Basketball Excitement Fills The Air



Dwight Stewart didn't miss a beat after almost a year's layoff. His 22 points against North Carolina State in the opener led all Golden Panther scorers.

Golden Panther basketball is in full swing and both the men's and women's programs look to begin taking their rightful place among college basketball's elite.

With veteran coaches like **Cindy Russo** and **Bob Weltlich** at the helm, FIU basketball fans have witnessed some exciting games.

A new era in men's basketball began the day after Thanksgiving, when Weltlich made his coaching debut here. He is only the second coach in the history of the program.

Weltlich has coached on the collegiate level for 19 years, including 12 as a head coach. His 160-187 career record includes two Conference Coach of the Year honors and a pair of championships in the Southeastern and Southwest conferences.

Looking to rebound from a disappointing 7-21 record in 1989-90, Weltlich certainly appears to have his work cut out for him. He arrived facing one of the program's toughest schedules ever starting with North Carolina State, South Florida, Clemson, and Florida State at home, and

DePaul and Northwestern on the road—all by the first of the year.

"Our early schedule certainly was a demanding one, but one that provided us with an opportunity to evaluate where we are with this program," said Weltlich. "We looked forward to facing the challenge of playing top-ranked teams, but we kept in perspective our long range goals.

"I'm excited about the enthusiasm and willingness the players have shown," said the coach. "The potential here is tremendous. This school is not just committed academically, but athletically. It is an opportunity where the sky's the limit."

Weltlich, along with the fans, were excited about the return of redshirt-sophomore **Dwight Stewart** who missed the final 23 games of last season following knee surgery. Stewart averaged 18.5 points and 5.8 rebounds in four contests in 1989-90 before blowing out his knee during a practice last December.

Stewart didn't miss a beat, however. Against N.C. State, he tallied a team-high 22 points, and his 11 points against Stetson gave him 34 consecutive games scoring in double figures. The streak ended there when he scored only eight on the road against DePaul, but started anew with 21 points at Northwestern and 20 at Georgia State.

Newcomer **Grady Thompson** proved to be a go-to guy early on. His 20 points played a major role in FIU's 88-84 upset win over Trans America Conference pre-season favorite Stetson, and he led all scorers with 22 points at Georgia State.

This season marks the last that the Golden Panthers will play as independents, a dying breed among Division I programs. As of 1991-92, FIU will compete for the championship of the Trans America Conference with its automatic berth into the NCAA tournament.

"I'm excited about the commitment FIU has made with its basketball program," said Weltlich. "The commitment of resources, the strength of schedule and next year's move into a conference are all indicative of where we want this program to go."

Russo's women have been one of the top programs in the New South Women's Athletic Conference over the past three seasons. In fact, the Golden Panthers have won the last two NSWAC crowns and have registered six straight 20-win seasons.

But this is a very different squad. While the rallying cry of "Three-peat" is being chanted, Russo, who has never backed away from a challenge, is going about it the hard way.

FIU lost its entire starting five from a season ago and the coach, with her assistant's **Inge Nissen** and **Geneva Morgan**, have had to retool.

"I feel we had a very good recruiting year," said Russo while discussing the eight new players she's had to bring in. "In addition to some talented junior college transfers and key freshmen, I think we have the right combination to become as successful as we were last year.

"We recruited the top players from some of the outstanding junior college and continued on page 4

Baseball Looks For More Success in '91

On the whole, it was a very good year. Coach **Danny Price** and his Golden Panther baseball team ended 1990 with a 40-20 record, were ranked as high as 30th in a mid-April *Collegiate Baseball* national coaches poll, and finished third in Division I with 227 stolen bases.

But when all was said and done, that pot of gold at the end of the rainbow—a postseason tournament invitation—once again didn't materialize.

So, it's back to the drawing board for Price and company. And this year, with the start of the 1991 60-game season on February 1st against Augusta (GA) College, there's good news and bad.

The Golden Panthers begin play as members of the Trans America Athletic Conference with an automatic bid to the NCAA Division I regional going to its champ. Only problem there is FIU will compete head-to-head in an Eastern Division with Stetson and Georgia Southern. Both of those programs were invited to regionals last season and Georgia Southern played well enough to represent the TAAC at the College World Series in Omaha. Only two of these three schools will advance to the Conference tournament with a chance at attaining the regional bid.

From the roster, gone are catcher

Fausto Tejero (.304, 7 HR, 34 RBI), pitcher Paul Anderson (13-5, 3.40 ERA), and outfielders Roger Bowman (.293, .500 on-base percentage, 58 stolen bases) and Gil Torres (.308, 7 HR, 34 RBI).

But Price's ranking of 29th among all Division I coaches in winning percentage (.6733) and 69th in total wins (439) is no accident. The coach claims to have his "best outfield ever" coming in and has "more depth" than a year ago on the pitching staff.

Senior second baseman Eric Cruz (.320, 51 stolen bases) will anchor the infield and sophomore center fielder Michael Warner (.299) will steady the outfield. Both spent last summer honing their skills at the prestigious Cape Cod amateur League.

In the starting rotation, senior left hander **Kevin Lucero** led last year's staff in ERA (2.89) and was second in wins (10). Juniors **Doug Girling** (1-1, 4.37 ERA), **Todd Lange** (4-0, 3,56 ERA) and transfer **Jason Abramavicius** (University of Nebraska) should also contribute.

Senior **Jerry Santos**, who set a school record in 1990 with nine saves, looks strong again at stopper.

high school programs in America. It could take us awhile to jell, but I look forward to another fine Conference schedule."

Despite so many newcomers bringing with them so many question marks, never bet against a Cindy Russo-coached team. In thirteen seasons as a head coach, her teams have won at least 20 games on nine occasions and only twice have her squads won fewer than 17 contests.

Through most of the early campaign, Russo's starters have been those newcomers. California native **Tidra Hardy** traveled cross country to show her skills after being named MVP of the Bay Valley Conference in 1989-90.

Coming off the bench, for the most part, senior forward **Shauntay Cunning-ham** has played a key role early on. Junior transfer **Pauletta Murphy**, a 5-foot-2 slashing point guard from Oklahoma led Ponca City High School to a state championship in 1987 and a second place finish in 1988. It's hoped that some of her championship experience, and know-how, rubs off on this year's Golden Panthers.

As might have been expected, the team did struggle early, losing three of its first four. But a trio of home court wins over Bethune-Cookman, South Florida, and Texas Southern propelled FIU into the Christmas break filled with renewed thoughts and belief in the call of "Three-peat."

WMBM-AM Carries FIU Hoop Schedule

WMBM radio (1490 AM) will carry all regular season games of FIU men's basketball, Athletic Director **Dick Young** announced.

Steve Michael, a broadcast veteran, handles the play-by-play.

Michael has been in the broadcasting business for the past 15 years, covering minor league hockey and baseball, professional soccer, and collegiate basketball and soccer. He was also the sports director of Cox Television and the Oklahoma Cable Sports Network.

The Minnesota native is currently

working for both SportsChannel and ESPN, broadcasting tennis, along with auto and boat racing.

WMBM has a listenership that reaches Dade and South Broward counties, along with parts of the Bahamas. The station has long been recognized for its continuing service to the black community.

"A tie with WMBM gives FIU exposure in a special area where our student-athletes can serve as role models, while bringing Golden Panther athletics new visibility in the Metro-Dade community," said Dr. Young.

Fall Sports Recap

Volleyball, X-Country Take Conference Titles

Women's cross country captured its second New South Women's Athletic Conference title in the closest championship meet in league history. Defeating favorite Georgia State on its home turf by a single point gave Coach Mike Becker and his young team the thrill of a lifetime.

One could not tell by the performance of the team that the top five runners were all freshmen. **Katie Flack** and **Jami Levin** played the key role by finishing in 11th and 12th respectively, outdistancing their Georgia State counterparts by two places each, enabling FIU to make up ground and win the title.

Michele Owen, Maria Guzman and Maria Gallego all finished among the top ten runners, earning All-Conference honors.

It was a banner year—conference championship banner that is—for the **volleyball** squad that finished 18-15 and took home its first-ever New South Women's Athletic Conference crown.

Outside hitter **Jovanska Rosich** led the team with 486 kills and 88 service aces. The sophomore from Rio Piedras, Puerto Rico was also named the Conference's Player of the Year. Rosich's powerful serves placed her fifth in the nation in ace average with .782 per game.

Also leading the squad were sophomore outside hitter Melanie Krupowicz with 408 kills and 69 aces and setter Kathy Robinson with 1,193 assists and 77 aces. Robinson's 77 aces placed her 14th nationally in ace average. Krupowicz was also selected to the NSWAC first-team while Robinson made the second-team. Kacy Smith was named honorable mention.

As a team, the Golden Panthers finished 1990 ranked first in the country in ace average. FIU outdistanced New South Conference foe Georgia Southern to take the title with a 3.402 aces per game average.

Head Coach John Trojaniak was selected the NSWAC Coach of the Year for his efforts.

Men's soccer finished with a 6-12-1 record, but that is a bit misleading. Coach Karl Kremser's squad was forced to forfeit four wins and a tie due to the use of an ineligible player, diminishing its actual on-field record of 10-7-1.

The forfeits did not dampen the spirits of the team, as witnessed by its regular-season finish. A 6-1-1 mark in its final eight games certainly showed the collegiate sports world that FIU soccer is still on the map.

The future looks extremely bright, too,

as the top two scorers, **Don Gaillard** and **Chris Veselka**, are both sophomores. Gaillard finished his second season at FIU with nine goals and five assists, while Veselka, in his first year with the team, tallied eight goals, despite playing in only 11 contests due to injuries.

Men's cross country finished third in its (and the University's) first ever Trans America Athletic Conference meet. FIU finished behind five-time defending champion Texas-San Antonio and meet host Georgia State.

Freshman **Joe Maselter** finished fourth of sixty runners to earn All-Conference honors.

With only two seniors on the men's squad and none on the women's side, the future appears to be a bright one for Coach **Mike Becker** and his troops.

Everton Edwards' women's soccer team finished with a 5-11-2 mark. Four of the Golden Panthers victories were shutouts, while the two ties were by identical 0-0 scores.

The team was led by freshman forward Catherine Liller, who scored ten goals and two assists. Liller is the sister of FIU's all-time leading scorer Christine Liller. Randi Ross (two goals, three assists) and Sonia Marinello (three goals) were also top scorers.

In goal, senior **Donna Jean Enright** posted six shutouts and 103 saves for a goals against average of 1.81.

Coach Bobby Shave had a large task on his hands replacing his top two male golfers from a year ago, Bill Kennedy and Chet Bozdog. For that reason, the men struggled through the fall portion of their schedule.

Dave Osbourne led the team in the fall with an 81.0 scoring average. Blake Fayling was second with an 81.9 average.

Coach **Ken Juhn** is beginning to put together the type of **women's golf** team that was common in the early-to-mid 1980's, when NCAA Tournament play was the norm.

Along with the group of returning players, five freshmen made competition for a starting spot that much greater. **Moira Dunn**, who once qualified for an LPGA event while still in high school is the leader of the team. She averaged 77.9 for twelve rounds, including a best finish of fifth at the Lady Seminole Invitational, her second-ever collegiate event. She also finished 11th in the Pat Bradley Invitational.

Melinda Hamlyn was second on the squad with a 78.2 scoring average.

• Two teams (men's soccer and men's cross country) achieved their highest grade point averages ever.

• The most dramatic improvements in grade point average from 1989 to 1990 were in our two premier sports—men's and women's basketball. The men's team improved from 1.983 to 2.293. The women improved from 1.882 to 2.334. Both of these teams have set goals of 2.4 this year.

The reason behind the improved academic performance is the support of

the Golden Panther Academic Support Unit.
