Ms. Colleen Ericson, Instructor in the Division of Special Education and Pupil Services in the School of Education, has been a member of the faculty since September 1, 1971.

She was formerly a Graduate Teaching Assistant in the Department of Psychology and candidate for the Ph.D. degree at the Ohio State University.
