#### A PROGRESS REPORT ON RECREATION COMPLEX

The first phase of Florida International University's athletic and recreation complex is in its final days of of construction. Due to be completed in the next two weeks are a baseball stadium, soccer field, six tennis courts, four handball courts, and renovation of several buildings for locer rooms, training room, equipment room, and activities. Total cost of the initial phase is more than \$600,000.

The tennis team will be able to utilize the tennis facilities for the majority of its spring schedule; however, the baseball and soccer teams will have to curtail their games and practice sessions on their new facilities until the grass has had sufficient time to knit.

The Marks Brothers Construction Company, holders of the contract for the majority of work in Phase I, has been working diligently over the past several months preparing a baseball field and soccer field which should rank with the finest in the country.

Florida International opted against a synthetic covering in favor of beautiful Bermuda grass, which it felt would be more appropriate for a facility in the Miami area. The dugouts are first class in every way, containing water coolers, telephones and bathrooms. The soccer field is large enough that two games can be played crossways while the championship field runs north-south.

Shortly, the Athletic Council will begin considering Phase II of the recreation and athletic facility. In the offing are multi-purpose fields, field house or teaching gymnasium, swimming pool, outdoor track, additional tennis courts and handball courts, and lighting of the present facilities.

## UNIVERSITY TEAMS TO COMPETE IN COLOMBIA

Florida International University will send teams to compete in four sports in Bogota, Colombia, on February 2-9, in support of its goal of achieving greater international understanding.

Teams in wrestling, soccer, tennis and basketball have been invited by CUDOC, the Colombian University Sports Federation, for competition against local university teams in Bogota, Cali and Medellin. The wrestling competition will include a three-day tourney in Cali.

The trip will also open the door for further exchange programs involving coaches and teachers, and the development of training programs for Colombian physical education instructors. It is expected that Colombian teams will visit the Miami and South Florida area in 1975 for competition at the university level.

Expenses for the trip are being assumed in Colombia by CUDOC and transportation to Colombia by private donations. The trip was arranged by Mr. Simon Daro, a friend of Florida International University, who has worked or lived in Colombia for the past 45 years, and Dr. Paul Hartman, Chairman of the Division of Health and Physical Education, Recreation and Athletics.

## 1974 SUNBLAZER BASEBALL OUTLOOK

The 1974 outlook for Florida International University's baseball program is one of guarded optimism, according to Head Coach Tom Wonderling, who had a 34-22 record in 1973.

"We had a respectable season last year," Wonderling said, "and we are going to work towards improving on the 1973 results. Our biggest weakness was our overall pitching depth. We think have shored this up by recruiting six top-notch junior college hurlers. Also recruited were five other junior college prospects who will add strength and depth to our infield and outfield." Only three pitchers from last year's squad will return, he added.

"Another area where we should be improved is in our overall team speed. We have, overall, above average speed and should be able to do some things offensively that we weren't able to do a year ago. We have a tough schedule and a long season ahead of us, but the squad has put in a lot of hard work and we think we are ready for a real fine on our new baseball facility," Wonderling concluded.

Twelve lettermen return from last year's team: Sunblazer leading hitter, Danny Price; the squad's second best batsman and leading base stealer, Derek Crass; and Marty Jacobs, who led the team in seven categories, besides being the third leading hitter. The other nine are infielders Jim Knox, Mike Sanz, and Larry Hoskin; catchers Doug Cornett, Jerry Walsh and Carlos Perez; and pitchers Bill Fireline, Ralph Alvarez and Phil Hollar.

The ll transfers are pitchers Terry Willis, Sam Lombardo, Gary Kelson, Jim Pacheco and Mike Snapp; infielders Nelson Rodriguez, Juan Diaz and Jesse Campbell.

The second-year Sunblazers will play a demanding 55-game schedule. including a grueling five-day road trip, playing Georgia Southern, Jacksonville University and Florida State. Other schools on the home schedule include the University of Massachusetts, University of Buffalo, Southern Illinois at Carbondale, University of Miami, University of Indiana, and Indiana State University.

## 1974 SUNBLAZER SOCCER OUTLOOK

Head Coach Greg Myers feels optimistic about his team's next season though he lost eight players who were graduating seniors. "But we have some really good boys coming back from last year's squad and a few others coming in as transfers," he said.

Among those returning are Steve Lee and Hossein Nikkar, who were elected to the 1973 All-South Soccer Team by the National Coaches Association.

Posting a record of 9-3-1 in its second year, the soccer squad lost only to three nationally-ranked opponents: Howard University, University of Baltimore and West Virginia University. The latter game, a 1-0 loss with only 26 seconds to go in overtime, was termed by Myers "our best game but also our most frustrating, because we were leading in cornerkicks and would have gone into the finals if we had held."

The coach noted that "we have altered our style of play as a result of meeting these big teams," and that should help when the Sunblazers face national champion St. Louis and Howard University this year.

Recruiting efforts are underway and are expected to be completed about May, Coach Myers said, and the team should be ready to start play in September.

#### 1974 SUNBLAZER TENNIS OUTLOOK

The Florida International University Sunblazer tennis squad is tuning up its racquets for the 1974 season as they participate all this week in the City of Miami Invitational at Henderson Park, where Head Coach Bill Fleming expected to meet competitors from the local, state, national and international levels.

The netmen will then have a series of matches during a tour of three Colombian cities from February 2-9, as Florida International and the South American nation begin what will be a yearly exchange program.

The team will open the new season officially against Florida Southern University at Lakeland on February 13, hoping to improve the 19-20 record achieved in its maiden season last year.

"We should finish much better this year," noted Fleming, "because we have more strength which consequently gives us more depth, and our home matches will be here on campus, giving us another advantage," he concluded.

The first home match will be on March 5 against Belmont College, on six brand-new asphalt courts which are expected to be the first operational part of Florida International's multi-million dollar recreation complex.

## 1973-74 SUNBLAZER WRESTLING OUTLOOK

Reflecting to last year's record of 0-11, there has been a reversal of the team's attitude and will to win, according to Head Coach Sid Huitema. "Although the transfer students have yet to meet the challenge of the Florida schools," the coach believes, "the wrestling team has better balance."

The team's attitude is evidenced by its current 4-5 record, and by place winners in the Georgia Tech Tournament, the Sunshine Open and in the Killian Tournament.

The team is very young experience-wise, according to Huitema, with the bulk of its members being juniors. "They will have to put in a great deal of hard work to gain their wrestling goals," he notes.

The coach believes that "we have had some disappointments that have weakened our team by wrestlers leaving school ineligible and discharged for disciplinary reasons. At this point I feel that is has made us a closer-knit group but they have very definitely weakened us."

Looking to the future, several contacts have been made with some top-notch wrestlers. If these young men can be recruited, along with three or four of the current members, Huitema says, "we will be in the thick of things next year." The coach feels the team's trip to Colombia on the first week of February will be helpful in the quest for obtaining more blue-chip wrestlers.
