The difference between Camp Coleman (the regional UAHC-Reform camp) and other camps is in the motivation of the counsellors. They are carefully picked from a super-abundance of applicants because of their caring nature.

Camp Coleman is located in an idyllic setting and has a large lake. It has everything other camps have plus - plus a special attitude and spirit. Young Rabbis from throughout the region spend tours of duty there during the summer to back-up the social and athletic counsellors. Swimming, hiking, tennis, baseball, basketball, side-trips, all are part of the format along with those extra things that only a Jewish oriented camp can provide.

Israel and the Arabs

In recent weeks there have been more and more hostages taken by the various Islamic factions in Lebanon. The snatchings have been aimed primarily at the United States and at Israel. The inference, with respect to Israel, is that if only the Israelis would give the PLO what it wants, there will be peace in the Middle-East.

Is it possible for Israel to give the PLO what it wants? The PLO charter, repeatedly affirmed by Arafat, contends that its object is to push the Israelis into the sea. The more sophisticated representatives of the PLO soften this to mean that they only want Israel to surrender its independence and become part of a larger Arab "democratic" state with an Arab majority. Jews already know what it is to live in an Islamic state as a minority. They have done that for over a thousand years. Many books have been written on the Islamic conviction that only "believers" are entitled to full citizenship and "democracy" for non-believers is the acceptance of a second-rate status which varies with the mood of the particular Arab ruler. Clearly the Israelis cannot give the PLO what it wants.

A very good book on the subject of Arab-Israeli relations was recently published, called "The Siege". It is written by an Irish diplomat who happens to be a distinguished historian. (I think the author's name is Connor Cruse). The book is available at your bookstore. The book gives the full record of Arab-Israeli relations including the good and the bad on both sides. At times you think the author is too hard on the Israelis, but his conclusion is that they have no alternative but to do pretty much what they are doing. In effect, he says that the Arabs have rejected every compromise and that they will never really accept an independent Jewish state.

With what is going on in the Middle-East, in Lebanon and between Iran and Iraq, for example, with the news of cruel Syrian suppression of anti-government groups in Syria, one can only conclude that Israel must stand its ground courageously. Of course, the extreme radicalism of Rabbi Kahane, Geula Cohen and her group only complicate an already difficult situation. Kahane and Cohen only prove that Jews too can be crazy.

I am sure that there are times, as now, when you wish that Israel was not so prominently in the news. At times we American Jews, far from the fighting lines, may think, "Why can't the Israelis give in a little". The sad truth is that giving in will not accomplish the peace the Israelis seek. When Israel ceded the Sinai to Egypt in the search for peace, Israel did what no nation has ever done before, give back territory won in battle in a trade for peace. Looking back on the Sadat offer, we can see that Egypt got the best of that deal and has given very little in return. Such generous grants on the part of Israel are the more difficult to make as the bargaining relates to territory in the Israeli front yard, so to speak. How close can you let someone come to you when he has sworn only to kill you and dispossess you?

Yes, we would like Israel off of the front pages and out of the newscasts, but so long as Israel refuses to surrender to the Arabs, her name will be news. In that sense, we must hope to hear a great deal about her.
