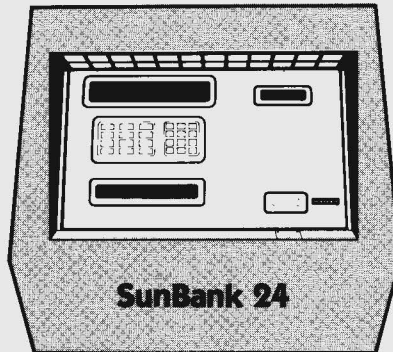

## The Brain Trust:

# DANNY PRICE

## Head Baseball Coach

**W**hat Danny Price has done in his two seasons as head coach of the Sunblazers is to totally apply himself to the project at hand. Whether it be in the coaching box, at a podium in front of a South Florida service organization, soliciting assistance from friends and local businesses, or operating youth clinics and camps, Price has committed himself through promotions and fund raising to the continued growth and success of the Florida International University Intercollegiate baseball program.

"My goal is to continue our winning tradition and expand on it," said Price. "We're trying hard to put Florida International baseball on the national map as a collegiate powerhouse."

"Trying hard" is truly an understatement. In fact, Price, his entire coaching staff and even his student-athletes have gone to great lengths to make this dream a reality. Since last summer, the F.I.U. baseball program has sponsored a summer youth camp, a Christmas camp featuring major league batting instructor Charlie Lau and several free youth clinics, participated in both a 75-inning marathon game and a three-game series against a team of Cuban all-stars, sold Christmas trees, advertisements for their yearbook and solicited donations for a stadium fence, operated a concession stand at all Miami Dolphin home football games and special events on campus.

"The main purpose behind so many of our projects is to showcase Sunblazers baseball," he said. "We want to get the word out that there is a quality intercollegiate baseball program on this side of town. I'm not particularly keen on the pure fund raising aspects but we've got to do them if we plan on surviving."

"The potential for this program is certainly here. It may be a little deeper than I originally thought, but it's here," Price said. "Being a new college in town, your roots aren't all that deep when it comes down to getting fan support and going after money, but it's getting better. We've got more contacts this year than last year and more last year than the year before. We're growing, and with the addition of field lighting next season, we're hoping this program will take off."

After a lifetime of hard work followed by success, like E. F. Hutton, when Danny Price talks, people are learning to stop and listen. Even as a youngster in high school, at Rocky Mount, NC's Northern Nash, he showed ambition that brought recognized success. He was an all-star performer for three seasons in both football and baseball while working to help support his family.

When it came time to go on to college, he and his young wife Betty Jean left home to attend Indian River Community College in Ft. Pierce where, concentrating solely on baseball, he was selected a Florida junior college all-star outfielder.

In 1973, Price starred on Florida International's initial baseball team. He was a starter on that 41-25 squad coached by Tom Wonderling and led the Sunblazers with 79 base hits, a school record that stood for six seasons. In recognition of his offensive prowess, Price was voted that team's Most Valuable Player award and selected co-

captain of the following year's squad.

In September of 1974, Price joined the staff at Miami's Central High school and was named as an assistant coach for both baseball and football. After practice sessions, he went to night school and worked toward a master of science degree in Health Education which he earned at F.I.U. in 1976.

It was in 1978 that Price got the chance to be involved in college baseball. Coach Wonderling needed a batting instructor and help with recruiting. He invited Price to help him and was so impressed, he offered Price the position of assistant on a strictly volunteer basis which he accepted. During that following spring, the Sunblazers went on to break or tie 36 offensive records enroute to a team batting average of .318.

When Wonderling was appointed director of athletics at Cal Poly Pomona early in 1980, Price was elevated as F.I.U.'s head baseball coach, only the second in the school's eight year history.

Through the following season, under Price's tutorage, the club broke or tied another 45 offensive categories and raised the team average 19 points higher than the year before enroute to Florida International's most successful season ever. Price's accomplishments did not go unnoticed. The Florida Diamond Club selected him as its State Division II Coach of the Year, while the City of Miami City Commission honored him and his team with a Proclamation



of Excellence after their 41-14 season which included a fourth place finish in the NCAA College Division World Series. That summer, he was appointed as an assistant coach on the U.S. Baseball Federation's 18-and-under team that competed in the Friendship International Juvenile Tournament in Venezuela, South America.

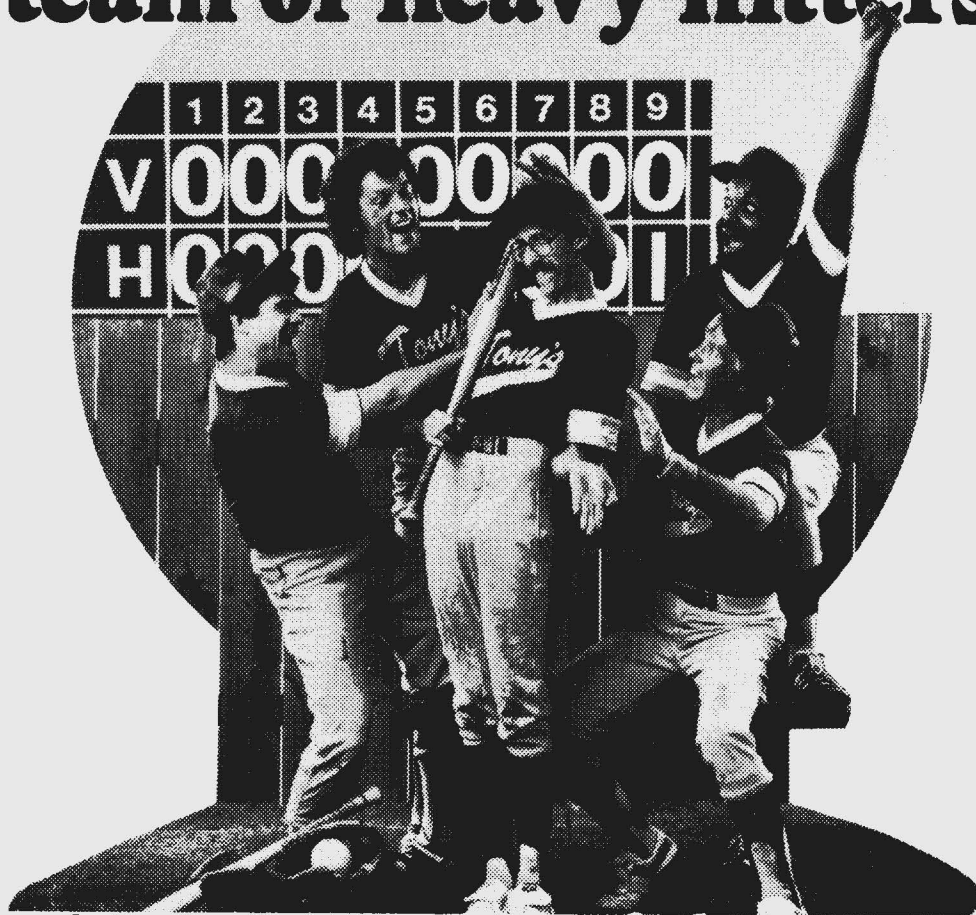
Last year was another outstanding season. While the team failed to be selected for postseason play for the first time in four seasons, the Sunblazers finished 41-17 and ended with a team batting average of .344, another seven points higher than the previous year.

Maybe this is why Price seems so committed to the Sunblazers cause.

"Next to my family, Sunblazers baseball comes next," he admitted. "I'm home grown. I went to school at Florida International and I have a lot of deep roots here. I want to see this program go somewhere—move ever forward."

Price is also highly philosophical when it comes to the benefits of intercollegiate baseball on the lives of his student-athletes. He says baseball, like life itself, isn't always the way one thinks it always should be and if a player takes all he can from the sport, he can only be a better person for it. "Life is like a roller coaster," he said. "You've got to get yourself back up at times and do what needs to be done. You've got to learn to work with people even if you don't much like them. You've got to go out and make things work. All these things and more can be learned through participation in baseball."

# THE TENTH SEASON

## 1982 Team Prospects

To look at Danny Price these days, prior to his third season at the helm of the Sunblazers, you would think he was preparing for a tough Sunshine State Conference schedule and an even tougher fight for the Conference championship.

"Our goal is the same as always," the coach said. "We want to be as good as we can be, get a regional bid then qualify for the World Series. We play 59 games this season so if we're going to reach this goal we're going to have to win 40 to 45 games and somewhere between 65 to 85 percent of our games against Conference opponents."

Actually, the Sunblazers are not in the Sunshine State Conference. In fact, F.I.U. is the only Division II athletic program in the State of Florida not in the Conference although application has been sought. So why the concern? Last season, despite winning 41 games, the fifth most wins of any Division II school in the nation, F.I.U. was snubbed from playoff competition because of a lack of head-to-head confrontations with Sunshine State opponents.

At first glance, this year's schedule may not seem as strong as last. Gone is Michigan and Maine, both Division I World Series participants, as well as teams like St. Joseph's (PA), George Washington University and Jacksonville. In their place, however, Price has substituted Conference opponents Central Florida (31-23), St. Leo (28-19), Florida Institute of Technology (30-19) and defending champion Eckerd (33-18). He's scheduled cross-town rivals, the University of Miami (61-10) five times and Bis-cayne College (25-21) four times.

If that weren't a difficult enough task, Price has scheduled an out-of-state trip for the last week of the regular season that will take the Sunblazers to Valdosta State (39-19), Columbus (33-19), and Albany State (18-8). Price sees the trip as a chance to gain national exposure immediately preceding tournament selection day, Monday, May 10.

Hitting and defense should once again be the cornerstone of the Sunblazers, but Price is also excited about his pitching staff which he believes could be "one of our strongest departments this year."

Last season, F.I.U. relied on a potent offensive attack that averaged 9.2 runs per game (ranked third nationally among all Division II schools) and hit for .344 (ranked sixth). Defensively, despite injuries that forced many players out of position, the Sunblazers had a .953 fielding average, good enough to be ranked twelfth nationally.

### PITCHING

For the first time since the Sunblazers went to the College Division World Series in 1979, Price will open the spring with an experienced, four-man, senior pitching rotation. The Sunblazers will rely on righthanders **Ric Strasser** (9-2, 2.67 ERA) from Cincinnati, OH via Indian River C.C., **Steve Weaver** (3-1, 4.28 ERA) from White Plains, NY and Miami-Dade C.C. South, **Bobby Govin** (7-5, 4.53 ERA) from Miami and Miami-Dade C.C. New World Center and lefthander **Rory Brown** (6-5, 5.33 ERA) from Ft. Lauderdale and Broward C.C. for the bulk of the starting assignments.

Several others like senior lefthander **Tim Johnson** (3-0, 4.95 ERA in 1980, injured last season from Davensport, IA and Indian Hills C.C. and junior righthander **Denny Murray** from Syracuse, NY and Onondaga C.C. can either spot-start or enter the starting rotation should injury or ineffectiveness occur and will be called on in certain relief situations.

But the majority of relief appearances should come from two juniors, righthanders **Ossie Alfonzo** from Hialeah and MDCC-New World Center and **Mark Brown** from Jacksonville and Dade-South. Alfonzo boasts of a rubber arm and will be called upon in late inning situations while Brown will be used mostly in the middle innings.

"I see a lot of difference between this staff and a year ago," said pitching coach Steve Bomse. "There's more unity, more consistency, and everyone of them can pitch."

### CATCHING

There was a period of time last season when Price actually had to call upon the services of an infielder to go behind the plate after injuries sidelined all three Sunblazer catchers. This year, that infielder, senior **Jim Potucek** (.288, 16 RBIs), a tireless worker from Brooklyn, NY (MDCC-South), could step in and handle the regular catching duties after a year of intensive on-the-job training.

Juniors **Matt Thayer** from Decarah, IA (Indian Hills C.C.), who came on toward the end of the fall season, and **Ed Nicolace** from Vero Beach (Indian River C.C.) will also be vying for the starting position.

### INFIELD

The Sunblazers offensive and defensive prowess is most apparent when viewing the individual infield positions. Senior **Gary Mueller** (.304, 14 HRs, 45 RBIs) from Plantation (Broward C.C.) at first base ranked 15th nationally in home run average and this season has a legitimate shot at

breaking school records for career home runs, RBIs and total bases.

Second base will belong to junior **Ronnie Chapman** from Greenville, NC (Louisburg College). Chapman has excellent speed which Price plans to take advantage of in the leadoff spot in the batting order and possesses an excellent glove.

**Neni Delgado**, a junior from Miami (MDCC-South) will take charge at shortstop. Delgado has a good glove with an arm capable of making a strong throw from the hole.

**Ben Donisi** (.308, 27 RBI), a senior from Plantation (Broward C.C.), will see full-time duty at third base after spending most of the '81 season at short. Donisi, named co-captain of this year's Sunblazers, had an excellent second half of last season and an even better fall both offensively and defensively.

Senior **Pablo Barrios** from Miami (Broward C.C.), junior **Eric Medina** from Pureto Rico J.C. and **Keith Platt**, the team's only freshman from Ada, OK (Vanoss Senior High School) will see action in back-up roles both in the infield and outfield.

"This is probably one of the tightest infields we've ever had," said Price.

### OUTFIELD

Two-thirds of this season's starting outfield will be new faces come opening day. Centerfield will be roamed by junior **Oriol Perez** from Hialeah (Indian River C.C.) While Perez may not have the blazing speed common to many centerfielders, he does have the ability to get a good jump on the ball and has excellent abilities.

He'll be flanked in rightfield by **Pete Post** (.372, 56 RBIs), a senior from Orlando (Edison C.C.). His exceptional credentials with the bat, arm and legs should make him a possible All-American candidate and lead to a promising professional future.

Junior **Raumar Hernandez** from Miami (Miami-Dade C.C. North) will take over leftfield. Hernandez is an excellent gloveman with the speed to run down many a line drive.

Senior **Jorge Migar** from Cincinnati (Edgecliff College), probably the fastest man on the team, can fill in at all three outfield positions.

### DESIGNATED HITTER

The DH position will belong to probably the best pure hitter on the squad, senior **Jay Bogaards** (.394, 2 HR, 3 RBI) from Miami (Miami-South). Bogaards transferred from Birmingham-Southern and, after sitting out two-thirds of last season, came on in the last 15 games to collect 13 hits in 33 at bats and score 11 runs.

# Assistant Coaches



## Steve Bomse

Steve Bomse begins his second season as an assistant baseball coach at Florida International University.

Bomse, who will work closely with Sunblazer pitchers, was himself an all-star hurler at Miami's Coral Park High School, Miami-Dade C.C. North and the University of Arizona. While a member of his junior college staff, Bomse posted a two year record of 15-1 and a 0.75 ERA. Following his collegiate career, Bomse played three seasons of professional ball for the Tucson Latins of the Mexican League.

A lifelong resident of Miami, Bomse has been associated with coaching since 1974 when he was appointed junior varsity coach at Coral Park. In 1977, he was selected coach of Miami's American Legion Post 300 team and a season later, joined Red Barry's staff at Biscayne College. Two seasons ago, Bomse coached under Ron Fraser at the University of Miami.

Bomse, 33, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Martin Bomse of Miami.

## Rolando Casanova

Rolando Casanova returns as a Florida International assistant baseball coach after guiding Miami's Loyola High School to the State Championships last season.

Casanova, who played his high school ball at Loyola and later advanced to Miami-Dade C.C. South and F.I.U. as a shortstop, works closely with Sunblazer infielders.

Like Bomse, Casanova has been involved with youth coaching since 1974 when he was named junior varsity baseball and basketball coach at his high school alma mater. In 1975, he was elevated to an assistant of the Bulldogs varsity baseball program. Two years later, Casanova was plucked by Red Barry as an assistant for the 1978 Biscayne College team. In 1979 and 1980, Casanova coached at F.I.U.

Married to the former Sylvia Margaret Betancourt of Camaquey, Cuba, Casanova is 25 years old.



## Randy Koenigsfeld

Randy Koenigsfeld, the youngest of the Sunblazers assistants, begins his first season of coaching in charge of catchers.

Koenigsfeld is no stranger to the F.I.U. winning tradition, having played with both the World Series team of 1980 and last season's squad. An intense competitor, Koenigsfeld, the 'Blazers regular catcher in 1981, not only qualified for the Sunblazers All-Time Defensive team (.992 fielding percentage with two errors in 45 games) but also his .378 batting average was the highest single season average of any F.I.U. catcher in its nine year history. Small wonder Price asked him to return and help stabilize a young catching staff with 11 total intercollegiate games behind the plate among them.

Prior to coming to F.I.U., Koenigsfeld was named All-Conference in both baseball and football at Charles City H.S. then advanced to Indian Hills C.C. where he hit .305 as a sophomore.

Koenigsfeld, 22, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Louis Koenigsfeld of Charles City, IA.

# Florida International University



Florida International University had quite a beginning. Established by the Florida Legislature on June 22, 1965, classes opened on September 19, 1972, with an initial enrollment of 5,667 undergraduate and graduate students, the largest first-year enrollment recorded by any of the more than 2,000 colleges and universities spawned during more than 300 years of higher education in the United States.

Today, there are some 11,500 students enrolled in the University's College of Arts and Sciences, and School of Business and Organizational Sciences; Education; Health and Social Services; Hospitality Management; and Technology. A fully accredited member of the State University System of Florida, the University offers undergraduate and graduate level courses for degrees at the Baccalaureate and Masters levels.

An urban and internationally-oriented institution, Florida International is the first state university to serve Florida's largest population center which includes Greater Miami and Ft. Lauderdale. By the 1990's the University, with its two campuses at Tamiami and North Miami, will grow to an enrollment of 30,000 students making it the largest in the state system.

The student body is comprised of a wide range of ages and backgrounds. More than eighty percent of the students hold full or part-time jobs, and many attend on a part-time basis. The average age is 28, and there are many older students who have come to feel that education is a lifelong learning experience. In this regard, Florida International administers the External Degree Program for the State University System, which gives students the unique opportunity to earn a degree without

regular on campus attendance.

Florida International's faculty and staff are making many and varied contributions to community service. There has been a special emphasis given to applied research projects, those programs that identify public needs and act on them. The Division of Continuing Education, FAU-FIU Joint Center for Environmental and Urban Problems, the Institute of Women, and the Institute of Labor Research and Studies, conduct many non-credit programs, workshops, and conferences that benefit the public at large.

In addition, these University agencies sponsor research and other kinds of academic and faculty activities. The F.I.U. Foundation, Inc. also sponsors academic research, both on a local and international level.

With the Greater Miami area serving as the crossroads to the Caribbean and Latin America, Florida International has placed a great emphasis on hemispheric programs. From the beginning, the University's faculty and staff have been making effective and steady contributions in the field of international affairs. Florida International's students, from all parts of the U.S. and 76 foreign countries, are an amalgam of different cultures that exist at the University.

Florida International University has three main goals: to provide action-oriented education for students so they can live more personally satisfying lives; to serve the Greater Miami and South Florida area in meeting the ecological, cultural, social, and urban challenges it faces; and to achieve a greater mutual understanding among the Americas and throughout the world.
