Biographical Sketch

Dr. Abraham Stein, Chairman of the Department of Biology in the College of Arts and Sciences, has been a member of the faculty since September 1, 1971.

He was formerly Associate Professor in the Department of Biochemistry of the College of Medicine at the University of Florida, where he was a member of the faculty since 1967.

Dr. Stein was born in Chicago, Illinois, attended Illinois Institute of Technology, and received his higher education from the University of California and University of Southern California (UCLA), where he received his bachelor of arts degree in 1949, master of arts degree in 1952 and doctorate in 1957. While at the University of Southern California, he won the Harry J. Deuel Jr. Award in biochemistry and nutrition.

During 1957-59, he was a NIH Postdoctoral Research Fellow in the Graduate Department of Biochemistry at Brandeis University. In 1959, he joined the University of Pennsylvania as a Research Associate in the Department of Chemistry, was promoted to a lecturer in 1962 and Senior Research Investigator in 1965. During 1960-63, he served as a guest lecturer in Medical Biochemistry at the Philadelphia College of Osteopathy.

A member of the American Society of Biological Chemists, American Chemical Society and American Association for the Advancement of Science, Dr. Stein is the author of numerous publications in mammalian brain metabolism and the effects of heavy metal poisoning.
