

# Legislative Committee to Address Brotherhood Breakfast Forum March 17th



## FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY



## The Seagull and the Tree (Part One)

(For the next two weeks we will present excerpts from my sermon available in full from the Rabbi's Office.)

Consider now, what do we tell our children from the moment they are born? We tell them we are raising them to be members of royalty. If they are not to be kings and queens, at least they are to be doctors and lawyers and psychologists and millionaires. From the moment they are born, we put a book in their hands, and we say, "This is your sole responsibility to us. You must get the best grades in school. You must go to the best college. You must become a professional. You must earn a great deal of money, and you must be secure economically, like a king." Isn't this what we tell them?

It is we who make our children self-centered. We are afraid to give them any chores in the house lest we take time away from their books. We do not ask them to contribute to the purchase of the family food or to the payment of the rent. We ask them only to take from us what we insist on giving, and we ask them to study.

#### The Joy Of Being Needed

When I was a boy, I had the privilege of living through the great depression. I had the privilege of selling newspapers as a street boy and putting food on the family table. Do you know what joy that can bring to a young boy; to know that he is important to his family in so vital a matter as food, to know that he is needed and that he is a part of a solemn and important effort? Our children today are denied that kind of privilege. We are, fortunately or unfortunately, too well off.

Now let us be fair about this. Studying is not the child's natural goal. It is we who insist that be his all consuming passion. It is we who nurture the thought that self-improvement is the most important goal in the world. We say nothing to our children about family needs or the needs of the Jewish people or the needs of America. Now let us face this question, "Of what can a bookworm properly dream?" Does a bookworm, overwhelmed with intellectual discipline, bored with sitting, dream about rootedness? Does he dream about being a tree? Of course not! He dreams about movement. He dreams about running and flying. He dreams of the seagull. He dreams about throwing off intellectual discipline, and to accomplish this, he may very well have to revolt against those who impose this discipline on him.

But Rabbi, you might ask, are you saying that we shall give up the traditional Jewish emphasis on learning? I am not saying that at all. What I am saying is that learning is not the only thing in the world. I am saying that even more important than academic learning and preparation for a career is teaching a child his responsibilities to the family, to the Jewish people, and to his country.

Since we do not give our children the opportunity to work for family, people, and country, we are teaching them something else. In addition to teaching them of the consuming importance of a career, we teach them to receive. We do not teach them how to give, to share; we teach them to take. No wonder so many of our children join all sorts of crazy groups that offer just these other possibilities for them! What does the Rev. Moon offer his young people? He offers them work for a cause, a high purpose beyond themselves, and belonging to a meaningful group. We Jews have all these things to offer and more, but we don't offer it. All we offer is attendance at the best college and free room, board, and spending money!


The 7th and 8th Grade Group will be going to Disney World on March 16th. Anyone interested in going must contact Fran as soon as possible at 666-4463.
