages if the bidder for twenty days following written notice of such award fails to execute the written contract and furnish the required bond. This deposit, however, will be returned to the bidder when the contract has been executed, the bond furnished and both approved by the Town Council of the Town of Miami Shores. The deposits of other bidders will be returned within three days after award of the contract or the rejection of all bids. In each Proposal by an individual or firm shall be stated the name and address of every person interested in it, and in the case of a corporation the names and the addresses of its officers.

No Proposal shall be withdrawn after it is filed unless the Town Council of the Town of Miami Shores fails to accept it within forty days after the date for opening the bids. Each bidder is to examine the location of the work, also the plans and specifications on file in the office of the Town Clerk of the Town of Miami Shores, and on file in the office of the Town Engineers, Messrs. Huff and Roberts, Miami, Florida, and otherwise familiarize himself with the character and extent of the proposed construction before making his Proposal. Each bidder is to state what experience he has had in such construction, and furnish satisfactory references as to business standing, for no bid will be accepted without complete and satisfactory evidence that the bidder is experienced in such construction and has the capital available for furnishing the equipment necessary, and for employing a sufficient complement of labor to execute the work promptly according to the specifications. The bond required is one hundred(100%)per cent of the estimated cost of the work at the contract prices, which is to be executed by the successful bidder as principal and by a Surety Company authorized to do business in the State of Florida; this bond is to be filed within twenty days after the acceptance of the Proposal on forms which will be furnished by the Town Clerk of the Town of Miami Shores, for the faithful performance of the contract.

Plans, specifications, and Proposal and Surety Bond blank forms may be obtained from the Town Clerk or the Town Engineers upon deposit of Ten(10.00)Dollars.

Payments will be made upon monthly estimates to the Town Engineers to the amount of seventy(70%)per cent of such estimates of value of materials delivered and work performed, and the balance due shall be paid within sixty days after the final acceptance of the work by the Town Council of the Town of Miami Shores, Florida.

The right is reserved to reject any or all proposals; also in case any successful bidders fail to sign the contract or to file the bond, to accept any other Proposal for the work.

The right is also reserved to let separate contracts if considered to the best interest of the Town of Miami Shores.

Bidders should state whether or not they are willing to purchase six(6%)per cent Special Assessment Bonds of the Town of Miami Shores at a price of not less than ninety-five and accrued interest; and if so, the amount of bonds they are willing to purchase and the price they are willing to pay. Said bonds will be issued under Chapter 9298 of the Laws of Florida, 1923.

PYTHIAN ACTIVITIES.

The international extension program announced recently by officers of the Supreme Lodge Knights of Pythias, will, in a large measure, direct the activities of Booster Lodge, according to Chancellor Commander H. M. Stephens, who was recently installed with eight other officers of the lodge to direct the work of the Pythian fraternity in this city during the year. The program, includes among other activities a definite plan to increase the social features, quicken interest in community service and to make a stronger appeal to worthy citizens to become members of the Order. The lodge has set as a mark in the increase of its membership under the general plan announced by the Supreme Lodge to secure a twenty-per cent net gain during the year.

Commenting on the outline for the new year, Chancellor Commander H. M. Stephens said: "The program is intended to make the lodge a real factor in the life of the community and to aid in the extension of the benefits of fraternal membership by performing its share in the great national movement. The movement is supported by nearly one million members in the United States and Canada. We have over 6400 lodges and it is the purpose of the program of activity to make every one of these lodges the center of fraternal accomplishment in performing the service for which the fraternity was founded--to make better homes and better communities in which to live.

"The Pythian Order now operates eighteen homes for aged members, their widows and orphans. Five other states are building homes. Investment in this phase of Pythian endeavor amounts to more than \$4,000,000 and over 2,000 men, women and children are provided with home comforts. Five grand domains have established educational trust funds by which worthy young men and women are given opportunity for advanced college training. Nearly two hundred are now being kept in colleges through loans from these funds.

"The Pythian Sisters, the womans' auxiliary of the Order has a membership of nearly a half million and distributes annually more than \$250,000 for the care of orphaned children and for the comforts of the aged and poverty stricken.

The Military Department is very active and is offering to the young membership a military training almost equal to that obtained in barracks maintained by the various states.

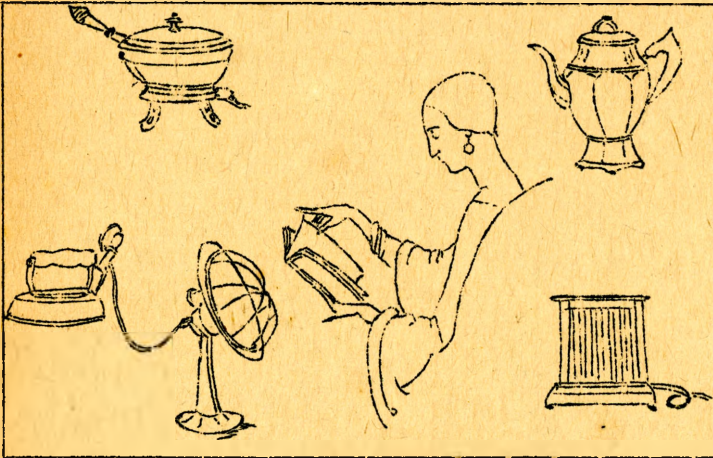
"The Insurance Department has celebrated its forty-ninth birthday by moving into its new home office building in Indianapolis, Indiana, located on the war memorial plaza. This branch of the Order has distributed over \$60,000,000 to widows and orphans. It has nearly 100,000 members and insurance for home protection amounting to over \$120,000,000.

"In every respect the financial condition of the Order is gratifying. The Subordinate Lodges distributed last year \$1,709,000 for relief. The assets of Grand and Subordinate lodges is over \$30,000,000, a gain of over \$1,015,000 for the year, and in the 1926, sixty-six lodges built their own homes costing more than \$8,000,000. Our lodge in adopting this program will take definite steps to carry out the objectives of other lodges over the Supreme Domain."
