Miss Nancy-Lee Goodwin has been named an Assistant Director for Planning and Analysis at Florida International University. A native of Illinois, Miss Goodwin taught in the College of Education at the University of Illinois at Chicago Circle and at the University of Illinois Medical Center. In addition to her teaching responsibilities, she also established the Office of Administrative Studies at Chicago Circle and served in various other research and administrative positions at both the University of Illinois at Chicago Circle and at Urbana.

For the past two years she has been a research design consultant with the Mid-America Computer Corporation in Illinois and has developed an experimental pre-student teaching laboratory experience for college students interested in working with the problems of the ghetto school. A movie of the program titled "An Experiment in Involvement" was produced.

In 1969, she received the Chicago Teacher's Association Merit Award and was named the Teacher of the Year in 1961 while at Roosevelt Junior High School in Peoria. She is active in The Association for Institutional Research and a member of the National Education Association, the American Association of Higher Education, the American Educational Research Association, the National Council of Measurement and Evaluation and Kappa Delta Pi.

Miss Goodwin received a B.A. degree in Mathematics from MacMurray College, a M.A. degree in Counseling Psychology and a Ph.D. in Research Design from the University of Illinois at Urbana. She was recently selected to appear in Personalities of the West and Midwest, a biographical publication.

In her new position at Florida International, she will assist in the development of long range planning and budgeting with particular emphasis on the student-faculty studies. Miami's new state university will open classes for students in September 1972.
