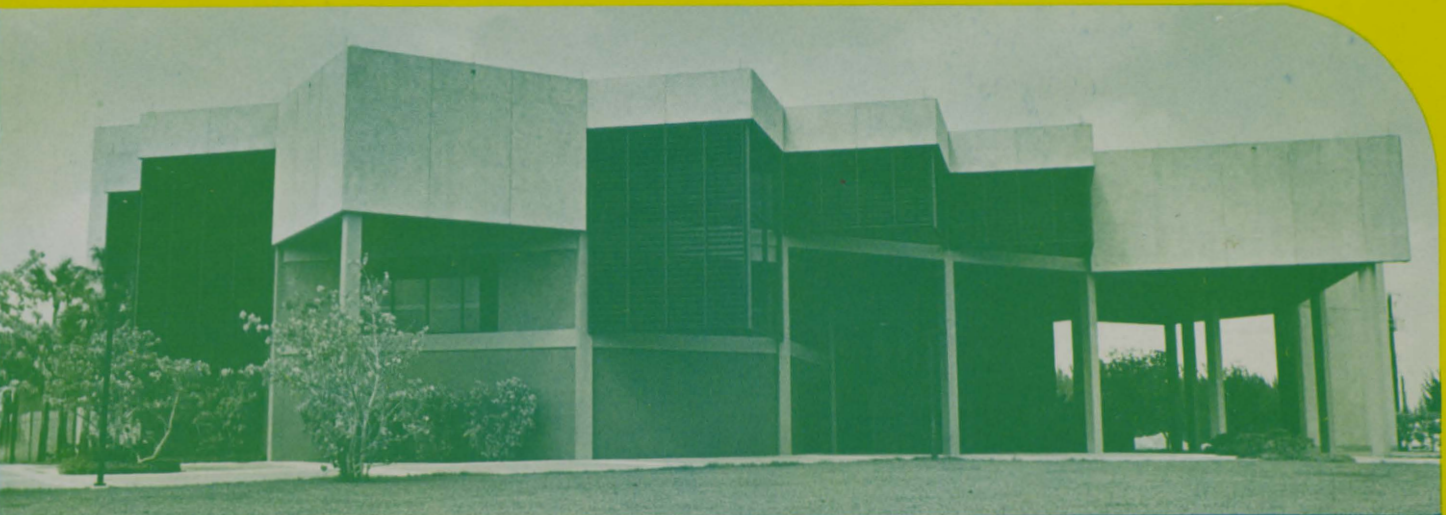

University Admission Requirements

Undergraduate Admission Requirements:

Students apply for admission and are admitted to Florida International University. Although campus preference must be noted on the application form, an admitted student may attend either or both campuses. Graduates of a Florida community college with an Associate of Arts degree are admissible to Florida International University. Students with an Associate of Science degree from a Florida public community college and students transferring from an accredited college or university, must have completed at least 40 of the 54 hours of general education requirements necessary prior to graduation, have maintained a 2.0 grade average, and, in the case of transfer students, present 90 quarter hours (60 semester hours) of collegiate work. Some programs have specific course prerequisites for admission which are explained in The Catalog under the description of the program.

Graduate Admission Requirements:

A student seeking admission into a graduate program of the University must meet the minimum standards set forth by the Florida Board of Regents as follows:

- A bachelor's degree or equivalent from a regionally accredited university or college.
- A "B" or better average in all work attempted while registered as an upper division student for the bachelor's degree, or a total score (quantitative plus verbal) of 1,000 or higher on the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) or an equivalent score on some other measure specified by the program to which admission is being sought.

Specific graduate programs may have admission requirements that go beyond the minimum standards established by the Board of Regents. Prospective students should refer to The Catalog for a description of the admission requirements for programs of interest.

Foreign Student:

A foreign student must meet the regular admission requirements of the University.

Fees

Florida International University charges fees according to the Uniform Fee Structure of the State University System. Fees are subject to change. The current cost per credit hour is:

Student Services

The Division of Student Services provides counseling, referral, information and other assistance to students in the following areas: career planning and placement, student activities and organizations, personal counseling, health, financial aid, veterans affairs and other areas as needed. Financial aid and veterans affairs are of special concern to students at the time of admission.

Financial Aid

Financial aid programs are available. Assistance is provided through federal government loans, the work study program, short term loan fund, scholarships and grants. Nonresident tuition waivers are handled through the Foreign Student Services office for F-1 Visa holders and through the Intercollegiate Athletic Department for male and female athletes.

Veterans Affairs

Forms, financial aid, information and other pre-admission and counseling services relevant to a veteran are provided by Student Services. Veterans must complete the forms required by the Veterans Administration before benefits are

Introduction

Florida International University opened to students in 1972. It is presently the fourth largest university in the State University System of Florida. In June of 1977, the University will open a second major campus at North Miami.

The Tamiami Campus and the new North Miami Campus are both designed to accommodate students who wish to pursue a graduate degree or upper division study following graduation from a community college or transfer from a four-year institution of higher education. The academic programs offered will thus serve juniors, seniors, and graduate students. In addition to regular degree programs, non-credit courses and other activities will be made available to members of the community.

The North Miami Campus of Florida International University is expected to develop rapidly and to offer a full complement of academic programs and other activities within a few years. However, limited funding and facilities will restrict the scope of operations in the early stages of development. To best serve the North Dade-South Broward population during the development period, academic program offerings and scheduling will be responsive to the expressed needs and interests of the community.

History

Florida International University opened in the fall of 1972 on property located just off the Tamiami Trail in South Dade County. The campus was intended to serve students who would commute from residences in the surrounding metropolitan area.

At the time the University was approved and planning funds were appropriated, strong support also existed for locating the campus in North Dade County on what was then known as the Interama site. Community leaders felt that the large population in their area justified a readily available University facility as well. In recognition of the need for access to the University by students beyond commuting

distance to the Tamiami Campus, original plans stated that the University was prepared to establish "additional campus sites . . . to enable the University to fulfill its mission more effectively."

People who favored the North Dade site continued to support the University in efforts to locate a second campus in the northern part of the county. When planning funds were made available, development of the second campus of Florida International University began.

Goals

Florida International University has three main goals. They are Education of Students, Service to the Community, and Greater International Understanding. These objectives will apply to the development of the campus at North Miami as well as the conduct of ongoing programs on the Tamiami Campus.

Calendar

Florida International University operates on the quarter system. Each quarter consists of ten to twelve weeks of classes. The quarters normally begin in late September, early January, late March, and late June. Registration for each quarter is conducted during the preceding quarter. Both campuses of the University will follow the same calendar.

Location

The North Miami Campus of Florida International University is located in northern Dade County about halfway between Miami and Ft. Lauderdale. The campus borders the northern tip of Biscayne Bay. The campus may be reached by turning east off Biscayne Boulevard on either 135th or 151st Street. Interstate 95, the Sunshine State Parkway and the Palmetto Expressway are major thoroughfares which provide access to the campus. Bus service between the community and the campus is being planned.

Because of the lead time required to admit a foreign student, it is recommended that an application for admission be initiated six months prior to the date a student first desires to register for classes.

Special Student:

The Special Student classification is designed primarily for the person who is not interested, at the time of registration, in working toward a degree at Florida International University. A special student need not meet the University's admission requirements. Prerequisites for specific courses must be satisfied, however. Registration for courses is contingent on space being available in the desired classes. A foreign student may not register as a special student.

University Admission Procedures

To apply for admission to Florida International University, an undergraduate or graduate student must complete an application for admission and pay a non-refundable \$15.00 fee. The student must request that an official transcript be sent to the Office of Admissions by each college or university previously attended.

The admissibility of undergraduate students is the responsibility of the Office of Admissions, consistent with admission requirements stated above.

The Schools offering graduate programs are responsible for determining the admissibility of graduate students.

Prospective students should refer to The Catalog and other appropriate University publications for a thorough explanation of University regulations, policies and procedures.

Registration

Students who express an interest in pursuing a degree at the North Miami Campus of Florida International University and are accepted into one of the programs offered on that campus, will be advised by mail of the dates and location for completing registration. Courses to be offered will be printed in the University's "Schedule of Classes". A special designation will clearly indicate which courses are available on the North Miami Campus to provide students with a convenient guide to course selection.

Facilities

When the campus officially opens in June 1977, the North Miami Campus of Florida International University will be housed in an attractive three-story building purchased from the Inter-American Center Authority. The structure was finished to University specifications. It will accommodate classrooms, faculty offices, campus administrative offices, the library, media services, student services, bookstore and computer center.

By 1979, two additional buildings, a classroom/office facility and a student center, are scheduled to be completed. The campus building plan calls for several other academic buildings, a library, auditorium and a conference center to be constructed as resources are made available.

Future Development

Within ten years, the period of rapid construction and program development required to establish the new campus should be nearing completion. The campus is projected to have grown to an enrollment approaching 15,000 students. A full range of academic programs, student services, community oriented activities and support services will have been developed. The University's objectives of education, service and international understanding will be met by two complete campuses serving the metropolitan Miami area.

Academic Programs

During the first year of operation, undergraduate and graduate courses for elected majors in the Schools of Business and Organizational Sciences, Education, Health and Social Services and the College of Arts and Sciences will be offered.
