¿ THE QUESTION MARK ?

QUESTION: Can an alien work for the University?

ANSWER: It all depends on his or her plan for calendar year 1978. status. Aliens (non U.S. citizens) may be admitted as immigrants in which case they are entitled to remain in this country indefinitely (so SEARCH FOR PERSONNEL DIRECTOR long as all registration requirements and other laws are followed) and may work without restriction.

Such persons will have in their possession an Alien Registration Receipt Card, Form I-151 or I-155 and must be prepared to produce it. Other aliens are non-immigrants and are admitted to this country only for specific purposes. In order for these aliens to work, they must hold in their possession an Immigration Service Form I-94 stamped "employment authorized." International students who do not possess the I-94, I-151, or I-155 forms may work on campus for a maximum of 20 hours per week, provided that they have the permission of their International Student Advisor. Spouses of these students may or may not be authorized to work, depending on their visa status. Non-immigrant aliens who accept employment without such specific permission are subject to deportation. State regulations also prohibit hiring of aliens who are not authorized for employment. We suggest that you check with the Personnel Department when in doubt.

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STATE HEALTH INSURANCE:

THE STATE HEALTH INSURANCE BENEFITS HAVE BEEN CHANGED REGARDING THE \$100 DEDUCTIBLE AS FOLLOWS:

Any covered expenses that have been properly applied toward the satisfaction of the 1978 calendar year deductible under the State Employees Group Health Insurance Plan in effect on April 30, 1978 shall be applied toward the satisfaction of the one hundred dollar (\$100) deductible under this
