FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY



Understanding the Sick Person

BETH AM SUMMER CAMPS START MONDAY, JUNE 23RD



As this column is written, I am recovering nicely from my surgery. After the third week, I have been coming into the office for a half day and working progressively into my schedule. While it may clearly be said that I am substantially recovered from the surgery, there still are some very interesting (?) after effects.

For years I have visited people in the hospital and tried to sympathize with their pains and problems. I thought I understood, but it is only now when I have joined the ranks of the patient that I can fully understand what it is that a sick person goes through.

For example, while I was in the hospital, the cheerful attendants would bring me meal trays full of the delicious goodies that emanate from the hospital kitchen. I would quickly wave the attendant away and refuse to eat even one bite of the delicacies. My wife was very disturbed. She let me know that she felt it important for me to eat so that I could regain my strength. What I was unable to communicate to her was the fact that it was simply impossible for me to eat at all. The effects of medicine and the unusual aroma of the food combined to make the whole thing repulsive. It is only now that I am able to understand the sick person's inability to eat at times. This phenomenon can be guite gripping and overwhelming. I have also learned more deeply the importance of emotional support given to a patient. The congregation has been simply wonderful in its outpouring of support both during the early phases of my surgery and later as I have been recovering. I was surprised to see how significant this support was. I had imagined myself to be quite independent and equal to the problems that surgery would present, but the truth is that the support which was directed my way not only from adults but also from children, proved to be very touching. Major surgery is a very humbling experience. It is a profound reminder of one's mortality and insignificance. It is an assault on the ego. Friends and well-wishers help keep you afloat. It helps also to believe in the miraculous nature of the human body, a gift from God to us. It helps to have confidence in the professional learning and in the caring of your doctors.

To undergo major surgery is to participate in a battle. Remember this the next time you have a friend in the hospital. Let him know you're on his side. In traditional Judaism, "Bikur Cholim, visiting the sick" is a major mitzvah. Modern Jews might well practice it.
