Virginia Key Beach Park was opened on August 1, 1945 and was known as the "Colored Beach" during the era of racial segregation in the South. The Park was a cherished getaway for social gatherings and a sacred site for religious services. This "Colored Only" beach epitomized the spirit of optimism, prosperity and progress within the Black community.


Closed in 1982 due to high maintenance and operation costs, the park fell into disrepair. In 1999, a group of citizens formed the Virginia Key Beach Park Task Force to resurrect and restore this National Historic site. Revitalization plans are currently underway to return this magnificent beachfront property to public use and preserve its rich legacy of social and civil rights.
