Dr. A. Dean Hauenstein has been named Associate Professor in the Division of Vocational, Technical and Adult Education, School of Education, at Florida International University, the new state university in Miami.

He was formerly Adjunct Associate Professor in the Academic Faculty of Industrial Technology and Assistant Director of the Curriculum Research and Development for the Industrial Arts Curriculum Project (IACP) at Ohio State University.

During 1957-58, Dr. Hauenstein taught industrial arts in the Union County School System, from 1958-61 in the public schools of Dayton, Ohio, and from 1961-64 at Miami University at Oxford, Ohio. From 1964-67, he taught industrial arts and technology on the graduate and undergraduate level at Ohio State University.

Dr. Hauenstein was born in Lima, Ohio, and received his bachelor of science degree in 1952 and master of education degree in 1957 from Miami University at Oxford. He received his doctorate in 1966 from Ohio State University.

He is the author of Industrial Arts for the Elementary School K-2, 3-4, 5-6 and was a contributing author and editor of Editions I, II, and III of The World of Construction and The World of Manufacturing, published in 1968-70 and sponsored by the IACP as curriculum material and instructional systems for two one-year courses at the junior high school level. Curriculum Planning for Behavioral Development is in press and Education for the Twenty-First Century is under contract.

His professional affiliations include Phi Delta Kappa, Epsilon Pi Tau and the Ohio Industrial Arts Association, among others.

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
