STEPHEN M. FAIN

Biographical Sketch

Dr. Stephen M. Fain, Assistant Professor in the Division of Childhood Education in the School of Education, has been a member of the faculty since September 1, 1971.

He was formerly Assistant Professor in the Department of Education at Brooklyn College, City University of New York.

Dr. Fain was born in Brooklyn, New York, and received his higher education at Rutgers University and Newark State College, where he received the bachelor of science degree in 1964 and master of arts degree in 1966. He received his doctorate in education from the Teachers College of Columbia University in 1970.

In 1964-66, he taught in the secondary school system of Caldwell, New Jersey. From September, 1966, to June, 1967, he served as Administrative Assistant to the Superintendent of Schools in Pearl River, New York. In September, 1967, he joined the Newark State College Demonstration School as the Director of Physical Education for a five-month term, and returned to the University in September, 1970, as an Adjunct Professor in the School of Education.

During 1968-69, he served as an Adjunct Professor of Education at Fairleigh Dickinson University, and as Director of the Reading Program, Upward Bound, in July and August, 1970. In September, 1970, he was appointed Adjunct Professor of Curriculum Development at Notre Dame College of Staten Island, and held that position until joining Florida International's faculty.

He is a member of Phi Delta Kappa and Associate for Supervision and Curriculum Development.
