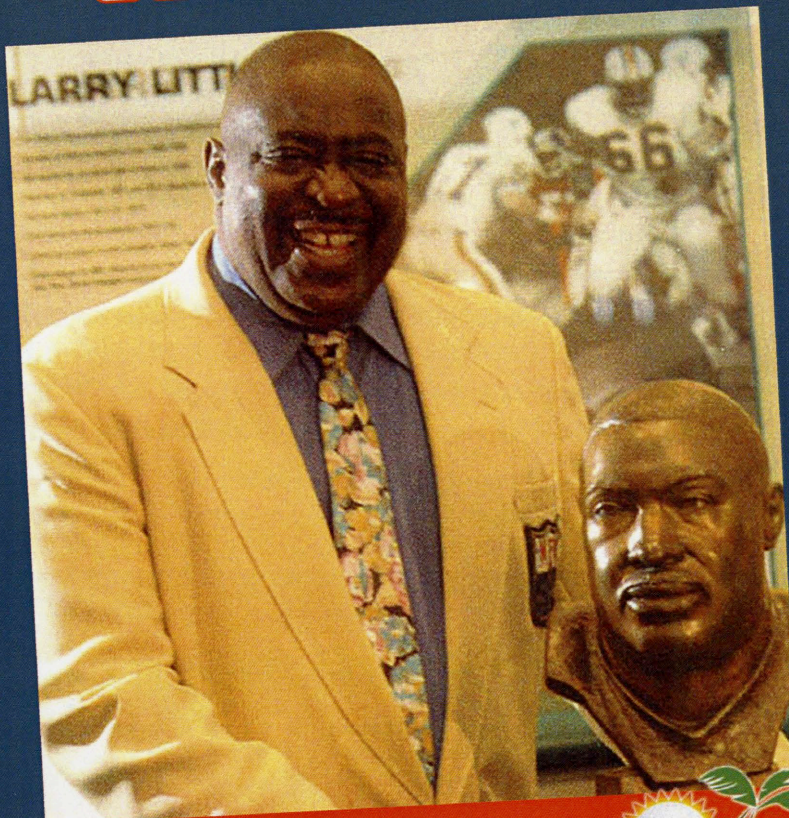

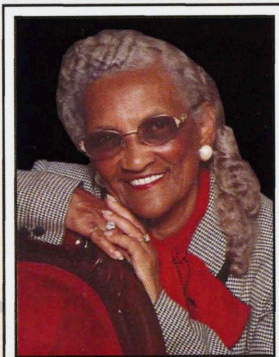

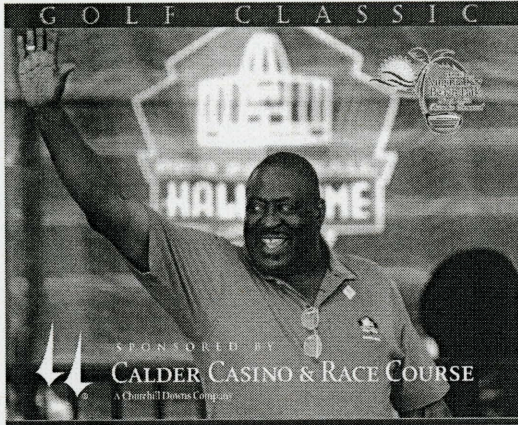

HISTORIC VIRGINIA KEY BEACH PARK



Larry Little, unlike many highly touted Miami Dolphins stars of the 1970s, began his career in 1967 as an unheralded free agent with the San Diego Chargers. Larry, who had been a two-way tackle, team captain, and an All-Conference choice at Bethune-Cookman College, enjoyed only moderate success during his two years in San Diego.

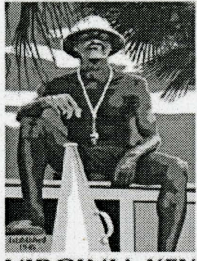
Just before the 1969 campaign, however, he was traded to the Dolphins and it wasn't long before the 6-1, 265-pound guard was being praised as one of the National Football League's premier offensive linemen. A fixture at right guard during the 1970s when the Dolphins were a dominant team in pro football Little was the embodiment of the intimidating force of the famed Miami rushing attack. A superb pass blocker, awesome on the scrimmage line and especially effective as the lead man on the powerful Dolphin sweeps, Little was named first-team All-NFL from 1971 through 1975 and again in 1977. He was also named second-team All-NFL in 1978, and All-AFC five times. Larry was selected to play in five Pro Bowls (1970, 1972, 1973, 1974, and 1975). He was named the NFL Players Association's AFC Lineman of the Year in 1970, 1971 and 1972.

When Miami rushed for a then-record 2,960 yards in its perfect 1972 season, Little was tabbed by one prestigious selection panel as the NFL's outstanding blocker. Little displayed versatility, durability and dedication throughout his career.

Coach Don Shula called him "a real inspiration, not just for the way he performs but also for his influence on our younger players." In one emergency situation, brought about by injuries, Little shifted to the unfamiliar right tackle spot with little effect on his quality of play. Even though he was plagued by knee, ankle, and leg injuries through much of his career, he sat out only four games because of injuries in his first 11 seasons with the Dolphins.

Off the field, Larry is the gentle giant who has not forgotten his childhood community of Miami, Florida. His deep concern for the youth and providing leadership to the underserved community of South Florida created the Larry Little Academy partnering with the City of Miami which is just one of the many ways Larry is involved in mentoring. Another concern has been Historic Virginia Key Beach Park, which has been struggling to maintain a national historic site and hence brought forward the Larry Little Legends Golf Classic now in its fourth year. "Our tournament supports the ongoing restoration of an important landmark in my life," said Larry Little, the former Miami Dolphin offensive lineman who was inducted into the NFL Hall of Fame in 1993. "Virginia Key Beach was the Colored Only beach when I was a child and the only place my family could go to enjoy the sun and sand," said Little.

HISTORIC VIRGINIA KEY BEACH PARK MIAMI, FLORIDA

Historic Virginia Key Beach Park (HVKBP) is not only one of Miami's most beautiful and scenic locations, but also a natural and environmental treasure, and a historic landmark with an inspiring story to tell as a symbol of the courageous struggle for social justice and equality.

In 1945, during the era of Jim Crow segregation in the American South, the Park was established as a result of a bold wade-in protest by Miami's African American citizens (fully a decade before such tactics became standard during the Civil Rights era) to demand, among the miles of bathing beaches in Dade County, a legal place for the Colored population to enjoy, who had played such a vital role in the founding and building of Miami. As a result, a portion of Virginia Key island, which had been used unofficially for years as a Black recreational spot, was officially opened as a Dade County Park, "for the exclusive use of Negroes."

Unlike so many other "Colored parks" throughout the South, however, partly due to constant demands, and partly due to the mutual respect between Miami's thriving Black community and White power structure, Virginia Key Beach was very nearly "separate but equal," to others, with such rare amenities as a Carousel and Mini-train amusement rides, beach house, concession stand, cabanas, rental "cottages," boat ramp, and parking for hundreds of cars (once Rickenbacker causeway was completed).

The Park instantly became extremely popular, even though it was only accessible by boat at first, and soon became the hub of Black life in South Florida, bringing together all neighborhoods and social classes, for family and organization gatherings, baptisms, and even Lovers' Lane trysts. It would remain popular even after desegregation (due to another courageous wade-in in 1959), when it was opened to all groups to enjoy its beauty. By many glowing accounts, it was a beautiful "Paradise," even in spite of the odious restrictions, and is therefore still very fondly remembered.

Closed in 1982, shortly after the Park was transferred from county to City, it remained neglected until it was rescued by a broad community effort, led by the late Mrs. M. Athalie Range. Restored to much of its natural and historic splendor, including the vintage amusement rides, the Park reopened in grand style to a rousing reception in 2008.

HVKBP is now one of Miami's most popular parks, available for special events and parties, as well as general recreational use. Ambitious plans are currently under way to enhance the landmark greatly, with indoor/outdoor museum structures and bike and walking trails to tell its fascinating story, while keeping it as a natural preserve, and a treasured legacy for future generations.

TED HENDRICKS

1969-1973 Baltimore Colts
1974 Green Bay Packers
1975-1981 Oakland Raiders
1982-1983 Los Angeles Raiders
Enshrined in 1990

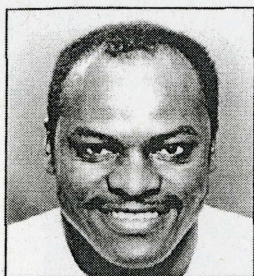
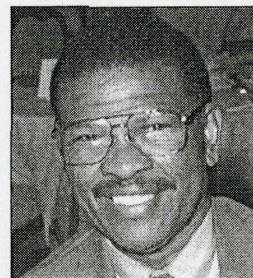
A three-time All-American from the University of Miami, FL, Ted was drafted in the second round by the Baltimore Colts in 1969, and had a fifteen season pro career. Traded to the Green Bay Packers in 1974 after five seasons with the Colts, he signed with the Oakland Raiders in 1975. At 6' 7, 220 lbs., he was considered tall and skinny by NFL standards. During his career, Ted intercepted 26 passes, recovered 16 fumbles and scored a record-tying 4 safeties. He played 215 straight games, including four Super Bowls and was named All-AFC seven times and All-NFC once. He played in eight Pro Bowls and four Super Bowls. Ted was born on November 1, 1947, in Guatemala City, Guatemala.



KEN HOUSTON

1967-1972 Houston Oilers
1973-1980 Washington Redskins
Enshrined in 1986

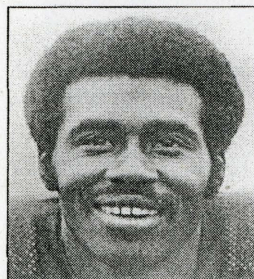
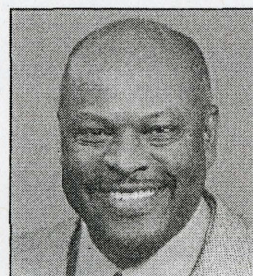
A ninth-round pick in the 1967 draft, Ken was traded to the Redskins for five players in 1973. Acclaimed as NFL's premier strong safety of the 1970s, he had excellent speed and was known as a punishing tackler. Ken had a record nine touchdowns, and intercepted 49 passes for 898 yards. He also scored on blocked field goals, fumbles and punt returns. Ken was named to two AFL All-Star games, 10 Pro Bowls and was All-Pro or All-AFC/NFC eight of nine years from 1971 to 1979. Ken was born on November 12, 1944, in Lufkin, Texas.



DWIGHT STEPHENSON

1980-1987 Miami Dolphins
Enshrined in 1998

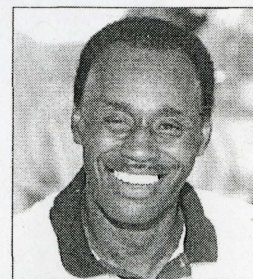
Dwight Stephenson, a second-round pick and the 48th player selected in the 1980 NFL Draft, excelled at center for the Miami Dolphins for eight seasons from 1980 to 1987. In just a few years, he was universally recognized as the premier center in the NFL. He earned both All-Pro and All-AFC recognition five straight years from 1983 to 1987. He was named the AFC or NFL Offensive Lineman of the Year in various major polls four years. Stephenson was selected for five straight Pro Bowl games, the first four as a starter. Stephenson was the starting center in the 1982, 1984 and 1985 AFC championship games and in Super Bowls XVII and XIX. He was born on November 20, 1957 in Murfreesboro, North Carolina.



CHARLEY TAYLOR

1964-1975, 1977 Washington Redskins
Enshrined in 1984

Charley Taylor's pass receiving credentials accumulated in his 13 seasons with the Washington Redskins are legendary. His 649 receptions for 9,110 yards and 79 touchdowns rank him among the game's elite. His other career highlights include: 10,803 combined net yards, 90 touchdowns and 540 points. He was the number one draft pick in 1964 and was also the 1964 Rookie of the Year. After shifting to split end in 1966, Charley was the NFL receiving champion in 1966 and 1967, and had 50 or more catches in seven seasons. He was also All-NFL/NFC once, second-team All-NFL five times, and played in eight Pro Bowls. Charley was born on September 28, 1941, in Grand Prairie, Texas.



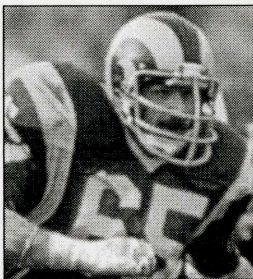
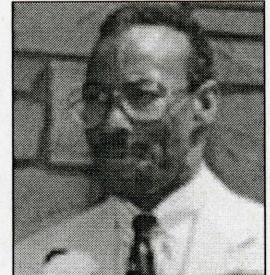

Career record: 1,077 yards on 56 interceptions, 1,312 yards on punt returns, 1,274 yards on kickoff returns. Scored 11 career touchdowns. . . In seven Pro Bowls, All-NFL/NFC four times.

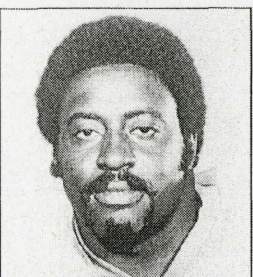
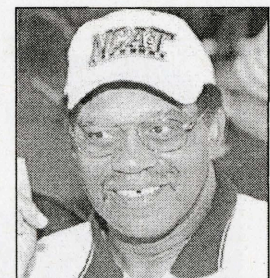
Thomas Lee Mack. . . Rams' first round draft pick, second player overall in 1966 NFL draft. . . One of only two rookies on veteran-laden team. . . Earned starting role as rookie and held left guard position for next 13 seasons. . . Extremely durable, never missed a game during 184-game career. . . Named to 11 Pro Bowls. . . All-NFL five times. . . All-Western Conference once, All-NFC eight times.



ELVIN BETHEA

1968-1983 Houston Oilers
 Enshrined in 2003

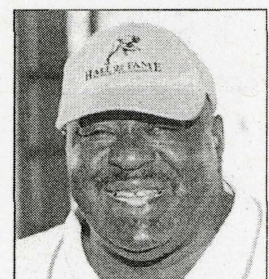
Elvin was a third-round draft pick in the 1968 AFL/NFL Draft. An eight-time Pro Bowl selection, he played a remarkable 210 game long career in Houston. Elvin was named first or second-team six times All-AFL/AFC and second-team All-Pro four times. Although sacks were not an official National Football League statistic until 1982, Elvin's unofficial 105-career quarterback sack-total still ranks as the best in Oilers/Tennessee Titans history as are the 16 sacks he recorded in 1973. When he retired, he held three team records: most seasons (16), most career regular season games (210), and most consecutive regular season games played (135). Elvin was born on March 1, 1946, in Trenton, New Jersey.



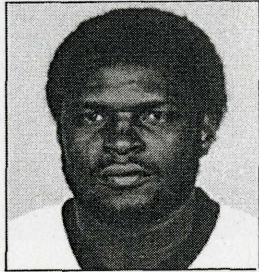
LARRY LITTLE

1967-1968 San Diego Chargers
 1969-1980 Miami Dolphins
 Enshrined in 1993

Larry was a free-agent when he signed with the Chargers in 1967. Upon his trade to Miami, he immediately became the starting right guard. Larry was the epitome of powerful in the Dolphins rushing game of the 1970's. He was fast and quick on pass protection, as well as awesome and intimidating as pulling guard on sweeps. Larry was All-Pro six years, a five-time Pro Bowl pick and three-time NFL Player Association's pick as AFC offensive lineman of the year. He started in three Super Bowls for the Dolphins. He was born November 2, 1945, in Groveland, Georgia.

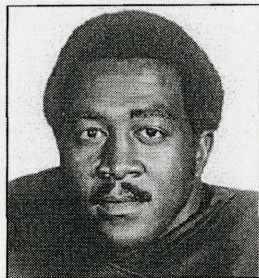
RICKEY JACKSON

1981-1993 New Orleans Saints

1994-95 San Francisco 49ers

Enshrined in 2010

Selected by the Saints 2nd round in 1981, Jackson made an immediate impact as rookie when he led the team with a franchise rookie record of eight sacks and was leading tackler. After 13 seasons with the Saints, Jackson finished his NFL career with two final seasons with the San Francisco 49ers who converted him to defensive end and turned him into a pass rush specialist. Jackson retired after the 1995 season with 128 career sacks which does not include his rookie total since the sack did not become an official statistic until 1982. He also intercepted eight passes during his 227-game NFL career and was named first-team All-Pro in 1986, 1987, 1992, and 1993. Jackson was born on March 20, 1958 in Pahokee, Florida.

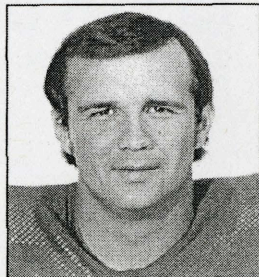
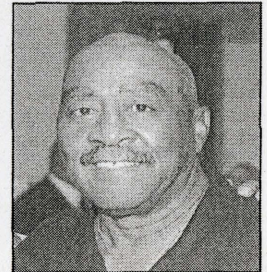


LEROY KELLY

1964-1973 Cleveland Browns

Enshrined in 1994

While with the Cleveland Browns from 1964 through 1973, Leroy established himself as one of the most feared ball-carriers in the history of the National Football League. Kelly was the eighth round pick of the Browns in the 1964 draft and was the understudy to Jim Brown, the most profound ground-gamer in history up to that time. When Brown retired, Kelly filled the void and for the next three years he rushed 1,000 yards each year, winning All-NFL honors. He was also selected as a starter for three consecutive Pro Bowls. During his career, Kelly has won four individual statistical championships, including rushing titles in 1967 and 1968. His career stats include, 7,274 rushing yards, 2,281 reception yards, 2,774 return yards, 12,330 combined yards and 90 touchdowns. Kelly was born on May 20, 1942, in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.



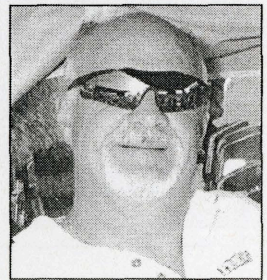
PAUL KRAUSE

1964-1967 Washington Redskins

1968-1979 Minnesota Vikings

Enshrined in 1998

A two-sport star, Paul excelled at both baseball and football. When injuries ended his baseball career, he went onto become the most successful pass-stealing safety in the history of the NFL. He was the Redskin's number two draft pick in 1964 and had an exceptional rookie year where he lead the league with 12 interceptions, naming him All-Pro. Throughout the first half of the 1970's, Paul dominated his position and was named All-NFC in 1970, 1971, 1972, 1973 and 1975. Paul retired as history's all-time interception leader with 81, just surpassing Hall of Famer Emlen Tunnell's all-time record of 79 steals. During his career, he played in eight Pro Bowls and was the starting safety in four Super Bowls. Paul was born on February 19, 1942, in Flint, Michigan.
