Rabbi Herman Speaks on "Boat People" Friday, February 15th at Service

It is a privilege to announce that distinguished Rabbi Erwin Herman, longtime Regional Director of the Pacific Southwest Council/UAHC, and leading American Reform Rabbi, will occupy our pulpit to commemorate the beginning of the Vietnamese "Boat People" re-settlement program in the Greater Miami area. Rabbi Herman has served the UAHC and the Social Action Commission for 22 years and created the Regional Office in the Los Angeles area. Together with Rabbi Steven Jacobs of Temple Judea/Los Angeles, Rabbi Herman has developed a step-by-step program of "Boat People" re-settlement for temples and synagogues all over the United States. He and Rabbi Jacobs represented the Jewish people, the UAHC, and the United States at the Conference on Refugees sponsored by the United Nations in Geneva, Switzerland this past November. Rabbi Herman will address the issues and outline a program of participation for the Greater Miami temples.

Not far from Israel is Iran. Not far from Israel, Iran is now the tinder box, ready to erupt, all because of the oil in the ground. Our next Brotherhood Breakfast Forum will address itself to the world's most troublesome spot and its relationship with Israel. "IRAN, OIL AND ISRAEL" will be the topic of discussion on Sunday morning, February 17, at 9:30 a.m., in the Youth Lounge. Speaker will be Mr. Itzhak Aloni of Tel Aviv, Israel. Mr. Aloni is the Jewish Agency representative in charge of the Israel Programs Office in Florida. He served in the Six Day War and the Yom Kippur War. At present he is also a member of the Israeli Military Reserves attached to the Engineering Corps. He has also been an advisor to the Israeli cabinet on drug-abuse in the Israeli ARMY. The press in the United States has written very little if anything about the implications of Israel and its relationship to the Iranian situation. If you want to focus in on that problem come to this Brotherhood breakfast and bring your own guestions along.

Body Health Course To Be Taught Four Tuesdays Beginning Feb. 19 - 8 To 9:30 P.M.

The adult Education Institute announces UNDERSTANDING YOURSELF THROUGH YOUR BODY, a four week course beginning Tuesday, February 19th, designed to help you use your body as a tool for self-awareness, stress reduction, and personal growth. The course description reads:

Our instructor is Shira Baumgard, who has her Masters in Social Work, and is a dance/movement therapist who has taught this course throughout the city and gives workshops on the subject as well. She works as a dance movement therapist in several mental health facilities.

FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY

Our Silver Anniversary (Final column - part three)

Last week we talked about some of the aspects of the Temple program. A Temple does not live by buildings alone. On the contrary, Beth Am has succeeded in constructing so many buildings only because of the special soul of this congregation. We have tried to meet the needs of our members. Last week we spoke about our Religious School, our Day School, our Adult Ed program, our Hospital Visitation Corps and our Counselling program.

No less significant are our programs for Youth, Singles, Senior Citizens, Sisterhood and Brotherhood. And don't let's forget our Library and our Religious Services. How many congregations of which you know have a basketball league with a hundred youngsters participating regularly? How many have a dance program for seventh graders (our Cotillion) that is oversubscribed and has to run in two units? How many congregations have separate youth groups for eighth graders, ninth graders, and older high school children (our BAFTY)? How many congregations have a separate Family Service once a month and a separate Singles Service monthly? How many sponsor a Young Singles group and a group for mature Contemporaries?

No program of ours has been more successful than the extracurricular singing group for young people directed by Harriet Potlock. Harriet has taken her youngsters to other congregations around the country and to Disney World. They have performed on T.V. and with the Florida Philharmonic.

Beth Am would never have been so successful without its wonderful Sisterhood. Selma Rappaport, its current president, is symbolic of its activities. She is omnipresent. At the recent international convention of our Reform congregations in Toronto, our Sisterhood received special awards for its contributions to the Reform Kibbutz in Israel and to the YES fund (the national Youth and Education fund of Sisterhood). The Judaic Shop and the Oneg Shabbats are just a few of the visible symbols of our Sisterhood.

Abe Eisenman is the reigning president of our Brotherhood which sponsors the Temple's monthly breakfast featuring discussions of local and national current events. The Brotherhood sponsors the Jewish Chatauqua Society which makes it possible for hundreds of Rabbis to give courses on college campuses. The Brotherhood initiated and ran for many years our highly successful Blood Bank which makes it possible for your loved ones to get blood when they need it.

The Temple Library, dedicated in honor of Daniel and Fannie Serott, is the core of many activities. It has about 7,000 volumes with a high reading turnover. Margot Berman has been our chief librarian for many years and Rose Sobol is her capable assistant. Both young people and adults avail themselves of this beautiful and richly stacked facility. (Come in and browse around!).


We have left the Religious Services for last, because this aspect of Temple life is so obvious. Not many members of our Temple know that we average a thousand worshippers each week at our Friday and Saturday morning services. Over 125 B'nai Mitzvot (bar and bat mitzvah children) participate in our Shabbat services each year. The music at these services has been outstanding. Our Choir, conducted by Selma Baumgard, is exciting, and our soloist Joe Rubin and our organist Jim Bennet have added to the professional dimensions of our musical program.

It helps to have a good professional staff. Integrity has, I think, been the hallmark of those who have been with this Temple for many years, among them Selma Baumgard, Choir Director, Harriet Potlock, Director of Religious School music, David Stuart, as Administrator, Joan Schwartzman, as Assistant Administrator, Sima Lesser as Day School Director, Margot Berman and Rose Sobol in the Library, Rose Ashbes as Camp

After March 17, registration will be open to the general public.




