Things have been moving slowly up here, and I have not yet closed with the Bristow people, but expect to do so right away.

I am sending by today's mail, a check to Mrs. Jaudon for \$2000.00 as requested.

I hope you succeed in preventing the Chevelier land from being thrown into Collier County, as we do not care to be under the control and dictation of Mr. Collier or of his new county. I fear that he would tax us for improvements and roads to be built through his land and leave us without roads and with heavy taxes.

Also wish you success in having Naples designated as the County seat of the new county. It properly should be the county seat. Everglade is a very inaccessible point.

I do not know just when I can get down to Florida but will try to arrange to go down just as soon as possible and if you still think I can do any good, I will come by Tallahassee on my way down.
