REEMPLOYMENT AFTER RETIREMENT - WHAT ARE THE LIMITATIONS?

If you are mapping out plans and considering some form of work after retirement, you will do well to consider the following information. Reemployment during the first twelve months after retirement may affect your retirement benefits.

If you receive regular retirement benefits, you may work for a private employer, any public employer not covered by the Florida Retirement System (FRS), or in another state without affecting your retirement benefits. You may not, however, receive both retirement benefits and a salary from an FRS employer during the first twelve months of retirement. If you are reemployed with any FRS employer during the first twelve months of retirement, the following will apply:

- . If you are reemployed during the first calendar month of your retirement, your application for retirement benefits will be cancelled. You must then terminate your reemployment and reapply for retirement benefits, which will result in a later effective date of retirement.
- . If you are reemployed during the second through the twelfth months of retirement, you must suspend your retirement benefits during the months you are reemployed.

If you are retired for less than twelve months and wish to be reemployed with an FRS employer, contact the Bureau of Benefit Calculations at (904) 488-6491 for information on how reemployment will affect your retirement benefits.
