

FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY



The Israeli Vote on 'Who Is A Jew'

This is written on January 16th, the day on which the Israeli Knesset voted to defeat the Orthodox motion to limit the definition of "Who Is A Jew" to "one born of a Jewish mother or one converted by an Orthodox board". The Orthodox motion would have excluded from Israeli immigration anyone converted into the faith by Conservative and Reform Rabbis. Abba Eban had called the motion. "An attempt to reverse the character of Jewish history". Mr. Eban, along with most of American Jewry, applauded the defeat of the narrow motion.

On the other side of the picture is the liberalism manifested by Shlomo Goren, who at one time was the Chief Rabbi in Israel. Rabbi Goren had authorized the transplant of a kidney from a slain veshivah student to a nine year old Arab girl at Hadassah Hospital. The young man, 23 years old, had been slain by Arab terrorists near Hebron. The Arab girl belongs to a family which has been known for its warm support of the PLO

At that time, in 1970, Orthodox circles were just forming a modern doctrine concerning transplants. Since Orthodox Jews believe in the resurrection of the dead, they discourage any kind of mutilation of the body. Rabbi Goren has ruled that where there is an immediate need for a transplant, it may be performed. This is a tremendous change for the Orthodox, who previously have discouraged even autopsy. The ruling of Rabbi Goren is what is truly an extreme situation (a murdered Jew and an Arab from a PLO family) does show us that the Orthodox are capable of important adaptation.

Recently I attended a local conference sponsored by the University of Miami Medical School, concerning organ transplants. More and more of this kind of operation is being successfully done. Reform Jews do not believe in the resurrection of the body (but in some kind of spiritual survival). Accordingly, we see no reason why a person cannot donate his organs, at this death, to some living person who can use them. You might want to think of saving someone else's life in this way. You will be able to obtain further information on this important subject.
