THE BEGINNING: UNIVERSITY CELEBRATES OPENING DAY

At the Opening Day Ceremony on Thursday, September 14, Florida International University was officially declared open at 10:57 a.m. by President Perry. More than 1,800 persons turned out for the historic ceremony, which was held in front of Primera Casa. Noting that the opening came after 36 months of planning and preparation, President Perry said: "Let us remember, therefore, that Florida International University was born today to serve all of the tomorrows that follow. And let us always be mindful of our continued commitment and dedication to Knowledge, Service, and Understanding."



The ceremony featured the lighting of The University Torch of Knowledge, Service, and Understanding in memory of the late Ernest R. Graham, the State Senator from Miami who first introduced legislation to establish a state university in South Florida. Regent James J. Gardener paid tribute to the Senator in his remarks. Mrs. Graham and two sons, William A. Graham, Chairman of the Board of Sengra Development Corporation and The Graham Company, and D. Robert Graham, State Senator from Dade County, attended the ceremony.

Giving a special emphasis to this event in the history of Greater Miami and South Florida, Lieut. Governor Tom Adams presented a proclamation by Governor Reubin Askew declaring September 14 as Florida International University Day. Similar proclamations were made by Mayor Steve Clark of Metropolitan Dade County and Mayor David Kennedy of Miami. (Cont'd. Page 4)

LATIN AFFAIRS EXPERT TO SPEAK

"Catholicism and Revolution in Latin America" will be the topic of a lecture by Dr. Frederick C. Turner, Professor of Political Science at the University of Connecticut, when he visits Florida International on Friday, October 13.

Dr. Turner, a magna cum laude graduate of Harvard University who received the Ph.D. in 1965 from the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy, is the author of two books on Latin American topics. Catholicism and Political Development in Latin America, published in 1971, was the result of more than 80 interviews in 17 Latin American countries. Dr. Turner's 1968 work, Dynamic of Mexican Nationalism, was also published in Spanish in 1971.

The lecture will be delivered in Room 330, Primera Casa, at 3:30 p.m. Oct. 13, and is sponsored by the Center for International Affairs and the Dept. of Political Science, according to Dr. Martin Greenberg, department chairman.

DEAN GIORDANO NAMED TO STATE UNIVERSITY SYSTEM POST

Dr. E. A. Giordano, Dean of University Services and Continuing Education, has been selected to assume the position of Director of Academic Program Development and Continuing Education for The State University System of Florida, effective Oct. 1. In announcing Dean Giordano's appointment, President Perry said: "I am disappointed to lose Dr. Giordano, but he will be a great asset to Florida International in his new position." Dr. Ronald Newell will be responsible for the Division until a replacement is named.

LANGUAGE TRAINING PROGRAM

More than 170 Florida International faculty and staff have begun classes in Spanish through the intensive language training program sponsored by the Center for International Affairs and the Department of Modern Languages. The small group sessions with native speakers are held one hour daily and will continue for ten weeks, having begun September 25. This cost-free course is being offered through the Division of University Services and Continuing Education.

DRIVING REMINDERS: All vehicles must be registered within two weeks from opening of classes. To register, you must present your University indentification card for the vehicle being registered to the Cashiers office (Room 212, Primera Casa) and pay the appropriate fee. To avoid traffic tie-ups on the Trail during the rush to early morning classes, students and faculty are reminded of alternate routes to the campus. Those coming from the south may take Bird Road or Coral Way to 107th. Those driving from the north may take Flagler Street, then south on 107th.

SOCCER TEAM BEATS UNIVERSITY OF MIAMI

In a game marked by injuries and rough play, Florida International's soccer team won its season opener, beating the University of Miami, 1-0. Besides getting the season off to a winning start, the game has historical impact because it will go into the record books as the first intercollegiate athletic match participated in by a Florida International team. The lone goal was scored by forward Roberto Sabbheh, in a pass from Marcos Blanco. The team, coached by Greg Myers, is largely made up of Miami-Dade Junior College graduates.

ATHLETIC TRAINING PROGRAM

Florida International is initiating an athletic training program in conjunction with the intercollegiate athletic program, according to Bobby Barton, the University's Head Trainer. An auxiliary function of sports medicine, athletic training is involved with the prevention, care and rehabilitation of athletic injuries.

Opportunities in the field are "very good," Barton said, particularly at the high school level. More and more school districts are realizing the advantages of having a trainer on their staffs. The reasons for this, he said, are that high school coaching staffs are small in number, which limits the time coaches can devote to athletic training programs, and that high schools in small communities do not have physicians experienced in athletic medicine.
