FIU In Review

Florida International University opened its Tamiami Campus in the fall of 1972 with 5,667 students-the largest first-year enrollment of any college or university in the history of the United States, Enrollment is expected to grow to 30,000 by the early 1980's when the North Miami Campus is in full operation.

An accredited member of the State University System, FIU serves juniors, seniors and graduate students. Admission is open without regard to race, creed, color, sex, age or national origin.

Academically, FIU offers the benefits of higher education's proven features blended with the innovations of progressive ideals. The University has developed individualized study programs including off-campus, real-life career experiences.

Academic divisions include the College of Arts and Sciences, School of Business and Organizational Sciences, School of Education, School of Health and Social Services, School of Hotel, Food and Travel Services and the School of Technology.

The University has three main goals: to provide action-oriented education for students so they can live more personally satisfying and socially applicable lives; to serve the Greater Miami and South Florida region in meeting the ecological, cultural, social and urban challenges it faces; and to become a major international center with an emphasis on helping to achieve a greater mutual understanding among the Americas and throughout the world.

champion. She coached Florida State to the 1970 state softball crown, then was chosen to the Amateur Softball Association (ASA) All-American Team as a player in 1972. Since coaching softball at Florida International, she has led her teams to a combined record of 45-28 in three seasons and a third place finish in the 1974 state tournament.

An outstanding intercollegiate athlete at Memphis State University, she later earned her master's degree from North Carolina-Greensboro and her doctorate at Florida State.

After coaching both the Sunblazers softball and volleyball teams for several years and winning two consecutive state volleyball championships, Coach Blucker has decided to devote her full time to softball in the hope of realizing her immediate aoal – winning the state softball title in 1978.

As head coach of this year's women's basketball team at Florida International University, Russo took the Sunblazers through a tough regular season schedule and into the AIAW Regional Tournament in her first season.

"I'm really looking forward to this challenge," said Russo, "and especially looking forward to working under Coach Blucker this season."

in 1975, she was named as an assistant coach at her alma mater, Old Dominion, where she played a major role in helping the Lady Monarchs capture the #9 basketball ranking in 1977.

Last summer, while playing softball in her home state of Virginia, she helped her team to a second place finish in the ASA District Regionals.

Outlook

When the Sunblazers open their 1978 softball schedule against the University of Miami on March 9. Coach Judy Blucker will field a team with little previous intercollegiate experience.

Only four players return from last year's 24-14 squad, yet Coach Blucker is confident of a shot at the FAIAW State crown in April.

Seniors Shirley Coleman (.430 average with 8 HR's in 1977) and Wendy Martin (4 HR's in '77), along with newcomer Gail Fitzgerald, an Amateur Softball Association (ASA) All-American, will be heavily counted upon to help propel the Sunblazers into post-season play.

This year's schedule is seen as the toughest in the team's four year history. Besides a difficult regu-

lar season slate, the team will participate in the Dade-North, Florida State, Dade-South and University of Florida Invitationals.

Highlights of 1976-1977 Softball Season

In the past, the Florida International softball program has rested on a firm foundation of local talent developed in the strong Miami-area leagues. The first squad in 1975 finished third in State competition with a 14-5 won-lost record. In 1976, the Sunblazers lost seven games by one run but still completed the season with a 12-11 mark. Last year, the team went on to a 24-14 record, finishing fourth in State competition and placing second in both the Dade-North and Dade-South Invitationals.
