Dear Captain:-


I wired you this morning giving you the gist of a letter received this morning from the Monroe commissioners, it seems that Senator Malone wrote Sheppard for the standing of our contract or agreement with Lee County, and the enclosed was his reply.

Since I wired, your letter from Naples came in and throws some light on the matter, and I will go to Key West although they suggested it would be better not to come and see what can be done or gleaned if nothing can be accomplished.

Erben came in after you left, by way of the dredge, and I went across with him, and got back yesterday by boat, so your letter about the petition will not reach him, and we have cut our crew still further and Mrs Ivey is now in Miami. There is no money to pay off with and Judge has not written since you were here, and Roberts crew will be through to the shovel in two weeks, and he wants to take a holiday, we moved him over within two miles of the county line last Friday. Hansen and another man stayed at Roberts Lake until Tuesday but no motorcade showed up and it is very doubtful if they will, but if they do they can follow our road to Roberts camp.
