BETH AM DAY CAMP KIBBUTZ

Teddi Segal, Chairperson Camp Committee and Nancy Weinfeld, Day Camp Director are pleased to announce a new day camp program, **Mini-Kibbutz**.

Beth Am Day Campers will be involved in a unique learning and growing experience at camp this summer. In addition to our usual day camp activities, Beth Am Day Camp will be initiating a **Mini-Kibbutz**.

Present plans are to include young farm animals and an incubator for hatching eggs. A small farm for growing flowers and vegetables will also be an intreged part of our **Mini-Kibbutz**.

Campers will feed and care for ducks, chickens, bunnies and goats. They will plant, water and weed a small garden, and experience the actual hatching of chickens and ducks in our own incubator.

Fran and Dan Martinelli have volunteered their services and special knowledge and love of animals to this program. They believe that a **Mini-Kibbutz** experience encourages a sense of responsibility and empathy with the animals and with the world at large.

The Mini-Kibbutz will be more than a farm with tame animals, but a fully integrated camp program including Israeli music, dance, cooking and more!

This will be a marvelous opportunity for our campers to learn, relate, and develop a responsible attitude towards animals, the land and their Jewish identity.

Federation of U.A.H.C. Iris chaired the Social Action, Religious and Youth Committees of Beth Am in the past, and was Vice President of both Sisterhood and the Temple. She was the recipient of the Temple's Harry Gunther Award for youth activities. She is currently serving as the Temple's Corresponding Secretary.

Iris has announced that there will be a town hall type of open meeting for members of the congregation to express their opinions on replacement qualifications for the Senior Rabbi position. This meeting will be held on Tuesday, May 7th, at 7:30 p.m. in Room 101. We hope to have a good cross section of the congregation represented at this meeting, young and older people, new members and long time members, single parents and couples with and without children, and seniors. It is anticipated that this will be an arduous undertaking which will require some eight or nine months of searching and interviewing before a final decision is made.

FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY



Are We 'The Chosen People?'

Our Bible makes it clear that our fathers considered themselves to have been chosen by God as His special people (Ahm S'gulah). For hundreds of years, Jews who inherited the tradition of Abraham have been puzzled by the concept of "Choseness." If God "chose" the Jews, why, then, have the Jews suffered? The question reveals a misunderstanding of the subtleties of the doctrine of choseness.

When Abraham was chosen by his God, it was an era when all the surrounding peoples considered that they, too, were chosen by their particular chief god. The concept of choseness includes, as its corollary, the notion that the people also chose. They each chose a god whom they wished to follow, even as the god "chose" them. Each people entered into a covenant or contract with a particular god. The difference between the Hebrews and their contemporaries was not that the Jews were chosen and the other peoples were not. The difference was in the god with which each people chose to ally itself in contract.

To covenant with a god meant to follow his laws. The significance of the Hebraic covenant with their God was the unmatched excellence of the laws associated with Him. Since these laws were on a much higher ethical level than the laws associated with Baal or Moloch or the other "gods." The particular choice that the Hebrews made resulted in an extra burden for them. The other side of "Choseness" was commitment, partnership.

Only the unlearned Jew has interpreted "Choseness" to mean that the Jew would get special rewards. The prophet Amos dramatically pointed out (8th century B.C.E.) that since God was the Father of all peoples, "Choseness" for the Jew meant only that as His first child, the Jew would be required to perform in more exemplary fashion.

In the end, then, the question, "Are the Jews the chosen people?" can only be answered by the Jews of each generation -- for themselves. We are chosen if we assume the covenant of following the laws associated with our God. We demonstrate our choseness by our actions. We are chosen to be the special representative of God, if we are in the vanguard of those who mediate His qualities to the world about us.

There is a special obligation involved in this inherited doctrine of choseness. If we do not admit to its validity in the present, then we are betraying generations of Jews who lived and died to make it true. Can it have been true for our ancestors, but not for us? Alas, if it is not true for us, also, then, it was not true for them, either. Can we make a lie of four thousand years of noble history? I trust not.
