
IN MEMORIAM

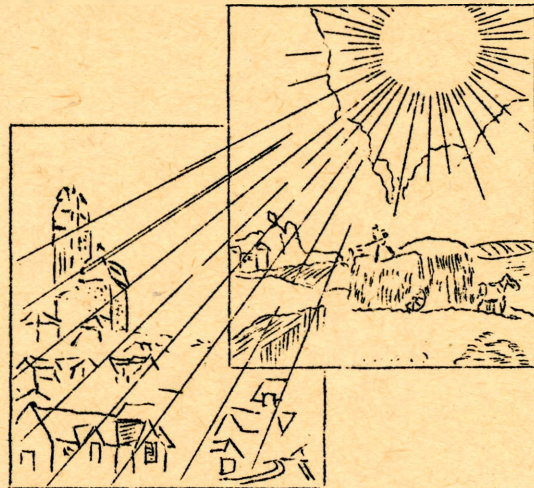

FLORIDA'S IDEAL SUMMER CLIMATE ATTRACTS
MANY UNDESIRABLE CITIZENS TO ITS FOLD.

This is the time of year when many undesirables come to take up their residence for the summer months.

Mr. AmosKeeter and family and friends will arrive shortly in Miami Shores for the summer. They are searching for desirable home-sites. Ideal home-sites for them are rain-barrels, cisterns, empty cans, bottles, flower urns, old auto tire casings and any other containers that will hold water. If you are looking for tenants of the type of Mr. AmosKeeter be sure and provide an abundance of the above mentioned homesites.

The Department of Mosquito Control for the Town of Miami Shores has started its work and earnestly solicits the aid and co-operation of all the citizens of the Town in this work. At present the department is concentrating their efforts on the surrounding marshes endeavoring to make those places free from Mosquito Breeding. We have seven men at work in the swamps East of town and are making good headway on our proposed plan of action.

The citizens of the town can aid materially in this work by making a close inspection of their premises and removing all containers such as empty bottles and tin cans, casings, etc. By screening all rain barrels and cisterns, and seeing that wash tubs and pails are not allowed to collect water. Also fill any low spots in the home plot that allow water to stand in more than three days.

At this time of the year, the mosquito will develop from the egg to the full grown mosquito on the wing in from eight to ten days. Let us all work together this summer and make our Town of Miami Shores as free from mosquitos as possible.

As there are many families that go north at this season without being sure that they have ample insurance protection on their homes the Bulletin asked Mr. Yborra who has been in the line for many years, to give us the benefit of a few "pointers". We print here his answer:-

Those who have had contested claims on Tornado Insurance Policies appreciate the importance of having a correctly written policy. Read your policies carefully. It is of the greatest importance that all typewritten portions of all insurance policies on any one property be identical. It is of equal importance that all printed forms, riders and endorsements are also identical. This can be readily ascertained by noting the number which usually appears on the upper left corner. If your home is to be left unoccupied for a period in excess of 30 days, all Fire Insurance Policies should be endorsed to permit this vacancy. If you neglect to do this your policy is incorrect. If you rent your home, the policy should be endorsed to the effect that the premises are occupied by a tenant. The amount of Windstorm Insurance on any one building should not be less than fifty percent of the value of that building.



BONDS UP FOR VALIDATION
\$74,000. ISSUE BEFORE COURT

A Petition has been filed in the Circuit Court of Dade County, for validation of \$74,000. Sidewalk Improvement Bonds, it was announced at the Town Hall last Tuesday, by Mayor W. P. Brion. The Petition contains the following allegations, according to Mayor Brion:

That the Town Council passed a Resolution approving plans and specifications and estimate of cost of paving sidewalks along certain streets in the Town of Miami Shores: this Resolution providing that all expense of such improvement should be paid by special assessment against the abutting property; that at the time of the adoption of the Resolution, there were on file, at the Town Hall, plans and specifications together with the estimated cost of the proposed improvement; that the Resolution was published for two weeks in the Miami Herald; that the Town Council caused an assessment roll to be prepared showing the amount to be paid for each lot; that such assessment roll was published three times in the Miami Tribune together

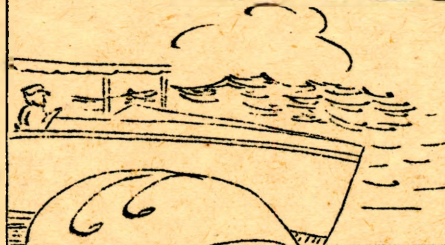

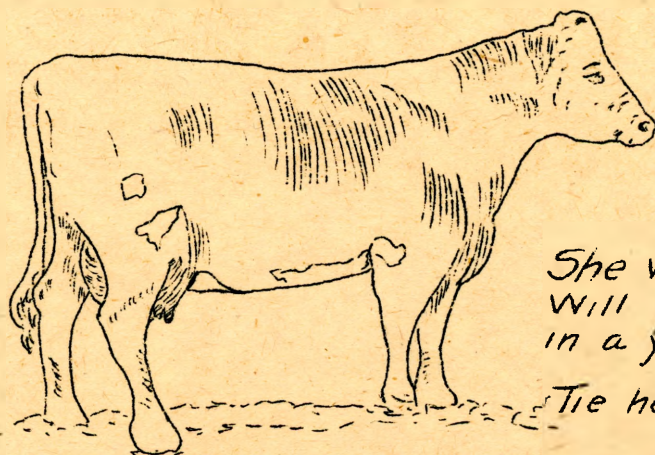

with notice of the time when the Town Council would hear complaints with reference to the said assessments; that at such time the Town Council met as an Equalizing Board and proceeded to equalize and approve said assessments and that thereupon they became legal, valid and binding liens upon the property; that a contract for work was let to the Morgan-Hill Paving Company; that the Town Council passed a Resolution authorizing the issuance of bonds in the amount of \$74,000. and the Resolution prescribed the maturities, form and details of the bonds.

After the Petition was filed, said Mayor Brion, an order was issued by the Circuit Court directing the State Attorney to appear on April 20th, 1927, on behalf of the State of Florida, to show cause, if any there were, why the bonds should not be validated and confirmed. It was also ordered by the Court that there should be published in a newspaper, a notice addressed to the citizens and taxpayers of the Town of Miami Shores, requiring them at the same time, to show cause why the validation decree should not be granted as prayed for.

Mayor Brion announced that sealed bids for the purchase of this issue of bonds would be received at the Town Hall until April 18, 1927 at eight o'clock P.M. A certified check in the sum of two percent (2%)
