For this reason we have asked Gary Eisenberg to teach his course on cults and missionary movements as a part of our Adult Jewish Studies program at Beth Am. Mr. Eisenberg, in his counseling practice, has worked with families of cult members and cult members themselves.

BREAKFAST, FEB. 25 WILL FEATURE SENATOR KENNEDY'S NATIONAL HEALTH PLAN

The overwhelming problem of national health insurance will be the question for debate at the next Brotherhood Breakfast Forum on Sunday morning, February 25, at 9:30 a.m., in the Youth Lounge. Topic for the debate will be "IS THE U.S. READY FOR SENATOR KENNEDY'S NATIONAL HEALTH PLAN?" Because of the soaring costs for everyone of health and hospital care some sort of national health has been a priority of many in Congress as well as President Carter. The plan of Senator Kennedy is presently the one receiving the most consideration and discussion in and out of the halls of Congress.

Participants in the debate will be Senator Jack Gordon of Miami, who is a strong advocate of national health insurance and Dr. Edward Annis, former President of the American Medical Association who staunchly opposes any national health insurance plan. Moderator for the debate will be Mr. A. Budd Cutler, well-known Florida attorney and former president of the Health System Agency of South Florida. He was recently named to Who's Who in American Law. This will be a most interesting discussion on a subject that will affect everybody in some way or another and will be very much discussed by your legislators and the press this year.

From the Rabbi's Study

THE MORMONS AND THE JEWISH PEOPLE

Recently two nice ladies came to the door of my home. Apparently, they didn't know I was a Rabbi. They wanted to come inside to talk to me about Mormonism. I told them that I appreciated their desire, but I knew something about their religion, and I didn't have the time to meet with them. They left most reluctantly, but, first, they gave me a pamphlet entitled, "The Mormons and the Jewish People."

The pamphlet tells us that the Mormons are really very close to the Jews. The key to understanding the pamphlet, which makes some curious claims, is the fact that the ancient Hebrew nation was split into two parts after the death of King Solomon. The southern part of the kingdom was henceforth called Judah and had its capital in Jerusalem. The northern part of the kingdom was called Israel and had its capital in various cities, among them Samaria.

The Mormon pamphlet tells us the tribes in the northern kingdom were descended from Joseph (through Ephraim and Menasseh, his sons). The founder of Mormonism, a man named Joseph Smith, we are told, was a descendent of this same Joseph (of Egypt fame). Joseph Smith, the pamphlet says, was a prophet (presumably like all the famous prophets of ancient times), although he lived in America in the 19th century of this era.

The pamphlet tells us that a Prophet named Mormon made a record of all the notes kept by the descendents of the original Joseph. These descendents, we are told, came to America around 600 BC, 2,000 years before Columbus (an important point in their messagel). The Prophet Mormon made his summary record on plates of gold in the language of the Egyptians (Why Egyptian?, the people of Israel in 600 BC did not speak or write in Egyptian. They had been out of Egypt and living in Israel over 500 years).

The next link concerns how this gold Egyptian record, prepared in America in 600 BC came to the founder of modern Mormonism, Joseph Smith. The answer, according to the pamphlet, is that the Angel Moroni gave them to Joseph Smith, who, thenceforth was known as a prophet himself. At the same time the Angel Moroni gave Mr. Smith the Urim and Thummim, through which he was able to translate the engravings from Egyptian into English (For your information, the Urim and Thimmim, about which little is known, although they are mentioned in the Bible, were certainly not translating devices).

The conclusion of the Mormons and this pamphlet is that the Mormons, through the new prophet Joseph Smith, are the real descendents of the ancient Israelites (the northern kingdom), while America is the new Zion or Israel. This means, the pamphlet suggests, that we Jews, who are descendents of the Judeans (according to the pamphlet) ought to recognize our long lost brothers in the Mormons.

We ought not to forget to mention that in addition to being visited by the Angel Moroni, Joseph Smith was also visited by Elijah and Moses, as the New Testament says Jesus was. The invitation in the pamphlet is for modern Jews to let the prophet Joseph Smith (i.e. the Mormon Church) tell us what God has told him/them because we ought to accept him/them as our prophet and guide.

As I read this fascinating and imaginatively woven story, I couldn't help but wonder once again, how important we Jews are to the world. The New Testament, followed by so many tens of millions, bases its authority on the Jewish Bible and claims its right to the truth only if Jesus is in fact the Messiah forecast by the Jewish prophets. The Koran, followed by tens of millions of Mohammedans, bases its authority on the God of Israel, who presumably has chosen a prophet from another people, Mohammed, and Mohammed calls upon the Jews to follow him as our prophet also. Thus it is with the Mormons.

We must really have something, we Jews, if they all have to base their claim to the truth on our books, on our teachers, and on our God!

TU-BI-SHEVAT—Jewish Arbor Day Celebrated, Monday, February 12

The 15th of the Hebrew month of Shevat is Jewish Arbor Day. "Tu" is the Hebrew way of saying 15. School children in Israel use this day for the **planting of the trees**. In the Diaspora (countries outside of Israel) it is used as an occasion for stressing the significance of the up-building of Israel.

It was in Israel that our great culture was developed. Our distinctive language, the great literature written in that language, our inspiring music, and, above all, our great moral heritage were developed through the social, economic, political and religious institutions which were peculiar to the land of Israel.

The Bible could not have been written in any other land. It reveals the simple, moral ethics of the semitic nomad. The Mishna, which is the base of the Talmud, was prepared in Israel. Except for the Babylonian Gemara (commentary on the Mishna), Jews have not produced any literature to match the Bible and Mishna. (Individual Jews in many other countries have produced quality literature, and Jews have created art and scientific discoveries which have been of the highest benefit to man). Israel remains unique as the land of special Jewish creativeness.

Today in Israel, the Hebrew language is once again spoken as the native tongue. Once again, Jews are creating institutions expressly for Jews. They are turning out more new books than any other country in the world. They are developing new social and economic systems. (They may prove to the world that there are other economic alternatives than Communism and capitalism). Jewish religious life throughout the world has been stimulated by the resurgence of Israel. Modern Israel customs are being absorbed into American Jewish life. The study of the Hebrew language has taken on a new significance in America. The revitalization of Israel has meant more than a haven of Jewish life everywhere. It has emphasized the future in Jewish life which has emphasized, perhaps, too much from the past.
