Dear Mr. Carson:-

Mr. Farris advises me that he wired you, requesting you not to publish the open letter to Senator Hudson, which you prepared for him some time ago.

His reason is that he and Senator Hudson are the only Candidates for Governor following the itinerary of the State Executive Committee; That at every meeting, so far, he has had the crowds with him; and that he does not look upon Hudson as "The man to be beaten", and that he will receive a great number of second choice votes to Hudson. Everything is pleasant between he and Hudson on their tour, and he feels that it is unnecessary for him to make a fight on him just at this time.
