The Empire Lodge.



Was founded in November, 1885, for the purpose of fostering and augmenting the ties which bind the Freemasons of the British Empire to the Motherland, by affording them a place of assembly and offering them a welcome during their sojourn in London.

From the outset every effort has been made to fulfil these objects. In the exercise of its special aim the Lodge has received the hearty co-operation of Grand Lodge through both the late Grand Secretary Colonel Shadwell Clerke, and his eminent successor Sir Edward Letchworth, who have regularly communicated to the Empire Lodge the names of distinguished Indian and Colonial brethren visiting the Mother Country, as well as those desirous of witnessing Masonic work in an English Lodge. Indeed, a Meeting rarely occurs without the presence thereof of an Indian or Colonial visitor.

In order that its unique character may become even more widely known, the Lodge has quite recently been in communication with every Masonic Lodge under the British Constitution outside the United Kingdom.

The ancient and honourable Fraternity of Freemasons in every clime is earning the respect and admiration of the World. Thus the Empire Lodge claims to furnish an important link in that great chain of brotherly love which encompasses the Universe, and unites in the strongest bonds of fraternal affection the Mother Country, India, and all the British Dominions beyond the Seas.

This brief statement of the main purpose which animates the Empire Lodge is set forth on the twenty-fifth Anniversary of its birth, in the hope that its peculiar aims and objects may thereby become still more universally disseminated and understood.
