Dear sir:-

I fully expected to have an answer to my several letters to you relative to the sale of the Cypress Timber on the Hopkins Tract but up to the present time have failed to hear from you, I fully expected to have your reply not later than today and promised my associate to be able to give him full and complete details so that he could make a firm offer to this buyer.

Mr. O. L. Peterson is associated, and in the office of Mr. Wm. H. Harwick an attorney of this City, I received a call from them Saturday requesting that I call at their office, and on arrival there they stated that they had a letter from their client that if I had this Cypress in shape to offer and could guarantee delivery of it that they were ready to make an investigation of same at an early date

I will appreciate very much having you confirm your previous agreement with me relative to the sale of this Cypress so that I may get this started, I gouted the timber as per your previous agreement at a price of \$5.50 per 1,000 feet mutual cruise, and stated that terms would be agreed upon after buyer had met your company officials.

I stated to Mr. Peterson and Mr. Harwick that the price of \$5.50 per 1,000 feet carried a 5% commission, this was also your agreement.

I would ask that should either Mr. Peterson or Mr. Harwick take this matter up direct with you that you refer them back to me as they have secured this information from me together with your Companies name as being the owners.

I fear that my other letters have not reached you I am registering this one hoping that it will reach you promptly and that I will receive your prompt reply giving me the authority to proceed with the deal.
