On September 16, 2003 the Virginia Key Beach Park Trust will go before the Miami-Dade Safe Neighborhood Parks (SNP) Oversight Committee to request an extension on the Series 99 \$247,500 SNP appropriation and to change the scope of work on the Series 99 \$247,500 and the \$752,500 remaining balance of the appropriation total Series 99 \$1 million appropriation.

The scope of work change would add to the present scope (environmental restoration) to include the restoration of the existing structures located on Virginia Key Beach Park. The structures include the Concession Building, Large Bathhouse, Carousel Building, Large Pavilion, Mini-Train tunnel, Dance Pavilion, Small Bathhouse, Small Pavilion and the construction of two additional Small Pavilions.

The restoration project has gone through the City of Miami's Department of Capital Improvements (CIP Project #331416; Renovations & Repairs B-3282A) was awarded to a contractor, approved by the City Commission and is on schedule to begin September 30, 2003. The total amount of the two phase project is \$1,230,839.00. (See attachments).

The entire \$1 million SNP appropriation would be used for the restoration of existing structures and the construction of the two additional Small Pavilions. Construction time is anticipated at 180 calendar days putting the completion date at the end of March 2004. The remaining balance of the project, \$230,839.00, would be paid for by the Virginia Key Beach Park Trust.
