FROM THE RABBI'S DESK

Still More Trouble For The Jews

This is written on the third day of the present Arab-Israeli war. I am sure that you were as depressed as I on Yom Kippur when the first news of the war came through. I am sure that we all thought, "Not again. Isn't there ever an end to Jewish suffering?" Sometimes, it does seem almost too much to take. But let us do some comparing. Is the present situation as bad as the Warsaw Ghetto? There, the Jews had almost no chance at all. There, resistance meant total death for all concerned. In Israel, at least, the people have a chance to recoup. The casualties will inevitably be high, but most of the Israelis will be safe. So, the situation, on a relative basis, is not as bad as the Warsaw Ghetto.

It is in this kind of light that we must look at the suffering of the Israelis. It is bad, but it is better to be in your own country with your own armies than to be at the mercy of people riddled with prejudice. After the concentration camps, what is happening in Israel at this hour, terrible as it is, is relatively mild.

This is exactly how the Israeli government and people look at the war. They are much more at ease than we here in America. We can only see the awesome odds and think of Israeli destruction. They know that they are much better off in Israel than in Germany or in Poland or in the Soviet Union.


The plethora of words in the United Nations should not concern us. What should concern us is what actually happens in terms of political and military decisions. Will the U.S. continue to supply Israel with arms? Will the U.S. stand behind their only Middle East allies? My personal conviction is that the U.S. military understand that with the rise of Soviet power in the Mediterranean (through their huge fleet), Israel is really America's main hope in the Middle East. For American preservation, the U.S. will not abandon Israel.

As for the Jews of America, what can we do? We have no choice but to do what little we can. This "little" has to be interpreted in financial terms. It is "little" only because money is not much compared to blood, but it is large in the sense that the Israelis are utterly dependent upon us. Give to the CJA, give to Israel Bonds, but don't stand outside the situation. Don't act as if you are not a part of this.

What about our local needs? What about our Teenage Building and Fair Share? These needs are important too. We cannot sacrifice the future of American Jewry to save Israel. We must save BOTH. We American Jews have a double responsibility. It is wrong to think of DIVIDING your contributions between Israel and America. We must DOUBLE our contributions, and triple them!

Remember, if your giving doesn't make a difference in your standard of living, if it doesn't "hurt," you haven't given enough. Learning to give is extremely difficult, but it is one of the great joys of life.
