The appointment of Jules O. Pagano as the Director of the Labor Research and Studies Institute at Florida

International University was approved today by the Board of Regents, meeting in Pensacola. Pagano is presently the Executive Director of the Adult Education Association of the United States of America. His appointment is effective July 1.

The Institute, which will be an operating arm of the Division of University Services and Continuing Education at Florida International, will serve as an educational resource for labor and provide institutional support for advances in scholarship, research and education in this field.

It is the first labor studies institute to be established in the State University System of Florida.

Pagano has been prominently involved in higher education and the labor movement for the past 20 years.

"He is one of the most imaginative, knowledgeable and articulate men in the field of adult and international education in the nation today," said President Charles E. Perry of Florida International.

Pagano, 43, served for 10 years as the Education Director and Assistant to the Vice President of the Communications Workers of America. In 1961, he became the Director of Professional and Technical Affairs with the then newly-established Peace Corps, and also served as the Director of University Relations and Training.

In 1966, he became the Director of Adult Education in the United States Office of Education. He later served as the Vice President of Greenleigh Associates, an educational consulting firm in Washington, before becoming the Executive Director of the Adult Education Association in 1970.

Widely-traveled, Pagano is also a lecturer in the School of Business Administration at American University, a member of the College Entrance Examination Board, the American Arbitration Association's Labor Panel, and serves as an Advisory Board member of the American Academcy of Venice, Italy.

He is a member of the Academy of Political Science, American Society for Public Administration, Industrial Relations Research Association, American Federation of Teachers and National Education Association.

Pagano, who authored a book about education in the Peace

Corps, is also the author of numerous articles and studies on

adult education and labor topics. He obtained a B.A. from St.

Johns College and M.A. from the University of London. In 1967

he worked in an advanced studies program at the Brookings Institute.

He and his wife, Helen, have four children, 2 boys and 2 girls.
