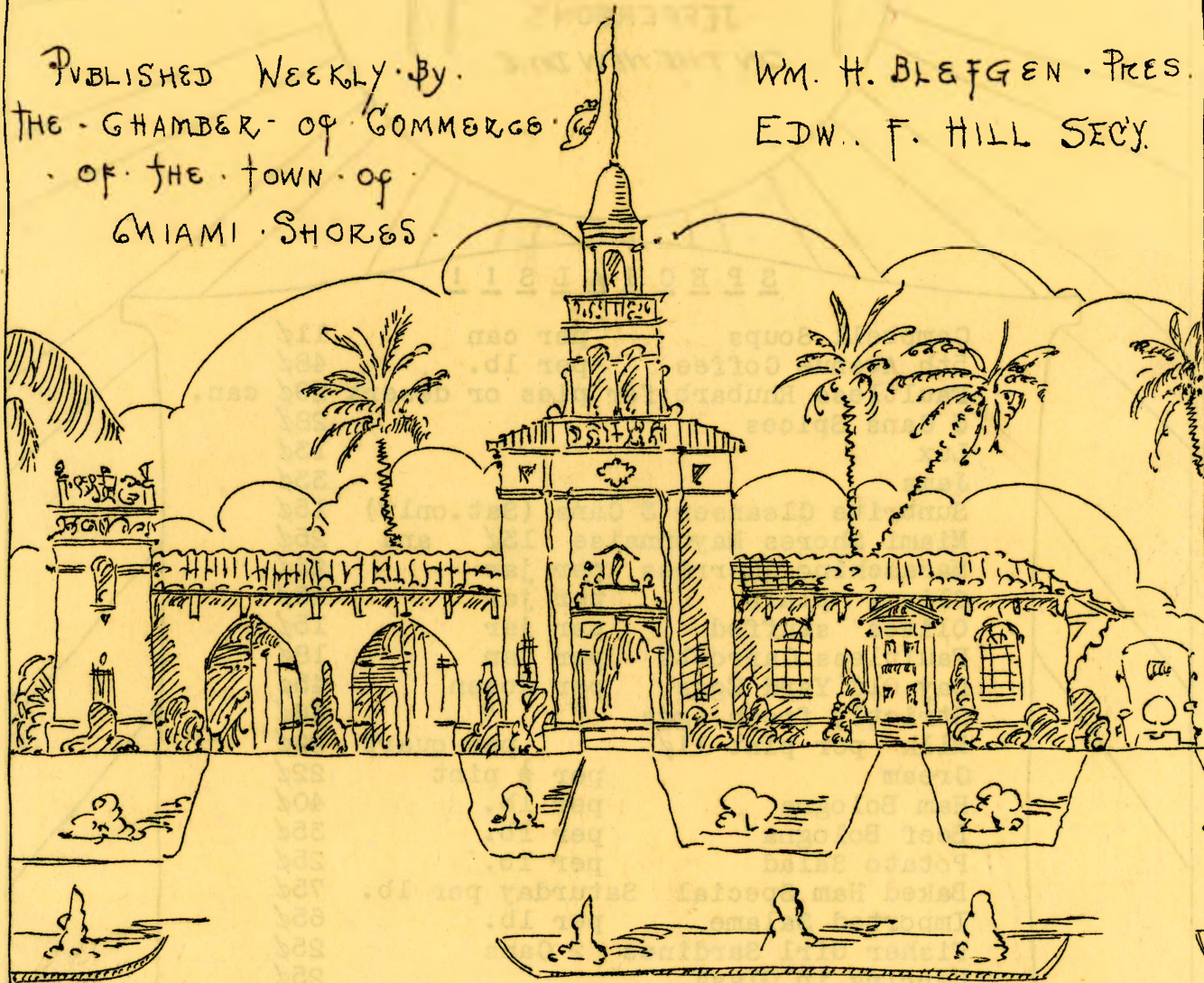

# COMMUNITY NEWS

## BOND MONEY RECEIVED CHECK FOR FIRST INSTALLMENT ARRIVES

A Cashier's check for the amount of the sale price of the \$ 50,000. General Improvement Bonds was received at the Town Hall last Wednesday, it was announced by Mayor W. P. Brion. Delivery and payment for the remaining \$ 125,000. of this issue is to be made at the rate of \$ 25,000. each month, according to the terms of the contract with the purchasers, Mayor Brion further stated.

## \$ 14,000. STREET IMPROVEMENT BONDS TO BE ISSUED.

At the Council meeting last Monday, Resolution No. 100 was passed, authorizing the issuance of Street Improvement Bonds in the amount of \$ 14,000. for the paving of Avenue "D" and Harding Avenue. The Council decided that the bonds should be dated May 1st, 1927, bear interest at the rate of six percent, and that \$1,000. should mature on May 1st, of each year from 1928 to 1933 and \$ 2,000. on May 1st, of each year from 1934 to 1937. Both principal and interest are payable at the United States Mortgage and Trust Company, in the City of New York.

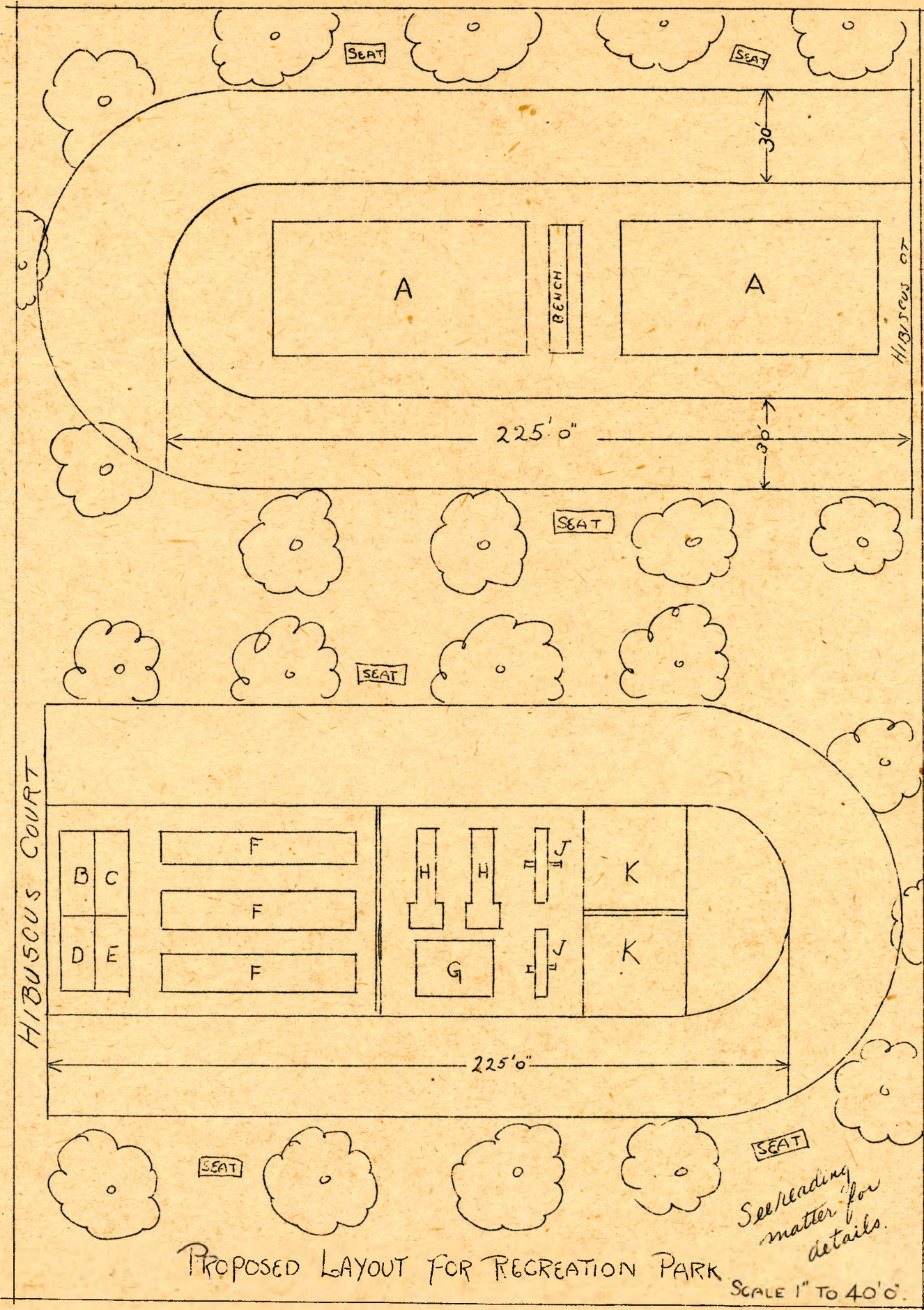
Activity seems to be the watchword of the new organization recently elected. Wm. H. Blefgen who accepted the Presidency of the Chamber in spite of many other duties in the town is doing everything possible to develop a close working team in the membership. No salaries are being paid to anyone connected with the organization and when you send in your check you know that the money when used will be for some beneficial purpose.

On the following page is a drawing made by the architect for the new Town Hall, Mr. Shappel. E.F.Hill, F.R.Case and Mr. Shappel on the Publicity Committee of the organization have submitted this proposed plan for a Recreation Center to be for the benefit of the whole town and to be lighted up at night. The court in which it is planned to have this recreation center is near the present baseball ground - on Hibiscus Court just back of the Potts Bldg. The site is now a public park and it is the desire of the Chamber of Commerce to completely equip it so that it will be a social gathering place for young and old. The Key to the plan is as follows: A is for Double Tennis Courts; B for Shuffle as well as C, D. and E; F is for Quates; G will be a sand box for children; H will be slides; J will be for Swings and K for Volley Ball. Flood lights will be placed in the trees which now completely surround this court or park which can be easily seen from Avenue E and the Dixie Highway. The Town Council is being asked to approve of the use of the park for this purpose.

Will you please come up to the next meeting -- as an interested citizen whether you are a member or not -- and give us the benefit of your ideas. Committees are to be formed to secure the necessary necessary public subscriptions to make the plan a success.



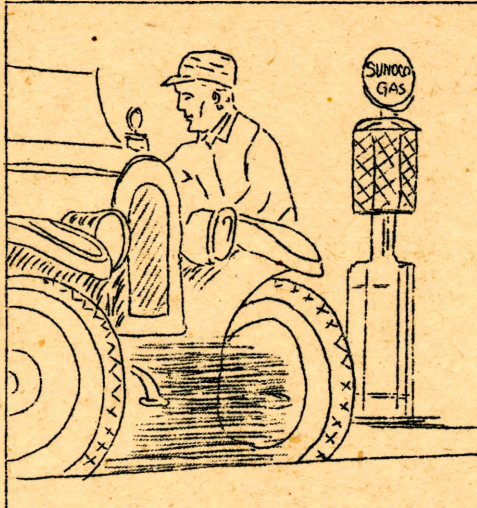




PROPOSED LAYOUT FOR RECREATION PARK
