Opened in 1945, Virginia Key Beach Park was known as the "Colored Beach" during the era of racial segregation and was the only beach in Miami-Dade County legally available to African-Americans. Since 1999, a diverse group of citizens, now known as the Virginia Key Beach Trust, has worked diligently to preserve and restore this "urban jewel" that has been closed since 1982.
